SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Budget 2021/22

Council have adopted the 2021/22 budget with a goal to deliver our major project being the Vincent Street Streetscape Project. Following the award of \$1.534 Million in Building Better Regions Funding (BBRF) the Vincent Street Streetscape project will progress with a total construction budget of \$4.895 Million. The balance of the project will be funded by Other Capital Grants (\$1.258 Million), Loan funds (\$1.0 Million), Reserve Funds (\$693,000) and General Revenue (\$410,000). The project will see the revitalisation of our Mainstreet, including the undergrounding of power, to complement the recent completion of the Cornerstone building and the Moort Wabiny Park development.

In addition to the civil work component, Council has secured funding to complete a Heritage Trail along the main street focusing on the historical buildings. This project also includes the development of an augmented reality app to give users a snapshot of what the main street looked like in years gone by.

Infrastructure works for 2021/22 will include Road, Bridge and Drainage works of \$1.317 Million part funded by Main Roads WA (\$482,000) and General Road Grant (\$216,000).

Council will also complete the construction of the Industrial Land Road with a contribution from Development WA of \$192,000. Council will invest in a new grader (\$245,000 net) and the renewal of the Rubber Tyred Roller (\$150,000 net), the Road Maintenance Truck (\$84,000 net) and other vehicles (\$106,000).

Council will continue to provide a high standard of service in other programs such as Sanitation - street bins, refuse site, bulk recycling and e-waste; Community Spaces - halls, recreation ground, Moort Wabiny Park, gymnasium and library; and Tourism - caravan park and cabins, visitor booklets and visitor centre.

Rates

With the adoption of the budget the Annual Rates Notice will now be sent out on Friday 6 August. The increase in rate revenue is 5%. Individual rate notices could differ due to the valuation by the Valuer Generals Office on your property. A reminder that when your rates come out this year, the discount period will be reduced from 35 days to 21 days.

To receive the 10% discount, you must pay in full by

Friday 27 August 2021. The Shire of Beverley is one of the last Local Governments to still offer an early payment discount so please take advantage of it. The Shire does not allow any grace or extension if you miss the payment deadline.

If paying by instalments, you must make your first instalment by Friday 10 September 2021 to join the instalment plan. The instalment date and discount date are two different options. There is no discount in the instalment option.

Caravan Park Cabins

The Shire is looking forward to welcoming our first visitors from the Avon Valley Golf Championships who will enjoy a trial stay between 4 and 7 August. It is hoped the booking system will go live on Monday 9 August 2021.

Extension to the Playground Area at the Recreation Ground

Work has commenced on the extended playground area with the picnic area, shelter and various play equipment now installed. Unfortunately the rain has caused a few delays with the fencing and ground works. It is hoped the play area will be completed by the end of August.

Avondale Machinery Museum

Council has decided to investigate various options (22/23 financial year) to move the museum closer to the townsite. Until then the Museum will reopen to the public dependent on volunteer availability. Open dates will be advertised.

The Shire will have a tent at the Beverley Agricultural Show, if you are interested in becoming a Councillor, please do not hesitate to have a chat with a Councillor.



Water Quality through the Avon, Yilgarn, and Lockhart Water Systems


When working with water salinity and water quality, the old school terminology is *grains per gallon* (*gr/ga*) while the modern terminology is *micro-Siemens per centimetre* (*uS/cm*).



The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation has an extensive network of river monitoring stations and activities across Western Australia (https://www.water.wa.gov.au/maps-and-data/monitoring/river-level-monitoring). Beverley has approximately 5 of these monitoring stations in our shire.

Yenyenning Lakes Tests at Bell's Farm


The bold line in Graph A, below, shows that salinity drops when the overflow gates are shut. Meaning that the saline water is kept within the lake system and not let into the river at Bell's Farm. Based on the reference above the river at Bell's Farm when this graph was created was almost two and a half times as saline as the ocean (70,000 uS/cm). Graph B shows the same Bell's Farm station on July 21st, after all the rain in the past month, you can see that the salinity has dropped dramatically to well below the tolerated level for adult sheep.





Kwolyn Hill (near Kellerberrin in the Lockhart/Yilgarn System)

The bold line the Graph C, below, shows that salinity drops after a rainfall event. The rainfall event/s flush the Lockhart system out; salinity is decreased by the mixing of salt and fresh water and flushing the salt downstream. Based on the reference above when this graph was created Kwolyn Hill was almost three times as saline as the ocean (114,000 uS/cm). Graph D's bold line shows the same Kwolyn Hill monitoring station on July 21st, after all the rain in the past month, especially over the night of July 20th, you can see that the salinity level has dropped, but is still almost as salty as sea water.



Morbinning Gully and Old Beverley Road

These two waterways were tested for salinity levels on July 7th, 2021.

Test Results	uS/cm	gr/ga	
Old Beverley Road	8,500	327	
Morbinning Gully	4,600	177	

These waterways are significantly fresher than the two noted above, however, the salinity test results, and reference table above show that the water that flows in them is brackish – still undrinkable for humans, but perfect for livestock drinking requirements.

Salinity Solutions

There are several possible solutions to the salinity issues that the Yilgarn and Lockhart Systems are facing. One of these solutions is to excavate a drain through the Salt River Valley (Yilgarn & Lockhart System) to Qualandary Crossing into the Avon River. This would create a catchment area larger than Tasmania with multiple benefits. These could include allowing vegetation to regenerate (in the millions) in its own time which would stabilise the soil surface, reduce site erosion, and potentially reduce the amount of salt exported from the site, saving thousands of dollars and hours of time.





Our next **Beverley Country Women's Association** meeting will be held on Wednesday 18th August from 10am, all are welcome to attend.





Election Date

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 (and regulations), an Ordinary Election is held every two years on the third Saturday in October.

Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds & diseases

Pawpaws and papayas: are they the same? Have you ever said pawpaw and papaya interchangeably when referring to these fruits? You are not the only one. While the fruits do look similar, they are produced from two unrelated plant species.

In most parts of the world, 'papava' is the favoured common name for the fruit of the tropical Carica papaya, while 'pawpaw' more commonly refers to the North American pawpaw, Asimina triloba.

Asimina triloba (pawpaw)

The true pawpaw, North American pawpaw, is a small deciduous fruiting tree native to certain parts of the US and Canada. The genus Asimina is in the same plant family, Annonaceae, as the custard apple. A. triloba fruit is 8-15 cm long with yellow/cream flesh and a network of glossy brown/black seeds. The fruit is known to taste like a mixture of banana, mango and pineapple.

Carica papaya (papaya, pawpaw)

Carica papaya, from the family Caricaceae, is a broadleaf evergreen plant native to Mexico and the northern parts of South America. The fruit is generally spherical or cylindrical in form and about 15-45 cm long with a central cavity

containing numerous black seeds. The fruit has a sweet, juicy flavour and a creamy texture. Two cultivars of papayas are commonly grown. One has red or orange flesh, and the other has yellow flesh; in Australia, these are often called "red papaya" and "yellow papaw", respectively. No wonder we get confused!

Tips to tell the difference

Next time you see fruit labelled 'pawpaw' or 'papaya', try to tell which plant it came from: North American pawpaw, Asimina triloba:

- Always oval shaped.
- Yellow/creamy flesh around a network of several large seeds.

Papaya, Carica papaya:

- Round or more cylindrical in shape.
- Central cavity of numerous small seeds.
- Red or orange fleshed cultivar

Growing fruit at home?

It's likely you are growing Carica papaya. There are a few reportable diseases of Carica papaya, such as papaya sticky disease and ringspot virus, which are exotic to WA. If your plants develop unfamiliar symptoms, please take photos and contact the Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) or submit a report to the MyPestGuide Reporter app or website.

Friends and Staying Connected

I'm sure we've all experienced it – as we get older our social circle seems to become smaller. Blokes often feel this a bit more than women, who tend to form lifelong relationships and attend more social events than us fellas. But it's important to know that as we get older, it's normal for the people in our lives to fly the coop. Research suggests this pattern of 'social ageing' could be hardwired in men, as chimps tend to do the same thing – and I'm sure the ladies in our lives have had similar thoughts.

Blokes often get put into a box that we don't want to talk to other blokes about stuff, but recent research says otherwise. Relationships WA found in 2018 that many blokes, whether they're in a relationship or not, wanted to spend more time with their friends. The majority of blokes also reported that they did have someone to confide in and 75% of the time it's a woman, mostly their partner. Regrettably though, for us blokes identifying just 2 true mates, outside of our relationship, can be problematic – we say that they primarily come from the categories of our peers and mentors.

It's normal for us to want to spend more time with friends and the difficulty of meeting new friends once we finish school or study can be ramped up. There could be a number of reasons for this, including:

- Blokes prioritising work and family over social events.
- ☆ The warrior attitude of blokes not wanting to appear vulnerable and opening up to others.
- ☆ Feeling anxious in social situations or self-confidence issues.
- ☆ Subconscious thoughts of 'not measuring up' to other blokes.
- ☆ Wanting to 'keep to ourselves' – cave time and withdrawing.
- ☆ Introverted and extroverted personality types.

It's important to recognise the sort of barriers we may be facing when it comes to making new friends, and depending on our circumstances, there are some things we can proactively do:

- ☆ Attend a local community group, ie. a men's shed, bowling club, the footy club, or church to name
- ☆ Try new things – meeting people through a shared interest or hobby is a good way to engage with people. Principal Skinner from The Simpsons was on the right track when he said, 'isn't it nice that we both hate the same things?'
- ☆ If our issue is related to social anxiety or self-esteem, realising that we're often our own worst critic is important. It's important for us to be comfortable in our own skin.
- ☆ Realise that most of the butterflies we may be feeling around meeting other people is because we think the stakes are higher than they really are. Research points to the fact that most blokes are eager to meet others.

In summary, it's normal for us blokes to want to increase our social circle as human beings are fundamentally social in nature. There are some biological reasons for our social circles shrinking as we age and it's important to recognise the social and cultural reasons for us finding it difficult to meet and connect with new people. If we feel isolated from others, don't be afraid to seek help - whether that be from a mate, family member, a GP, a counsellor, a pastor, or anyone else you feel comfortable talking to. What a very wet and cold winter we have had but August means that winter is almost over and now it's all about getting ready for spring.

There are plenty of tasks to keep you busy throughout August so that you're prepared for the full showing of September onwards.

Gardening tasks

- Prune any dormant plants, especially rose bushes if you haven't already done so always prune at a 45 degree angle to help the plant heal better while also limiting the risk of pests and disease taking
- Wait for the end of August or early September to start applying a slow release fertiliser to all of your plants.
- Apply a healthy layer of mulch to lock in as much moisture as possible. Aim for layer of 5 to 10 cms.
- Start planting spring fruits and vegetables, such as; spring onions, leeks, peas, lettuce and strawberries.
- Plant tomato seeds in trays but keep undercover for now to protect them from frost.
- Start planting annuals such as Petunias, Marigolds, and Vincas.

Top Tip

During August, most nurseries will be stocking up with a wide range of annuals for the spring season, so go in and have a look at what's on offer.



HOON BEHAVIOUR

Over the last month there has been an increase in Hoon Behaviour by drivers around Beverley. Hoon Behaviour not only risk their lives, but also your life and that of your children, friends and relatives.

- If you drive like a hoon, we will catch you and we will impound the vehicle, even if the driver is not the owner of the vehicle.
- Hoon-driving is not only deadly, but it also spoils the amenity and enjoyment of our community and makes people feel less safe and secure.
- The public can help police by reporting hoons, on (131 444), which allows us to identify and target repeat offenders and problem locations.

The impounding of vehicles also applies for those people who are driving whilst not being the holder of a valid driver's licence. There are a number of people within the town of Beverley who continue to drive with blatant disregard for the law.

- Any person who is caught driving without a licence will face court and have their vehicle impounded for a 28 day period.
- Any member of the community who can identify that they have seen a person driving without a licence can report this to their local police and action will be taken. A written statement must be made however before the offending person can face court and have their vehicle impounded.

As a result of a couple of incidents recently one driver is now facing a court appearance and loss of licence.

If you see this type of behaviour call police immediately, do not post it on social media and leave it at that. Call police directly to report the matter.

CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE

Tips when leaving your home:

- At night, leave inside lights on which would normally be on if you were at home;
- Consider using electronic timing devices that turn the TV, radio or lights on and off at selected times;
- ☆ Keep doors and windows locked at all times and activate alarm systems when leaving your home;
- ☆ Consider installing movement-activated external lighting; and
- Make windows more secure by fitting locks, security screens or external roller shutters.

Tips when leaving you vehicle:

- ☆ Always lock your vehicle
- Never leave keys in the ignition even when filling up with petrol or popping into the shop
- ☆ Ensure windows including sunroofs are closed

If you leave cash, GPS units, CD's, bank cards, handbags, laptop computers, cash, and mobile telephones in your vehicle you increase the risk of your vehicle being targeted by an offender. Remove valuable items from your vehicle to avoid being a victim of crime.

Remember that preventing crime is everyone's business, by taking a few simple precautions you can make life harder for criminals and protect yourself, your belongings and your home.

'Gophers'

Where can my Gopher be used?

When you are using a gopher you can travel on footpaths, shared paths, in shopping centres, in public places, and across roads.

However, it is illegal to operate a gopher faster that 10km/hr on foot paths, shared paths, and on roads. Travelling faster than 10km/hr is dangerous for you and other pedestrians as there is a risk of more serious injury the faster you thavel.



What are the road rules for Gophers?

When using a Gopher you are considered a pedestrian, therefore:



- Keep left unless passing another pedestrian
- · Beware of vehicles coming out of driveways
- Show consideration for other pedestrians, especially seniors and people with disabilities
- Travel no faster than the surrounding pedestrians as they may not be able to move out of your way quickly
- When parking your Gopher on footpaths please be considerate to other pedestrians and leave enough room to pass



If the footpath is not suitable or there is no footpath available and you need to travel on the road:

- · Always face oncoming traffic, as you're not as visible as a car
- · Be aware of traffic movement, signals, and signs
- Watch out for obstructions such as drains, potholes, and people opening car doors when you pass parked cars
- . Fit a flag to your gopher to make you more visible
- Take additional care as not all motorists obey the road rules
