#### SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### Vincent Street Streetscape Project

Great news - the Shire has been advised the construction of the project will commence on Monday 11 October!

There will be service disruptions, closures of footpaths, roads and carparks at various times. The "Fig Tree" carpark will be closed for the duration of the works and we apologise for the inconvenience. The Shire in conjunction with Western Power, GHD and MG Group will do its best to keep the community advised of all interruptions. Please be patient during the works as the end goal will be well worth the short-term inconveniences. A sign of what's planned for Vincent Street is located in the gravel carpark facing the mainstreet (next to the fire warning sign), please have a read.

#### <u>Early Warnings for the next Fire and Snake</u> Season

As everyone would be aware, with very good winter rains comes excellent growing conditions, bringing long grass, extra fuel loads, snakes and mosquitoes! Now is the time to tend to your firebreaks, mow the lawns down and clear away inflammable material.

Under the Fire Break Order, by 1 November:

- If you live in town and your property is 2.01ha or less – clear your property of inflammable material or cut grass height to 15cm or less.
- If you live in town with a property or combination of lots greater than 2.01Ha – clear inflammable material or provide 2.20m firebreak on all external boundaries.
- All rural holdings must have a mobile firefighter with 600L + capacity.
- Small rural holdings less than 100Ha must maintain a 2.20m firebreak and have a mobile firefighter with 600L + capacity.

For full details on the Fire Break Order you can refer to the Shire website or the leaflet sent out with the Shire rates.

The Shire Rangers have begun assessing properties that may be a potential hazard and to allow maximum time for owners to comply. If you need assistance with property maintenance, you can contact the Shire Office for a list of people who provide this service (at owners cost).

The Shire has started spraying for verge-side weeds and will commence mosquito fogging once the rain appears to slow.

#### ANZ Bank

Thank you to everyone who participated in the survey which assisted us to lobby the ANZ Bank to keep our branch open. Unfortunately, we received a very recent reply that the Bank would continue to close as planned. The ANZ advised in their response: "Although the use of cash continues to decline, we recognise that there are some local businesses in the community that continue to transact in cash resulting in the need for a deposit solution. We therefore intend to leave a SMART ATM behind at the current branch location and are currently in negotiations with the landlord. This will enable customers to withdraw and deposit cash."

We wish the staff at the ANZ Beverley all the best for the future.

### VALE BEVERLEY ANZ

Earlier in the year most Beverley ANZ customers were advised that the Beverley branch was closing on Wednesday 29 September 2021. Concern and distress at this impending closure was evident in the large number of responses to a whole of community feedback and comment questionnaire.

Collated information from this survey was used by the Shire in correspondence to ANZ's hierarchy, which as we now know was to no avail as ANZ and other banks were closing branches all around Australia. Customers were directed toward online banking, smart phone app's and having to travel further if requiring in person bank service.

Concerns raised at the time"....no bank in our town, loss of 24/7 Smart ATM, no cash handling facilities, reliance on internet based banking, no reasonably accessible "in person" branch, loss of knowledgeable and helpful local staff".

Some commentary on those various concerns:-

- No bank in our town This is true, we will have no bank in our town, however did you know Australia Post is an agency for around 70 financial institutions (currently not ANZ though). Our local post office managers John & Vicky Fregon did what they could to assist those interested in utilising banks serviced by Australia Post by bringing bank reps to Beverley for accounts to be established without the need to travel.
- ♦ 24/7 Smart ATM The potential loss of the ATM drew most attention from survey respondents, fortunately one will remain in Beverley. You can withdraw cash and deposit cheques and money notes via the Smart ATM.
- No cash handling facilities this is going to be a problem for businesses and community groups undertaking fundraising activities. I've been advised that the PO is not able to provide bulk change to other businesses as it is an agency, not a bank. Perhaps as a community we can all help out local businesses by using loose change when purchasing items? Business will have to go out of town to get more change.
- Reliance on internet based banking our wonderful local ANZ staff have been working hard to assist those who required training to learn more about this and ATM use before the closure. In the future if you need some help, are unsure about anything or something looks suspicious, make sure you trust who you are seeking help from.
- No reasonably accessible "in person" branch this is an incredible shame and some customers may not have access to transport. Unfortunately it may also encourage out of town shopping which was a concern raised in the survey.
- Loss of knowledgeable and helpful local banking staff perhaps the biggest loss of all staff and the service provided will be immeasurably missed.

The Dead Finish Museum Building is 150 years old



### **Backyard Buddies**

Don't fight the flight of the termites!

#### Should termites cause a fright?

When we hear the word termite, we all get a bit concerned, given their associated risk of damaging wooden infrastructure, especially if left untreated or unmonitored. But did you know that not all termites cause damage to buildings, and are all in fact, a beneficial part of our natural environment?

Termites are social insects that build large nests in soil or wood and are an integral part of the Australian ecosystem. There are more than 150 species of termites occurring in Western Australia, and only 12 of these are known to damage timber. Termites help to recycle organic materials and aerate soils. They are also an import part of the diet of other animals, and their feeding activities even provide hollow logs for birds and mammals, like the endangered numbat, to use for nesting.

#### What does a termite look like?

Termites are small, soft-bodied insects that feed on wood, grass, dead leaves, bark, fungi or the dung of herbivores. Although they are commonly referred to as white ants, they are not related to true ants. They have no waist between the thorax and abdomen as seen with ants, bees or wasps. A termite colony is split into three groups known as castes: workers, soldiers, and alates. The worker termites lack eyes and help to build and maintain nests, while the soldier termites are responsible for defending the nest from predators. Alate termites are the winged,


reproductive castes of the colony. These can often be observed in their thousands in spring, flying up from the ground, trunks or termite mounds. Alates are the future kings and queens of their new colonies and will congregate in the air and shed their wings after successfully mating. Termites are active year-round in their colonies, but reproductive termites are only active under certain environmental conditions.

#### What if I find termites in my property?

Finding termites isn't necessarily a cause for concern, as thousands of termites take flight in spring and can often enter the home through open doors, windows, chimneys, or eaves. Cut off from the soil, which provides a suitable nesting site, these termites will perish, posing no risk to the home. The important thing is to conduct regular inspections to determine if these termites are emanating from an active colony inside the timbers of your home and aren't just seasonal blow-ins. Licensed pest controllers can provide inspections and treatment services if needed. If termites are seen in the garden (winged or otherwise) do not fret, as they are doing an important job by recycling nutrients. To avoid termites recycling your stacked timbers, keep them off the ground, and use treated timbers for garden beds if you want them to last longer. to those who won a medal at the carnival!






#### Artists-in-Residence at the Station

### Artists in Residence during October 2021 Alan Pickering - Weeks 1 & 2

### Favourite Fruitcake



From the Beverley CWA

This recipe appears in a Hyden CWA cookbook.

(WARNING--please read carefully from start to finish before attempting)

You'll need a cup of sugar, four large eggs, a cup of dried fruit, 1 teaspoon baking soda, a teaspoon of salt, 1 cup brown sugar, lemon juice, nuts, and a bottle of whisky.

Sample the whisky to check for quality. Take a large bowl. Check the whisky again. To be sure if it is of the highest quality, pour one level cup and drink. Repeat.

Turn on the electric mixer, beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add one spoontee of sugar and beat again. Make sure the whisky is still okay. Cry another tup.

Turn off the mixer, break two legs and add to the bowl, and chuck in the cup of dried fruit. Nix on the turner. If the fruit gets stuck in the beaters, pry it loose with a drewsriver. Sample the whisky again to check for consisticity.

Next sift two cups of salt, or something. Who cares? Check the whisky. Now sift the lemon juice and strain your nuts. Add one babblespoon of brown sugar or whatever colour you find. Wix mel. Grease the oven, turn the cake pan to 350 gredees.


Don't forget to beat of the turner, throw the bowl out of the window, check the whisky again and bo to ged.

#### Warrior Wellbeing Article

#### The Myth That Men Don't Talk

One of the things that never ceases to amaze me in the job we do, is that given the right circumstances (a safe place) blokes will disclose their issues and tell their story. Every bloke that I have met has a story and/or issues and is willing to talk.

Blokes do talk but we need to acknowledge the differences between how the genders go about this. There are also some other factors that need to be considered in how we go about talking with blokes. The differences are real and we need to recognise some of the communication disparities between blokes and ladies:

- Blokes only talk one third as much as ladies in a day (approx. 7,000 to 21,000 words). The majority of females think and speak in a narrative way whereas blokes prefer dot points.
- Single word responses to questions like yes, no, good, bad and grunting are considered responses by blokes.
- Much of the additional talk that ladies do is around describing emotions and feelings. Therefore, in comparison to blokes, they have a sort of 'match fitness' around the ability to discuss emotion that we as blokes lack.
- In much the same way that the Inuit people have around 180 words to describe snow (because of its cultural and safety implications), the ladies in our life tend to operate with a larger word bank to deal with discussions around emotion and feelings.
- Blokes find it uncomfortable to talk about their emotions. We have been conditioned not to and are hard wired differently, often focusing on problem solving, providing and protecting, rather than how we feel, let alone talking about it.

To have a more productive outcome when having 'that talk', some other factors to consider include:

- Choosing the right environment to communicate is essential. This is not when we are distressed and out of control, but when we have calmed down. Also, avoid being under the influence of alcohol (this can act as a 'mood enhancer' and alter our state of mind).
- Timing is an important factor to consider. Agree on a designated time to talk, avoid times when you are preoccupied with other tasks, when there is a chance of being interrupted or when there are a lot of things. happening.
- Be prepared to listen. The most important part of talking is listening (I think this is an oxymoron!) Having respect, connection and empathy with whom we are talking to will give us more of an opportunity to become an active listener.
- Getting help with having 'that talk' with your bloke. Don't be afraid to seek help in having a talk with your dad, husband, son or mate i.e., use an independent person, your GP or a counsellor.

Considering the above factors and 'giving permission' to blokes that it's okay to talk about things that cause us discomfort or pain may assist with blokes opening up more. Sometimes this does take time.

From little things big things grow (just like this year's crop), blokes do talk, so sow the seed towards a meaningful conversation. It is a myth 'that men don't talk' they will, just not always in the way we expect.

## BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents Significant Items now on display in the Dead Finish Museum

#### Beehive Mantel Clock



An 1850s eight-day striking clock made by Jerome & Co of New Haven, Connecticut, USA.

The walnut veneer case encloses a circular dial with Roman numerals behind glass, above a square door decorated with an image of Melrose Abbey, Scotland which provides access to the spring, the pendulum and the key. The name of Jerome & Co is stamped inside.

Chauncey Jerome (1793–1868) was an American clockmaker in the early 19th century. He made a fortune selling his clocks, and his business grew quickly. However, his company failed in 1856.

The clock belonged to John & Mary Jane **Poyser** who met and

married in 1879 in rural Victoria before arriving in Beverley in 1902 with the clock. The Poysers set up a successful farming enterprise with their three sons in Bally Bally. In 1912, middle son, Jack, married Pearl Kilpatrick, only daughter of David & Fanny Kilpatrick, pioneers of Bally Bally. Jack at


Kilpatrick, only daughter of David & Fanny Kilpatrick, pioneers of Bally Bally. Jack and Pearl Poyser had four daughters: Lillian (m Holman), Louisa (m Goodfield), Irene (m Dawe) and Jessie (m Murray). All sisters were together at the Bally Bally School in 1927.

A sticker inside indicates the clock was repaired at some time by Levinson & Sons of Perth who advertised in the *Beverley Times* and sponsored prizes for local sports clubs.

The clock remained in the family until donated to the Dead Finish Museum in 2019.







Tulin Footing park to find a long queue waiting to enter. Most of the cars in front of us TREE & GARDEN SOCIETY Were directed to an alternative entry but our bus was able to enter and park near the gate. What a glorious day it was with the multitude of

riotously coloured beds of tulips scattered throughout the park. We went our separate ways to meet at Chalet Healy for lunch as we had a table booked there. Thank you David for safely getting us there and back and obligingly stopping at Tomeo's so we could get some ice creams.

The next meeting will be at the Dead Finish at 10.30am on Tuesday the 5th of October. We will need to complete our plans for the Rose Show so urge members to attend.

The weather is certainly warming up and summer is fast approaching but there is still plenty to do in the garden during October.

Vegies to plant in October include – beetroot, capsicum, cucumber, lettuce, pumpkin, tomato, zucchini, carrot, and sweet corn.

Flowers to plant in October include – alyssum, marigold, petunia, portulaca, salvia, cornflower, lobelia, and snapdragon.

October is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Repot orchids as soon as they have finished flowering. They need repotting every 3-4 years
- Cut stems of kangaroo paw flowers and display inside. Leave a stump 10-20cm long where a second flush of flowers will appear from dormant buds
- Ensure your irrigation system is in good working order. Clean filters, flush the drip lines, sprinklers and drippers and repair any holes
- Composting worms start to eat more food now that it is warming up. Chop up scraps finely to speed up the process
- Be sure to keep on top of couch grass and kikuyu in garden beds. These can regrow from any tiny pieces that are left in the ground
- Tomatoes should be rotated to new parts of the garden every year to reduce the chance of diseases ruining your crop
- Buddleja, tea tree, daisies, marigolds, lavender, bottle brush and grevillea are all great plants for attracting butterflies to your garden and now is a great time to plant them
- Prune native shrubs by about a third every 12 months or so to keep them compact and bushy and to stimulate new growth
- Plant native succulents such as pigface around your house as a fire retardant barrier
- Prune only the flowered stems of proteas. Un-flowered stems are next season's blooms
- Plant annuals now for Christmas colour. For sunny spots plant alyssum, begonia, petunia, salvia and vinca. For shade plant impatiens

Enjoy your time in your garden in October.




