SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Vincent Street Streetscape Project

Unfortunately, our project continues to be at the mercy of sub-contractors and the weather. The sealing of the carparks has been delayed again due to rain. Council is aware of the parking inconvenience for shoppers and local businesses and we know our constant apologies are wearing thin. At the time of writing it is hoped that a third attempt to seal the IGA, Fig Tree and Town Hall carparks will occur on 2 June 2022. We will then be able to open up at least one of them for people to better access the shopping precinct. Should this not occur, a carpark may have to be opened unsealed which is not ideal but will ease some parking burden.

Avon River Park Concept Plan

Thanks to all the Community members who submitted feedback to the Concept Plan. The plan was very well received. Your feedback has been taken into consideration and the amended designs will be endorsed in June.

Vincent Street Heritage Walk Trail

Council and staff have been working on a Heritage Walk Trail to be included as a part of the Vincent Street Streetscape project. The development of an AR App will accompany the trail markers along Vincent Street, will be an addition and tourist attraction for people to enjoy the historical features and buildings of our main street. The App will include a map, information on each historical landmark as well as various photos. The trail will be launched at the completion of the main street works.

Cornerstone Office Three Lease

Office Three in the Cornerstone is available to lease. A discount of 50% for the first three months applies to new tenants. Please contact the Shire Office to view the office or get a copy of the agreement if you are interested.

Community Grants

A reminder to Clubs and Community Groups that the next round of Community Grants will be open in July. Start your planning now to ensure a good application. The grants have been heavily subscribed in recent rounds so Council will be looking for quality applications whose projects/events have maximum benefit to the applicant and community.

Beverley Airfield Upgrades

Council received funding from the Regional Airports Program to upgrade and reseal the airstrip. This funding has seen 1.5kms of airstrip newly surfaced which will benefit the Royal Flying Doctors as well as the Soaring Society. The Soaring Society have advised Council that 'the airstrip is not only functioning so much more efficiently in regard to general aviation and for the Flying Doctor but is setting itself up as a first-class glider training, maintenance and competition airfield'. Council has also submitted a further application to upgrade the airfield lighting.

Ballardong Aboriginal Astronomy Project with Beverley District High School

An opportunity recently arose for Council to contribute funding and support the Ballardong Aboriginal Astronomy Project for Students being run by Astrotourism WA. With Beverley District High School giving the green light, some of our local students are now learning more about the Aboriginal night sky.

We are confident that this program will capture cultural knowledge and strengthen relationships between the Ballardong people, Council, Students and our Community. On May 17, many students and their families were able to take part in the second phase of the program and sit around a campfire and listen to stories under the chilly night sky at Avondale. Sadly, due to Covid, three out of four Shire representatives including me, were unable to attend the evening but we were advised by Cr Maxwell that a great night was had by all. At the end of the program the development of a Ballardong Aboriginal Astronomy Planisphere will allow the Community and other people visiting Beverley to learn about the night sky too.

Vale Malcolm George Roberts

Former Councilor Mal Roberts passed away on Tuesday 17 May 2022. Mal was a Shire Councilor for 12 years from 1999 – 2011. Mal was very active on the Development Services Committee and was interested in programs that supported youth and the elderly.

Mal was also a Justice of the Peace, advocate for Aboriginal People, director of CRANA Aboriginal Corporation and championed for those less fortunate or suffering financial strain through the Beverley Volunteer Community Services. He will be missed by many in the Beverley Community.

Beverley Ag Museum News

Over the past month several people commented to me that there was no 'News' in the May edition, apologies to all those who scrolled through the pages looking for it, but with the Easter and ANZAC long weekends our crew decided that 'family time' (and other activities) would be our priority, but we did meet up on April 30 so are not behind with our chores.

As many of you already know, a lot of the items in our museum collection are still reliable 'Working units', one of several reasons to meet up regularly is to not only restore, but to also

maintain those items that do still function, so it came as no surprise to me to hear John Hawke and Bob tinkering with a couple of Tractors, the first of which (Chamberlin 40K) refused to fire up before our ageing battery went flat, the size of the engine and a lack of 'Weetbix' meant the crank handle was deemed too hard, so the McCallum Deering near to it caught their attention, but having no electric starter fitted it would need some manual effort to crank it, determination set in and after a few hardy swings she thundered into life, popping and banging and burning off the coat of black paint on the exhaust (phew, stink, not a heat resistant paint) a previous member had so delicately coated it with.



Once outside she was away, (we always like to give each unit a 'run' as well as just starting it up if it is possible) but three quarters way around the shed she ran out of fuel, so more effort on the crank handle. We never like to fill the tanks too full of petrol as between 'outings' it will go stale (often a reason so many people can't start their lawn mowers for the first seasonal cut) and then



it is wasted. Meanwhile Eric and I were offering words of encouragement and carrying out the routine tyre pumping before we all met up for our morning tea where we all like to 'chew the fat' about our shared interests.

Our crew met up again on the May 21 with the same enthusiasm shown on our previous visit, John Hawke had been to a local garage sale and managed to pick up a couple of workshop manuals for the FX Holden Ute and the TJ Bedford Truck, these items are essential and very rare these days so a big thank you to John for his sharp eyes

in spotting them, he also found a heavy duty set of Jumper Leads, something we were lacking in 'our toolbox'.

Armed with a couple of decent batteries and two full petrol cans John and Bob were determined to fire up the Chamberlin 40K, and yes like so many of the collection she soon burst into life after some help from a well-known brand of ether (starting assistance fluid). Naturally the pre checks (oil, water) had been carried out, so once started there was much excitement with



Eric rushing to ensure the tyres were inflated enough ready for John Hawke to drive outside. As none of us had never actually operated this model before there was initial head scratching for a few minutes looking for a clutch pedal, after a process of elimination (Old Tractors have lots of 'unmarked' levers) Bob spotted it had a hand clutch, the water cooled, twin cylinder, horizontally opposed petrol engine (for the mechanical buffs), was restarted and did a lap of honour around the shed. Even with all the noise a Barn Owl seemed quite at home perched in the roof area, it

was only when I tried to get a photo that it turned camera shy and flew off.

One thing we have learnt from these two tractors is how expensive they are to run having consumed around 15-20% of our monthly budget in fuel alone! But from this effort, our knowledge will be passed on to others, (notes were logged) not only does the Collection exist for people to see, but also to appreciate our regional farming history, every item holds a story, so if you (or someone you know) has a story to tell about an item in our Museum we would be pleased to hear from you so they can be written down, (some 'hair raising' experience in the paddock maybe?) and recorded and shared for the future.



Robyn (the National Trust warden) paid us a visit at our morning tea and updated us with the latest NT news regarding reopening and the renovations being carried out on the Farm and all things Avondale.

Our museum is located 6km out of town at Avondale Farm on Waterhatch Road and now **open for the public** to visit when we are attending on the third Saturday of each month between 8.30am and noon, (February to November) entry is free, donations are happily accepted, and photography is always welcomed, but please note that communications can be poor in the area if trying to share your experience with others. To avoid anyone being disappointed it should be noted that only the Museum (not the Farm) is open at this stage, and the much-loved horses Comet & Robbie have been moved to other pastures when Monica their owner and our previous NT warden left.

For other times or group bookings please contact John Alexander on 96460768 so arrangements can be made with the new National Trust warden. Like most local groups the Museum is opened and operated by volunteers (under the guidance of the Beverley Shire Council and the National Trust Warden), and we are always looking for people to assist or share their knowledge with us, if you feel you can contribute in any way, please let us know.

Remarkable Women of Beverley

The "Esteemed" Mrs Isabella Gillies (born Geelong 1871)

The first we know of Mrs Gillies in WA is that she bought land in adjoining locations (4417 & 4418) – a total of 660 acres - in Beverley in 1909.

Then in January 1911, she announces in the Beverley Times that she has purchased Mrs Messer's ladies' drapery business, next to Dr Richard's Surgery (?).

This business was a mixed business of drapery with ready-made ladies & children's wear including hats & shoes. She employed an experienced dressmaker to make dresses from the rolls of cloth she sold in her store and employed two or three other assistants. Including herself, that was a staff of five.



She made good use of the newspaper, having an advertisement in almost every edition. She had summer and winter sales, and announced new season's fashions at the start of each season.

She was very involved in the various charities set up during WW1 – in particular the making of garments to be sent to soldiers overseas organised by the Red Cross. She was also a guest at several local weddings.

She moved her business twice: From next to Dr Richard's Surgery to opposite the Beverley Times Office later in 1911; then from there to premises adjoining Mr Skipworth's tea rooms in 1917. Mr Skipworth had

finished building Central Buildings in 1915, so this would have been a nice new shop.

She sold her business to Mrs Houston late of Victoria in December 1919 and left the district early the following year. The Beverley Times noted on 31 January:

Valedictory.

A pleasant little social gathering was held at the Mechanics' Institute on Thursday evening to bid farewell to Mrs. Gillies, who has disposed of her business in Beverley and is returning to Victoria. The evening was spent, in dancing, interspersed with several songs and recitations, and an enjoyable time was spent. During an interval, Mr. Dawson [Proprietor of Beverley Times], on behalf of the subscribers, made a presentation of a lady's gold wristlet watch as a mark of the esteem in which Mrs. Gillies was held by the people of the town and district, and in the course of his remarks, particularly referred to her activities in connection with Red Cross and other war work. Mrs. Gillies gracefully acknowledged the compliment, and said she would carry away with her many pleasant recollections of Beverley and the kindnesses extended to her by the people during her residence here. Refreshments were provided by the ladies, and the gathering dispersed about midnight.

No more is published about Isabella until the 1953 when ex-Beverley residents had a get together in Kings Park and Mrs Gillies is mentioned at age "82 but carrying her years remarkably well". She was present at a similar event in 1962.

Finally, a mention is made in passing in another item about Mrs Gillies "who incidentally is still alive at 99 years and is resident in the East".

Conclusion: Mrs Gillies is a bit of a mystery woman from our point of view. She must have been well-off, to have bought land and a thriving business. She seemed to move backwards and forwards between Victoria & Western Australia with ease. She mixed socially with all the best families in the town and kept in touch after her departure. There was never any mention of husband or family, or what happened to the 660 acres.

Tips for Integrating Work and Family Life

One of the main issues that confront families and relationships is trying to achieve a balance between work and home life. The word balance tends to indicate a 50/50 arrangement however that's a big ask. It's more appropriate to talk about work and home integration to ensure we don't get too out of balance.

There is no one perfect balance because every family is different, and every work place requirement is different. When machinery is not balanced it will wear and break, this can be the same consequence for family and couple relationships. All work and no play are problematic. Those busy times are necessary and explainable, but we need to ensure we have a catch-up.

So, what happens when we are not integrating work and home life in a balanced way?

- A disconnect can start to occur with our wife/ partner, dad, kids, friends and relatives;
- Physical and mental well-being can be affected by issues like stress, anxiety, depression and fatigue;
- Resentment starts to infiltrate as perceived inequalities are felt around home duties, workload, parenting and intimacy;
- Feelings of disrespect, being ignored, being taken for granted, even feeling unloved may arise that can erode the quality of healthy family and couple relationships.



How do we get the balance right?

- Make couple time to communicate how you are each feeling;
- Keep a tab on work time verses home/family hours;

- Talk to your wife/partner/kids about your challenges of transitioning from work to home, so they can see your perspective and for you to see things from theirs;
- Talk/communicate with your partner about the type of parents you both want to be;
- If you are a new dad, take time off to help care and know your baby, help at night with feeding, dressing and that awful job of changing nappies;
- Allocate dad time, this can be every-day routines like taking/dropping kids off to school, the bus stop or sport. This will help develop and maintain connection with the kids by showing interest in their lives;
- It is also very important to leave some regular time for yourself.

How do I switch from work to home mode?

- Arrange your day to do the most difficult tasks first instead of at the end;
- Consider if it might be worth staying a little longer at work to finish up a task instead of bringing it home with you;
- Develop a ritual or routine to help you move from work mode i.e. change out of your work clothes and shower when you get home;
- Switch your thinking to the kids and home as you leave work, putting work to rest.

Being stressed and tired from a hard day's work can contaminate the time you spend with your children. The family will know if you are present with them or if your head is elsewhere.

If your wife/partner/kids feel second best, feelings about their own self-worth can be affected.

To finish here are a couple of questions you might like to ask yourself: 1. what good memory would you like your children to have of you? 2. when comparing your own upbringing what would you do differently as a dad?


Sunday, 5th June marks the Christian Feast of Pentecost which is a celebration of the Coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost Day and thus the birth of the Church, when on the fiftieth day of Easter, God sends his Holy Spirit to empower the Church (Jesus' followers) to perform the mission which the risen Christ has entrusted to it and them. As such, the risen Lord is no longer present to the Church in the body of his flesh; the Church is now to be the new body of Christ, filled with his life through the gift of the Spirit.

John the Baptist was an itinerant preacher active in an area of the Jordan River in the early First century AD. He is mentioned by the



Roman Jewish historian Josephus, and is revered as a major religious figure in Christianity, Islam, the Bahá'í Faith, the Druze Faith, and Mandaeism. He is considered a prophet of God by all of these faiths and is honoured as a saint in many Christian denominations. According to the New Testament, John anticipated a messianic figure greater than himself, and the Gospels portray John as the forerunner of Jesus. In the Church's calendar his birth to the Blessed Virgin Mary's cousin Elizabeth, and his beheading at the command of Herod Antipas are both commemorated. The dedication of **the Church of St John in the Wilderness, The Dale**, honours John the Baptist. A service to celebrate his birth will take place at St Mary's Church, Beverley, at 10.00 a.m. on Sunday, 26th June.

European wasp season draws to a close



The European wasp 2021-22 season draws to a close with 52 nests found and destroyed.

The optimum time to detect and locate European wasps (*Vespula germanica*) has passed. Traps are being brought in for cleaning and now is the time to reflect on another fruitful surveillance season. It is also time to say thank you to everyone across WA who kept an eye out and reported!

How did we go?

Nest numbers were higher than last season; 52 compared to 14. Nest distribution indicates multiple areas of incursion across Perth, predominantly in, or around industrial areas – which is typical of this hitchhiking pest. The nests detected did not show signs of 'overwintering', which means they were created this season and is a promising indication that nests were not missed during last season's surveillance activities. YAY! Public awareness and reporting remained strong. Residents, businesses, and local government all detected wasp activity in good time, allowing for nests to be found and trapping areas expanded where required. And finally, there were no signs or reports of wasp activity at the close of the season!

Season highlights:

- 3,000+ surveillance traps deployed
- 174 new traps adopted by the community
- 400+ public enquiries, with 12 confirmed detections
- 52 nests found and destroyed, with nests found across 11 Local Government Areas incorporating 24 suburbs - all in the Perth metropolitan region.

Reporting highlights:

- wasps visiting bird baths were spotted in Jandakot and Swanbourne
- wasps feeding on watermelon at a restaurant in Bibra Lake and pet food in Ascot
- an uninvited wasp visitor to a lunchroom in Gnangara
- a nest detection at a Middle Swan winery

The surveillance season runs December to May but reports of suspect wasp activity can be made year-round. For more information about the eradication program, how to identify wasps or how you can help further, see agric.wa.gov.au/wasps or contact our Pest and Disease Information Service.



Beverley Garden & Tree Society

Hopefully last month's item on rose care was useful and we will see many more beautiful roses at the annual Beverley Rose and Quilt show in October. Please consider entering even if you have never done so before.

The May meeting of the Garden and Tree Society was replaced by a visit to Busy Bush Bees in Westdale where Anna and Joe made us very welcome. We were treated to a most interesting and informative morning which covered everything from the hives to the finished product in the jars. Thank you very much Anna and Joe.

The June meeting will be replaced by trip to the Perth Zoo to view their gardens on Tuesday the 7th. The bus will be leaving the Dead Finish at 9am. Cost of entry to the zoo is \$27.00 concession and the bus will be paid for by the club. Buying lunch is optional, you may prefer to bring your own. Seats are limited so please book early by ringing Dorothy on 0429 989 031.

Ok, it's official, winter is upon us. And while it may seem easier to curl up on the couch with a cup of tea and a good book, it is the perfect time to get amongst it in the patch! There is a sense of hibernation for a lot of us but wherever you are in this nation it's time to don the boots and get to it.

- It is a great time to plant in the temperate zones, so pop in some Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli. Peas and beans can also go in, as well as radish, turnips, Swedes and spinach.
- It's time to get happy with herbs, so try some chamomile and lemon grass. You could give mint and lemon balm a go as well, but be careful to contain them as they can take over.
- Why not try some lovely flowering stuff in your patch as well, like: cornflower, calendula, dianthus, pansies, viola, snapdragons, stock, ageratum and marigolds. These guys are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects to your patch, and they look great as well.
- You should start seeing bare rooted fruit and deciduous trees starting to appear in your local nursery. This is the cheapest and easiest way to purchase. The stress is less for the tree as it is dormant. Pick trees with a nice shape, and don't forget to prune them back before you plant them out (best thing to do is ask the local nursery to do it for you). Remember to make sure you have the correct pollinators to ensure a good crop. Some stone fruit trees will not fruit until they have been in the ground for a few years. So be patient.
- Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds, especially
 important for weed suppression at this time of year. A hot tip is to mulch after watering the
 patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems, especially young
 seedlings. Choose low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks
 down.
- Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect, especially for the seedlings planted this month. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
- Weeding is still needed at this time of year. Most plant growth has slowed down, so it will not have to happen as often. But it also means that it is also a time of year to try and remove as many competitors as possible before the weather starts warming up again.
- Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning, and instead of a quick irrigation, a nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial! Always check soil moisture before watering, don't waste your precious drinking water if Mother Nature has already done all the hard work for you!
