





Beverley and Districts Agricultural Show

Saturday 20th August saw the 145th Annual Show at the Oval. The weather proved to be very kind after a couple of weeks of weather that could only make our famers happy. Certainly not the contractors on Vincent Street. It is estimated that another good crowd of about 2,500 people presented throughout the day testimony to the organisation of the Committee.

On a personnel note, the Show Committee made Life Membership awards to both Mr. Brian and Mrs. Lorraine Sims for the many years of dedicated service to the Committee. For the occasion, they both participated in officially opening the Show.

On behalf of the Shire and community our congratulations and thanks to the President, Mr. Mick Martin, and all the members of the Committee for their dedicated work throughout the year to present this event.

Vincent Street Streetscape Project

The priority is to have a presentable street for the '*Spring Back to Beverley*' event on 24th to 26th September. Significant rain over a couple of weeks in August saw many delays. Landscapers endeavouring to plant tress where rice might have been better suited. The wombat crossings on the south side of the street had to be abandoned just before the Show as paving became too difficult.

Nevertheless, with a run of fine weather the aim to have the street ready for the 24th should be achieved. Wombat crossings to be completed, furniture installed, landscaping to be completed and the final hot-mix sealing of the street. Unfortunately, a minor hiccup occurred to a couple of the wombat crossings after the south side of the street was opened.

Astrotourism Ballardong Planisphere Launch.

With Stephen Gollan and Jacinta Murray, we attended the launch of the Astrotourism Planisphere project at the Recreation Building on Friday 29th July. The Shire had made a contribution of \$7,000 towards this project. The aim of it was to combine the aboriginal stories of the stars with practical observation.

The event was aimed mainly at the school children and they were a large number present. They had the opportunity of observing the night sky through two telescopes and learning about the various constellations.

Bushtucker Launch Avondale

The Yoordaninj-bah Bush Food Report Launch was conducted at Avondale on Thursday 18th August. With about 200 invited guests in attendance the Noongar Land Enterprise led by newly appointed CEO Alan Beattie, and Chairman Oral McGuire, outlined the aims of the organisation in wanting to develop a commercial enterprise around bush tucker. The hope is to enter a lease agreement with the National Trust for Avondale.

Central Country Zone Conference

Beverley was the host Shire for the Central Country Zone Conference comprising 15 Local Governments in the central wheatbelt on Friday 26th August. With attendance of over 50 people, we were able to present the achievements of Beverley over the past 12 years. The Vincent Street redevelopment was of particular interest to many who are contemplating how to improve their main streets.

Where: Shire of Beverley Amenities Building on Forrest Street

Why: This course is the minimum training competency standard considered to be compliant with the new Workplace Health & Safety Act 2021. This will attempt to alleviate the implications of severe financial penalties (up to \$10 million dollars) and potential criminal charges that could be imposed upon the Shire should a health or safety incident occur during a fire emergency in Beverley

If you wish to sign up to a Shire of Beverley BFB, (Avondale, Beverley Central, Beverley South East, Beverley North East, Dale/Kokeby, Dale West) please email your name to the same email address.
Along with minimum training requirements all persons attending active firegrounds will be required to meet the minimum dress standards of long trousers, long sleeves and boots. Volunteer BFB members are issued with Personal Protective Clothing that can be collected from the Shire when required.



ABOUT TONY GALATI: THE MUSICAL

Tony Galati the Musical is a popular, accessible and entertaining local story with a quality script and score that has entertained over 6,000 people in Perth. It's a clever and heart-warming ode to WA's favourite underdog. It's a story inspired by the true story of Tony Galati – the retailer, farmer and immigrant who won the hearts of West Australians by fighting against corporate overlords so that every family could have access to healthy vegetables. It's a unique WA story of fighting for fairness and family. A love letter to WA. Tony's father, Francesco, moved from Italy to busy Perth in the 60s, looking for a better life for his family. Across decades, Tony's father, and then Tony, are curtailed by the nefarious (and fictional) Russet Burbank of the (100% real) Potato Marketing Board. Will Tony ever fit in?

Inspired by a show-stealing singing-and-dancing Potato, Tony doubles down on his vision and creates Spudshed, feeding working class families fresh vegetables - much to the ire of Russet and the Board, who threaten him with jail. Losing hope, Tony is visted by the ghost of this father channelled through our singing Potato. The potato inspires him with the story of how she, as a rugged little vegetable, found a way into the world's hearts. The people of WA also unite behind him - he'll always be their Spud King. recipes to Try

The Famous 100 Cookie Recipe

Ingredients

- 500 g butter
- ¾ cup (170g) caster sugar
- 395 g sweetened condensed milk
- 5 cups (750g) self raising flour
- your choice of flavours/add ins

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees celsius (fan-forced).
- Grease and line baking trays and set aside (use as many as will fit in your oven).
- 3. Cream the room temperature butter and caster sugar together with handheld beaters or a stand mixer until light, creamy and fluffy.
- 4. Add the condensed milk and beat through.
- 5. Add 1 cup of self-raising flour and beat through. Add another cup of selfraising flour and beat through. Continue until all 5 cups have been mixed through.
- Divide the cookie dough between bowls and flavour each however you'd like (see notes).
- 7. Roll into teaspoon-sized balls and place onto the prepared baking trays. Press down lightly with a fork.
- 8. Bake for 10 minutes. Allow to cool for 10 minutes on the baking trays before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.



Traditional Egg and Bacon Pie with Puff Pastry

Ingredients

- 2 sheets puff pastry defrosted
- · 200 g bacon chopped
- 1 medium (225g) brown onion diced
- 75 g (% cup) cheddar cheese grated
- 5 eggs
- 125 g (½ cup) cream or milk

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 200 degrees celsius fan-forced (390 degrees fahrenheit).
- 2.Lightly grease a 12cm x 36cm (5 x 14 inch) loose-bottomed pie or tart tin.
- 3. Place one sheet of the puff pastry into the tin and press down. Use the second piece to cover any gaps that remain.
- 4. Fry the bacon and onion over medium heat in a frying pan until the onion has softened and the bacon has started to crisp up.
- 5. Place the bacon and onion into the tin on top of the pastry.
- 6. Sprinkle over half of the cheese.
- 7. With a fork, lightly beat the eggs and cream or milk together. Pour the egg mixture into the tin.
- 8. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese.
- 9. Bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Allow to stand for 10 minutes before serving.





Blitz on tree pests and diseases

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's (DPIRD's) Biosecurity Blitz is back in 2022, with a special focus on reporting tree pests and diseases.

The TREEmendous Biosecurity Blitz aims to protect Western Australia's trees from an increasing number of exotic threats, such the recent incursions of polyphagous shot-hole borer and myrtle rust.

Whether you work in forestry or horticulture, like to bushwalk, have trees in your backyard, in the local park or on your street, you can help protect our trees into the future by checking them for pests and diseases and reporting any you find during the Blitz.

Every report helps!

Every report helps to increase the likelihood that serious pests and diseases will be detected early, providing the best opportunity to eradicate or contain them.

If your report turns out to be a common pest, that data is used to support WA's export trade.

30 days to look - snap - report

This year the TREEmendous Biosecurity Blitz runs from 24 September to 24 October 2022 – that's 30 days to look for, take a photo and send in a report of every tree pest and disease in your local area.

- Download the free <u>MyPestGuide® Reporter</u> <u>app</u>.
- Check trees in your backyard, property, local area or nearby bushland for pests and diseases.
- Take photos of any pests or disease signs you find and note the tree species or common name.
- Report using the app or online at <u>mypestguide.agric.wa.gov.au</u>.

Every report gets a response – let's see what's in that tree! You will also receive a weekly email with pest identification and tree health tips, information on priority tree pests, activities, and invitations to webinars and workshops.

Talk to a Mater Talk to a Mater

The message we give in everything we do is ... before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate[•]!! As human beings we are fundamentally social in nature, staying connected and feeling valued for who we are is of primary importance to us. Talking to other people about issues in our lives or telling our stories helps us to normalise our experiences and realise we are not alone in having them. As blokes we tend to retreat into ourselves when things are turning pear shaped (cave time), much to the frustration of most women. This is the normal way men tend to start processing their problems.

Metaphorically stepping into the cave can be helpful to get a handle on things but it is important that we are able to acknowledge and recognise when it is time to step back out and seek the support we need. Having a plan already in place that identifies who the mates are that we can turn to is important. Without a network of true mates, we become susceptible to feelings of isolation and loneliness.

As blokes we can recognise three main categories from where we find and establish real mateship. These exist usually in the forms of a partner (intimate relationship), a peer (someone around the same age that perhaps has a similar experience of lifestyle and activities to us) and a mentor (an older person whose lived experience we place value upon). A real mate is more than just an associate, it's someone that knowingly respects and values who we are and is willing to make the time to genuinely listen to us. Think about who you would classify as a mate; and about the blokes you know who perhaps have few or none of these categories in their lives?

Often it is said that blokes in general don't really like to talk about stuff and if we disclose that we have a few problems someone will exploit our problem or weakness, but the reality is quite different. Given the right environment, where we feel safe most men will willingly share their story and talk about issues LISTENING IS OFTEN The only thing needed to Help someone.

that matter to them and there is real value in realizing that there are other men experiencing the same things (no matter what the issue). Being a good mate is about supporting a person in that space and genuinely listening to what they have to say. We don't have to be an expert or necessarily have any of the answers to people's problems, just the ability to listen with empathy.

Being a good mate is also about actively looking out for the people we care about and acting when we recognise that something is not quite right. If we have a gut feel that someone we know is not travelling well, don't be afraid to ask them how they are going and ask more than once!

As men we need to encourage help seeking behaviour and be prepared to be the one to *Talk to a Mate*[°] when we know he's not travelling well and/or know that a mate is down or experiencing difficulties. It isn't rocket science and it does work.

Talk to your doctor, even during COVID-19, to Find Cancer Early

It's important, especially living regionally to talk to your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker about cancer symptoms, after results of a recent survey suggest COVID-19 continues to have an impact on people seeking medical help. Now more than ever, people should be talking to their doctor about any worrying symptoms.

A survey across regional WA was recently conducted to evaluate the latest Find Cancer Early campaign. Regional Champions. Out of the 953 people who took part in the survey, a staggering 47 per cent of respondents said they felt COVID-19 added barriers to seeking help and treatment options. This compares to 31 per cent who felt impacted last year, and 32 per cent when the pandemic began in 2020.

With the third wave continuing in WA, we urge anyone with worrying symptoms not to put off talking to your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. We want to reassure the Wheatbelt community that medical centres are open, and appointments are available faceto-face, or alternatively by phone or through Telehealth. These allow a patient to speak to their doctor from the comfort of their home. As we know, the earlier cancer is found, the greater the chance of successful treatment and being around longer for our families.


