

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Vincent Street Streetscape Project

At the time of writing this report, the firm of road sealers had completed their task of sealing Vincent Street. All that remains now is to finish off a number of small matters that should be completed by the MG Group by the end of September. Eleven months of inconvenience will then be over and the community can begin enjoying and using a Vincent Street that we could not have envisaged.

Sadly, there have been some who seem to have set out to make life as difficult for the contractors as possible. This seems to fly in the face of the reputation of country people as being resilient, welcoming, and hospitable. Fortunately, there have been so many of our community who have gone out of their way to offer words of support and encouragement. To all those in this category, thank you.

To the Shire staff, thank you for all the efforts you have made in driving the project and the work put towards it. To Stephen Gollan and the Working Group of Simon Marshall, Stefan De Beer, and Steve Vincent, thank you for your all your efforts to deal with the many issues that arose so unexpectedly requiring constant changes.

To Anthony Santella and the men from the MG Group who have been among us for eleven months and away from families on a weekly basis, thank you for a job well done. Managing a construction project open to members of the public is far from ideal, but you did it well.

The community should also be congratulated for coping with the project, the nature of which provided many hazards and risks. Your willingness to cope with common sense and ensure your own safety has been a real credit.

Spring Back to Beverley

I would like to thank Jacinta Murray, the Shire's Tourism Officer who initiated the Spring Back to Beverley event. Working with the Beverley Historical Society, a group came together to work towards this event over the long weekend. The driver for the event is the celebration of the 150th anniversary of the oldest building in town; the Wheatsheaf Inn, or the Dead Finish Museum. Thanks Joy Smith and the Committee of the Historical Society and the Spring Back to Beverley Event Organisers for all your efforts.

In terms of the Dead Finish Museum even existing today, all credit for this must go to three ladies who campaigned strongly against the demolition to ensure the community have this valuable piece of history today. Those ladies were Mrs. Ruth Mann, Mrs. Peg Kempton and Mrs Maree Hutchinson.

To all the community groups who came on board with the idea, thank you also for your support. I am sure we will have many visitors over the weekend for an event of which we can all feel proud. As a part of the weekend there will be an unveiling of a plaque to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the formation of the Beverley Road Board in 1871 (151 years!). This will be carried out by the Minister for Local Government, the Honourable John Carey. It will be an opportunity to showcase our community to him and demonstrate the nature and spirit of communities who choose to live and work in the hinterland beyond the Darling Scarpe.

Beverley Road Board

The history of the Local Government in Beverley is worth noting. Beginning with its formation in 1871 and with Mr Charles Smith as the first Chairman, the area of the Road Board initially stretched to Eucla at the Great Australian Bight, some 1,200 kilometres away.

The East Beverley Road Board was formed in 1895 incorporating much of the area east of the current Shire as well as areas covering Quairading, Brookton, and Pingelly. This organisation was disbanded in 1906 with the formation of the Road Boards for each of the towns noted above.

For a period, the township of Beverley had its own Local Government with the formation of the Beverley Municipal Council in 1892. This was disbanded in 1913 and incorporated into the Beverley Road Board.

While this is just dry history, I believe it is important for all of us to realise that those who chose to serve on all these local government entities over the years, giving of their time and effort, has given us all that we enjoy today in our town and community as we celebrate 150 years.

Plaque Unveiling Speeches from Spring Back to Beverley

Mrs. Joy Smith - President Historical Society 150 year Anniversary of the Dead Finish

Good morning, everyone and thank-you for being here so early in the morning.

My name is Joy Smith, and I am the current president of the Historical Society here in Beverley. I welcome today Sally Hasluck from the Royal Western Australian Historical Society, Our Shire President David White and shire councilors and CEO Steve Gollan. Welcome also my fellow hard working Historical Society members current and past members.

I would like also to welcome current and past Beverley residents and their families here to celebrate 150 years of this wonderful building that we now use as a Museum. The building was built in 1872 by or for anyway Alfred Smith and his twin brother Frederick, incidentally the first twins in the colony. The building was built as a hotel which was not all together popular with some people in the town. This fabulous building was built on 13 acres approx. and was made of locally fired bricks and the roof was finished with she oak shingles. It has a cellar and has had a few changes over the years. There was also an extensive vegetable garden and Stables for the horses. The first name of the building was The Wheatsheaf Inn and run by Alfred Smith. It was then known as "Settlers Arms" and finally Beverley Hotel.

The building was used as a hotel but also for meetings, dances, weddings and as a general meeting place for the community. It did have its problems as suggested by the Nay Sayers but all together an important early community hub, as in those early days this street Hunt Road was the centre of town. It has had a few owners, lessees, and many licensees over the years. Some whose families are here this weekend.

It was delicensed in 1919 and the Abbeys the last licensees lived there for many years. With them for some years the Boyle family and later the Reynolds Family who then bought the building living there for some years. They sold it to the Shire of Beverley and eventually became our very special Museum thanks to many very enthusiastic first members of the Beverley Historical Society.

Please welcome Sally Hasluck Vice president of the Royal Western Australian Historical Society and our president of the Shire of Beverley, David White to help me unveil the Plaque for 150 years of this building.

Cr David White, Shire President 150yr Anniversary of the Beverley Road Board

Good morning everyone and welcome,

The Hon. John Carey MLA, Minister for Housing; Lands; Homelessness; and Local Government; Ms Sally Anne Hasluck OAM, Vice President of the Royal Western Australian Historical Society, Shire of Beverley Councillors; Mr Stephen Gollan, Shire of Beverley CEO; and The Spring Back to Beverley Event Organisers.

I begin by acknowledging the Ballardong people and pay respect to the local elders, past and present.

My name is David White, and as Shire President it is my pleasure to welcome you to this commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Beverley Road Board, now Shire of Beverley.

This celebration weekend arose from a suggestion put to the Council by the Beverley Historical Society in 2020 to commemorate both the 150th Anniversary of the Dead Finish Museum and the 150th anniversary of the Local Government.

I would like to thank the Beverley Historical Society and the Spring Back to Beverley Working group for volunteering their time over the last two years to put this wonderful event together. There is also a special exhibition they have created in the Town Hall which celebrates these events.

The first local government was formally established in 1871 as the Beverley Road Board with Mr Charles Smith as the first Chairman. It covered an area that stretched eastwards to Eucla on the Great Australian Bight, some 1200 kilometres away!

In 1895, the East Beverley Road Board was formed. This authority included the eastern part of the current Shire as well as parts of the current Shires of Quairading, Brookton and Pingelly. In 1906 the East Beverley Road Board was disbanded with its area divided into the newly formed Road Boards centred on Quairading, Brookton and Pingelly.

In 1892 the Beverley townsite established its own Local Government known as the Beverley Municipal Council. A completely separate authority from the Road Board it was integrated into the Beverley Road Board in 1913.

There was a fairly stable period of growth in the Road Board between the 1920's and early 1960's. In 1960 the Road Board comprised 8 elected members and an appointed Secretary. Some functions of the Board had grown to incorporate rabbit control and the provision of public facilities, including the town hall, swimming pool and recreation grounds.

With the passing of the Local Government Act 1960, all Road Boards were reorganised as local government authorities with 8 Councillors. The Shire Clerk replaced the Secretary of the Board and about this time the Shire of Beverley moved from the Town Hall to the former headmaster's house next door at 136 Vincent Street.

In 1989, the current Shire Office and Chambers were constructed on the same site as the old office and the number of Councillors was increased to its current level of 9.

Today the Shire of Beverley is 2,310 square kilometres in size with 767km of roads of which 220 kilometres are sealed. Over 60% of our rate revenue is allocated to roads, bridges and plant equipment.

Since formation, over 175 local men and women have served the community on the various bodies. To the founders of Beverley and recognising those early years, I think it is important to acknowledge this service without which we would not be enjoying the township and surrounds we have today.

The Council are heavily invested in the growth of the community providing new facilities and services. Some of our recent achievements include:

- 1. Additions and renovations to the sporting complex at the oval;
- 2. The construction of the Cornerstone Building which houses the Community Resource Centre, Visitor Centre, Library, Day Care Centre, and four leased offices;
- 3. The construction of the Moort Wabiny Park which incorporates numerous activities for the youth;
- 4. The construction of six cottages near the caravan park comprised of three two bedroom and three one-bedroom units; and,
- 5. Now the near completion of the redevelopment of Vincent Street.

This last project has taken 11 months and while it has caused inconvenience to the community, I would like to thank all those community members who have shown unswerving support for it and engaged with the contractors in such a positive manner.

In all, the number of projects undertaken by the Shire over the past 12 years have cost a total of about \$13 million. Funding has largely come from State and Federal Grants. Shire contributions have come from Reserves and Loans.

At the conclusion of these formalities, you are invited to view the Council Chambers and the Honour Board. The area will remain open for half an hour.

I would now like to invite the Minister for Local Government, the Honourable John Carey to address us and invite him to unveil the anniversary plaque.

What to do: If you are an existing Shire of Beverley Bush Fire Brigade Volunteer please email your name and Brigade to the Shire's Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) <u>troy.granville@beverley.wa.gov.au</u> to confirm initial registration.

Why: This course in the minimum training competency standard considered to be compliant with the new Workplace Health & Safety Act 2021. This will attempt to alleviate the implications of severe financial penalties (up to \$10 million dollars) and potential criminal charges that could be imposed upon the Shire should a health or safety incident occur during a fire emergency in Beverley

- If you wish to sign up to a Shire of Beverley BFB, (Avondale, Beverley Central, Beverley South East, Beverley North East, Dale/Kokeby, Dale West) please email your name to the same email address.
- Along with minimum training requirements all persons attending active firegrounds will be required to
 meet the minimum dress standards of long trousers, long sleeves and boots. Volunteer BFB members are
 issued with Personal Protective Clothing that can be collected from the Shire when required.

BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents Remarkable Women of Beverley

Verna Cranfield (nee Hodges) 1934-2022

Verna Anne Hodges was born to Mr & Mrs Frank Hodges of Melbourne, Victoria. Frank Hodges was described as 'a valued tradesman with a well-known Victorian engineering firm'. Verna was one of four daughters.

In 1954 Verna married Leslie Brian Cranfield of Beverley. They have a son they name Danny. The Cranfields had worked & farmed in Mt Kokeby & the Dale since the early part of the century. In 1955 Les Cranfield's name appears in the Westralian Farmers agent's list of Perth wool sales, indicating Les was farming & shearing sheep. By 1957 Verna appears on the tea roster for the CWA.

In due course Verna is visited by her Victorian family. Her sister Mrs Don Brown and husband come in 1958. Another sister Pamela Hodges comes in 1959 for a working holiday. Pamela met Selby Ford & in 1960 they married in St Mary's Church with Verna & Les standing in lieu of Pamela's parents. Finally, her third sister Mrs Morrison from Mordialloc, Victoria came with her husband & three children with aim of settling in Beverley in 1968.

In Beverley, both Les & Verna become involved in

community groups. Les is on the committee of

the swimming club from when it forms in 1962 after the opening of the 50m pool. He later is elected president & Verna supports with organising catering for events. They both play golf and both become involved with the P&C Association. On one occasion when trainee teachers were in town, Les did some demonstration shearing one day and Verna invited them all out to a barbecue on the Sunday.

Verna continued with the CWA too.

Verna came into her own with regards to sewing and dressmaking using her talents in both commercial & voluntary matters. In 1962 it was reported that Women's Hockey players' "new Charleston style uniforms looked most attractive. This is the result of much agitation and advice from many many club members but is mainly the brain child of Miss Pat Ferguson and Mrs. Verna Cranfield, who deserve a vote of thanks for the time and thought involved."

In 1968 at the Golf Club, "Mrs Verna Cranfield very generously offered to make up the new curtains. These have all been lined, and are beautifully made and on behalf of all the Associates I wish to thank you most sincerely, Verna. Our thanks also go to Mr Les Cranfield who put up all the hooks and rods and hung the curtains for us."





In the 1960s, marching teams became popular and the Beverley Marching Girls pink and white uniforms were very eye-catching. Many of the 50 to 60 uniforms worn by all ages were made by Verna Cranfield.

However, it is for her work on wedding, bridesmaid, mothers of brides & groom, and debutante dresses that she is so fondly remembered. She made her sister Pamela's dress, as well as those of all the bridesmaids in the wedding party in 1960. In 1961 she made the Debutante Ball dress [below] for Lois Corbett (later McLean). In 1963 Irene Ford's wedding gown "was enchantingly simple & much admired ... and Mrs Cranfield is to be commended". At the Val Moir (nee Ferguson) wedding in 1966 "Mrs Verna Cranfield was responsible for the making of the bridal parties' frocks".

There was a severe fire out on the Cranfield's Dale property in the late summer of 1966 & the Cranfields suffered some loss. Perhaps this was a catalyst for change, because by 1969 Verna & Les had left the district to settle in the Rockingham area.

The couple were sadly missed and many remember what a lovely person Verna was and how skilled she was with her dressmaking.

Les died in 2007 aged 75, while Verna died in 2022 aged 88.

A special display of photos and some items sewn by Verna Cranfield can be seen at the Dead Finish Museum, open on Sundays until the end of November 2022.

An open letter to the citizens of Beverley

The town of Beverley is celebrating 150 yrs of existence which is in some ways remarkable given the alien nature of the landscape the seasons & the animals which the colonists encountered.

The settlers carved out farms from the bush.

They used the labour & knowledge of the indigenous people to assist them whilst at the same time denying them basic human rights.

The legislation of the times forbade conversation between colonists & indigenous people & as the settlement grew they had designated times for shopping & there was a curfew imposed.

When the shelter celebrating the Centenary of Federation was relocated from Vincent Street to Apex Park I suggested that the reverse of the panels displaying the photographs be painted by the Noongar people (having first spoken to Marg Mourach)

I thought that as the corner where the rose garden is located was one of the places where the Noongar people camped it would be a fitting symbol of reconciliation & acknowledgement. (At the time of writing they remain blank)

The indigenous people hold a wealth of knowledge about this land having managed It sustainably for millennia.

It is vital that we begin to learn from their knowledge & experience through respectful consultation.

We need to act now to prevent further degradation of our environment & to begin to restore the lost habitat of insects & birds

We need to clean up & revitalise the river & cease spraying weeds & mosquitoes Insect populations are plummeting & with them bird populations because of the use of herbicides & insecticides.

When the weeds are sprayed it is not only the weeds which die but all the little creatures which live in them which in turn destroys a food source of other species.

The same applies to the spraying of mosquitoes.

No insects & birds equals no pollination & waste removal therefore no food source for animals & no health & wellbeing for humans.

It's a bleak outlook.

We need to remember that we are a part of nature not above it.

These observations are not unique but the lack of any perceptible change here in Beverley is of concern to me.

There is a world & nationwide impulse for change to repair our relationships with First Nations people & the damage done to our environment. Let's be part of it.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

Breast cancer is the most common cancer affecting women in Western Australia, though men can also develop breast cancer.

In 2019, 1,890 Western Australian women were diagnosed with breast cancer, accounting for almost a third of all female cancer cases, and sadly 252 women in WA died from the disease.

Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast
- Change in the look of your breast, like: your skin looks like the skin of an orange, your skin is wrinkling in small folds, redness or rash.
- Changes to the nipple, like it's: pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side.
- · An area of the breast that feels different to the rest.

Get to know your breasts and what's normal for you and if you notice any unusual changes tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. If it is breast cancer, the earlier it's found, the greater the chance of successful treatment. Please visit www.findcancerearly.com.au for more information about breast cancer.

Screening for breast cancer

Women aged between 50 and 74 are invited to access free screening mammograms every two years via the <u>BreastScreen Australia Program.</u>

It is recommended that women with a strong family history of breast or <u>ovarian cancer</u>, aged between 40 and 49 or over 75 discuss options with their GP, or contact BreastScreen Australia on 13 20 50.

If you do not have any symptoms then it is highly recommended to partake in the program. However, if you are experiencing symptoms, instead visit your doctor without delay.

If you have a symptom, it does not mean you have breast cancer. Often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. However, it is important to get these symptoms or any unusual changes in your body checked out just in case.

Snail activity is trailing off

The weather is warming and drying

Reports of snail activity and requests for identifications have been frequent in September, but shortly, snail activity will ...trail off. To survive periods of high temperature and to prevent desiccation, snails will seal their shell and enter a prolonged state of torpor or dormancy, called aestivation.

Some snails will 'aestivate' by burying themselves in the ground or under stones or leaf litter, which is typical for species such as the green snail and conical snails. White Italian snails often climb fence posts, grass stalks or stubble and other vegetation to avoid high soil surface temperatures. Garden snails are often seen in tree or plant canopies, trying to escape the heat. Start looking! Where will your snails find a place to hide when the weather warms and dries?

Hiding out of sight

Snails are good hitchhikers, as they can tuck themselves into nooks and crannies when looking for places to forage or aestivate. To prevent further movement and distribution of pests in WA, practice

good biosecurity measures including cleaning any machinery and containers and not moving soil, plants and plant material from one area to another before inspecting closely and removing any pests.

Reporting helps!

The most commonly reported snail species in WA are the common garden snail (*Cornu aspersum*), white Italian snail (*Theba pisana*), small pointed (conical) snail (*Prietocella barbara*), vineyard or common white snail (*Cernuella virgata*) and green snail (*Cornu apertus*).

As green snails are not present in all States and Territories in Australia, there are certain conditions related to exporting plants, produce and agriculture equipment from WA. As such, we encourage the reporting of green snails, especially in regional areas, so we are aware of their distribution and can keep industry informed.

Surveillance for exotic species is a shared responsibility. If you see a snail you don't recognise please record its location, photograph it, and report it to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD).

dental Health and Wel You Can't Have One Without the Ot

Google the word mental health and you'll find numerous organisations and groups promoting the importance of mental health, but how it is described and the context in which it is discussed can vary significantly. We think understanding the difference between mental health and wellbeing and mental illness is important as this is one area where definitions can become blurred and language may disempower people by putting them in a box.

Mental health and wellbeing encompasses all aspects of our emotional, psychological and social wellbeing, so it affects how we feel, think and interact with the world around us. A good definition which encapsulates this is summarised by the World Health Organisation (2007) - a state of wellbeing in which an individual realises his or her own abilities, can cope with normal stresses of life, can work productively and is able to make a contribution to his or her community. In summary we think that having good mental health is the ability to deal with life's challenges and changes, maintaining positive relationships, enjoying life and getting the balance right.

Mental illness on the other hand is a health problem that affects how we think, behave and interact therefore significantly affecting our mental health and wellbeing. It is diagnosed according to standardised criteria. Some of the major types of mental illnesses are anxiety, schizophrenia, bipolar, personality disorders, and depression. However, what if I was in a period in my life where things were not so great, I'm not coping, and the challenges and changes are starting to become overwhelming? Does this mean I have a mental illness? I think not.

I say this because sometimes it seems in society, we are almost not allowed to feel pain, show weakness, or not cope as this may be interpreted as there being something wrong with us. Unfortunately, the system provides the word depression as an answer for a whole range of situational stressors which occur in society and need to be discussed. We need to normalise a person's response during a difficult or abnormal life event and a phrase we coin for times like this is being in a state of Situational Distress.

There are numerous life challenges that come our way that can cause us distress such as separation, illness, injury, trauma, financial worries, grief, adolescence, fatherhood, midlife, change of job, redundancy and transition into retirement. When it comes to our mental health and wellbeing it's important to remember none of us are exempt from hard knocks! Just as we're given the vulnerability to experience tragedy, we're given the human resources to heal and deal with it. As T. Green (2008) states "We don't get memory erasures, but we're given stamina, resilience and fortitude to see the world hasn't stopped."



What can we do to assist and manage situational distress and get our mental health and wellbeing back into balance?

- Identify our mates (build a support network of people we feel safe to confide in i.e. peer, partner, mentor);
- Program time out from work and normalize the problem;
- Maintain social opportunities, take time to laugh with
- Take a break, a holiday, go fishing, try something different, explore our passions and interest;
- Exercise, keep active and maintain a healthy diet (this includes reducing alcohol use);
- Make sure we are getting enough sleep;
- Be willing to talk to the appropriate people i.e. family, mates, work colleagues or a professional (accountant, lawyer, psychologist, helpline or GP).

Maintaining a balance and aiming for positive mental health and wellbeing is something we all need to do, this includes acknowledging that we are all susceptible to the stressors of life. Our health and wellbeing are our responsibility, be proactive, address our distress early and don't let it get out of hand.

The last couple of meetings of the darder

discussions discussions around the Annual Rose Show and to that end we need a lot of community members to bring roses into the town hall on Friday the 21st of October. There are some great prizes on offer plus raffles, stalls selling a variety of wares and Devonshire teas for sale, provided by members of the Community Markets. The Beverley Quilting group will

again be displaying their beautiful work. There will also be a display of cups and saucers. Come along and support this great event that has been running since at least 1974. Please see full details on another page.

The weather is certainly warming up and summer is fast approaching but there is still plenty to do in the garden during October.

Vegies to plant in October include – beetroot, capsicum, cucumber, lettuce, pumpkin, tomato, zucchini, carrot and sweet corn.

Flowers to plant in October include - alyssum, marigold, petunia, portulaca, salvia, cornflower, lobelia and snapdragon.

October is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- ☆ Repot orchids as soon as they have finished flowering. They need repotting every 3-4 years
- ☆ Cut stems of kangaroo paw flowers and display inside. Leave a stump 10-20cm long where a second flush of flowers will appear from dormant buds
- ☆ Ensure your irrigation system is in good working order. Clean filters, flush the drip lines, sprinklers and drippers and repair any holes
- ☆ Composting worms start to eat more food now that it is warming up. Chop up scraps finely to speed up the process
- Be sure to keep on top of couch grass and kikuyu in garden beds. These can regrow ☆ from any tiny pieces that are left in the ground
- Tomatoes should be rotated to new parts of the garden every year to reduce the ☆ chance of diseases ruining your crop
- ☆ Buddleja, tea tree, daisies, marigolds, lavender, bottle brush and grevillea are all great plants for attracting butterflies to your garden and now is a great time to plant them
- Prune native shrubs by about a third every 12 months or so to keep them compact ☆ and bushy and to stimulate new growth
- ☆ Plant native succulents such as pigface around your house as a fire retardant barrier
- ☆ Prune only the flowered stems of proteas. Un-flowered stems are next season's blooms
- ☆ Plant annuals now for Christmas colour. For sunny spots plant alyssum, begonia, petunia, salvia and vinca. For shade plant impatiens

Enjoy your time in your garden in October.




