Beverley Health Advisory Group

At the last Council meeting, the Council was advised that the Local Health Advisory Group (LHAG) is urgently seeking new members for the Committee as current members are retiring. The original volunteers for this group are reaching a point where they feel they have little more to contribute. As a result, LHAG is seeking new members from among our community to serve on this very important committee as it is the community's opportunity to assist the Health Department and the recently appointed Health Service Manager, Zoe Lear.

The purpose of this group is summed up in the opening paragraphs of their Terms of Reference.

"The purpose of the Local Health Advisory Group (LHAG) is to provide a forum for:

- Ongoing communication and interaction between WACHS staff and community members;
- Development of workable solutions for local for local health service related issues;
- Provide ongoing information on Health Services to local consumers;
- Partnering with consumers to create a consumer Health System.

The Local Health Advisory Group will advise and support local health service providers in an environment of co-operation, shared understanding and consensus."

Vincent Street Streetscape Project

We have now reached the official completion date for the project and over the next twelve months we will be monitoring any issues arising which might require rectification by the contractor. Early indication shows that the project came in very close to budget despite being five months over the expected completion date. Management is to be congratulated for achieving this financial result especially given the pressures of availability of certain materials and increasing cost of product. We would also acknowledge the way the members of the MG Group team, led by Anthony Santella, worked so co-operatively with the community members throughout this very trying period.

The community should also take a bow given the street project was an open construction site with any number of hazards for eleven months and yet everyone took care to ensure their own safety.

It is also very fortunate that this project has now been finished rather than just starting, given the number of issues arising in the economy generally. The main funding programme upon which the Shire drew, Building Better Regions Funding, has now been abolished.

Local Government Reform.

The new minister for local Government, Minister John Carey, initiated a consultation programme soon after the last election where he began a revision of Local Government and reforms he wanted to see occur. The Shire made its submissions through WALGA and the Minister has now commenced issuing directives under which Local Governments must act.

An invitation will soon go out to the community for your feedback on some of these reforms. The main ones revolve around the size of the Council and the best method to achieve those changes. The other concerns Wards but Beverley abolished its three Wards in 2014.

Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.

Water Bomber Training

Water Bomber reloading training is being held at the Beverley Airfield starting at 9am on Sunday 6th November.

An Air Tractor 802 will land and a training session will be conducted on safely refilling the aircraft with water and foam retardant. The Water Bomber will then take off and do a demonstration drop over the Airfield.

Obviously existing BFB members are usually already busy on the fireground so you are encouraged to approach others who might not wish to directly fight fires but can assist in this vital support role.

Welcome to our 2022 AGM. Thank-you and welcome to David White who will step in to Chair the meeting for election of office bearers.

Since the last AGM we went into end of year mode and culminated in our Christmas party which we once again had at White Gum Farm. The restaurant was great and we again enjoyed their hospitality. We then covered up in the Museum and went into recess for the year.

2022 was started with cleanup and then Phil did the floors ready to start the year.

In February we had Kaitlyn Elsgood breeze into town and organise with the school to have an 'Historic Walk' around town with the school children. Various sites in Vincent Street and at the Museum were chosen for a quick history lesson before moving on to the next. Some of our members were involved in Vincent St and others at the Museum where Bruce Denny gave a colourful rendition of the "Hackett Murder". An interesting day had by all.

Covid became a bit of an issue again and we decided to stay closed for March whilst things settled down. Masks had to be worn and precautions adhered to.

We got going in April ready for Easter and a display at the Museum of past owners, lessees and licensees of the Museum building, from hotel to residence and finally our Museum.

In preparation for our 150th birthday of the building Morag organised new name tags for the members, which was very generously paid for by one of our more recent members, Diane Bax-Blechynden from Albany. Thanks to both Morag and Diane.

We received a shire grant this year for digitising our museum collection. Thanks to Di Smith and Morag for doing such a good job on the application and Di for purchasing the equipment after a lot of work went into getting the right equipment for our purposes. Di, Morag and Leonie were then instructed in the use of 'Mosaic' the programme eventually decided on. Thanks to all concerned and to the Shire of Beverley for this grant. Thanks also to Adam, started by Di who had us connected to the NBN to facilitate using the Mosaic Programme. Then along came Vida our newest member who has been putting some of our collection onto Mosaic. Thank-you Vida.

In June we had a visit to Mary Lea Cottage originally owned by Richard Bowyer Smith, now owned by Martin and Janet Eloury. Martin gave us a most interesting tour of their house and out buildings. He has some amazing furniture and knick knacks in every room. They then supplied us with a lovely afternoon tea. We had a terrific afternoon enjoyed by all.

Thanks to Glenys's persistence we had glass replaced in our entry room's cabinet. The new glass a stronger glass better for the purpose. This cabinet now has an Aboriginal display started, with a lovely football jumper donated by the Football Club and beautifully designed by the Henry and Ugle families.

Thanks to Morag once again for her research and members for helping with the Beverley show display. Thanks to Mark and Glenys for transporting the display to and from the Show grounds.

Then came our 150th Anniversary for the Museum building. Everyone rallied to dress and display Mannequins for the Museum and for the Hall display. Thank-you so much as this was part of the bigger 'Spring back to Beverley' weekend. I too had my part and enjoyed researching and displaying 'The Mayors, Chairs and Presidents' Wall of Fame in the Hall. As committee members for the Back to Beverley Glenys and I are very appreciative of the work done by all. But it was the wonderful atmosphere at the Museum on the Sunday to celebrate our 150th that was impressive. The food, the chat, the amount of people coming through for an all-day cuppa that was so wonderful. We had past owners, lessees and residents' family members, of the building invited and present on the day. Also past members of the Beverley Historical Society, were invited, and some were present. The Historical Society members should be proud of the display of food and their manning of the museum that impressed so many people visiting for the weekend. As a bonus, free entry and a cuppa, was rewarded with generous donations all weekend. It is also lovely to see the plaque unveiled by Sally-Ann Hasluck of the Royal WA Historical Society, by

As a result, and with a large number of travellers moving around the state instead of going out of state or overseas and the back to Beverley we have had larger than normal numbers through our door 288 being weekly numbers 119 from bus and caravan visitors and about 230 over the Back to Beverley weekend, making a total of 637 for the year Oct. 2021 to Oct. 2022.

Thank-you to Bill Whitney for auditing the books again this year for the Society.

I would like to thank everyone on a personal note for their help and appreciation especially this year of what I have endeavoured to do for the Society over the last 4 years as President. I have been pleased to help in some small way in an organisation that I enjoy and hope will continue to be a big part of a town that has had such a rich and interesting past. Cardiovascular Awareness -How's Your Pump and Pipes?

BY THE REGIONAL MEN'S HEALTH INITIATIVE November 2022

It's no surprise that when we combine disease associated with the *heart* (pump) and *blood vessels* (pipes) it's our biggest killer, largest health problem, and places a great burden on our economy and health system. This of course is without even considering the issues around grief, loss of function and care requirements that can also impact individuals and families.

Cardiovascular Disease (CVD) is a major cause of death in our country. It kills one Aussie every 12 minutes and is responsible for causing one in four (26%) of all deaths. Someone is hospitalised for CVD every minute and those living in regional and remote areas, generally have higher rates of death from CVD than other Australians (Heart Foundation Aust).

Why Pump and Pipes? If we think about a pump moving water through a series of pipes, over time sediment can slowly build up and slow the flow of water or even cause a blockage. Most blokes would understand this would result in the pump having to work harder which can cause it to eventually fail or blow a hose.



This is no different to coronary heart disease which occurs through the build-up of fatty deposits (plaque) in the arteries that feed the heart. Narrowing reduces the supply of blood and oxygen to our heart and if this becomes too narrow it can cause angina (pain/discomfort in chest) or if a blood clot causes a complete block, then this can cause a heart attack. This is similar to when a clot occurs in blood vessels to the brain causing a stroke.

Warning signs for a heart attack may include a single or a combination of symptoms such as pain, heaviness or tightness in one or more areas of the upper body, shortness of breath, dizziness or a cold sweat.

If you think someone's having a stroke the Stroke Foundation has come up with an easy to remember checklist referred to as **FAST**:

- · Face Has their mouth dropped?
- · Arm Can they lift both arms?
- · Speech Is it slurred, can they understand you?
- · Time Is critical, call 000 immediately.

Factors that contribute to CVD include family history (which we can't change) but some of the other risks we can manage by making healthy lifestyle choices are:

- · don't smoke;
- · maintain a healthy diet;
- do regular exercise;
- · reduce our alcohol intake (take a couple of days off a week);
- · monitor our body weight;
- · moderate our salt, sugar & fat intake; and
- · look after our mental health & wellbeing.

It's important we acknowledge that a lot of CVD is preventable, however it's essential that we understand our individual risk factors that may impact on us developing diseases associated with our heart and blood vessels. The onset of other health issues such as diabetes, obesity, even erectile dysfunction can be an indicator that our pump and pipes could be under pressure.

So, just remember like any good piece of machinery, there are some basic *Operating Tips* to keep things running at optimal performance!

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

- Lung cancer is the third most common cancer affecting both women and men in Western Australia.
- In 2017, 637 Western Australian men and 472 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:

- · A new cough or change to your usual cough
- Repeated chest infections
- Becoming more short of breath, tired or lacking energy
- Losing weight without trying
- · Pain in your chest or shoulder
- · Finding it hard to breathe or swallow
- Not feeling hungry.

If you have coughed up blood, even if it was just once, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer – often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Sid's message – 'Slip Slop Slap Seek and Slide' It's National Skin Cancer Action Week 21st – 27th November and with two in three Australians diagnosed with skin cancer by age 70, the action week is an important reminder to use sun protection and of the importance of early skin cancer detection for all Australians as we make our way into summer. It's important to use the five forms of sun protection:

Slip on sun-protective clothing,

Slop on SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen,

Slap on a broad-brimmed hat,

Seek shade.

Slide on sunglasses.

Bee swarms - creating a buzz

Why do bees swarm?

Swarming is a natural process for European honey bees (*Apis mellifera*) and forms part of their reproductive life cycle. Honey bee colonies are stimulated to increase their numbers in response to increasing day length, warmer weather and increased availability of nectar and pollen. As a beehive becomes overcrowded, the queen bee and hundreds of worker bees will leave the hive and go in search of a new home. This bee 'swarm' will often remain in the area for a short period before moving some distance and resettling as a tight cluster of bees. Bees then scout for an appropriate nest site, which the swarm will move to and inhabit.

The parent colony will have prepared for this division and raised multiple queen cells from which one will mate and establish as the new queen for the colony.

What do I do if I come across a bee swarm?

Don't panic! If the swarm is still flying, keep your distance. Once clustered, the swarm is usually placid and unlikely to show aggressive behaviour if left undisturbed. Avoid interfering with the swarm if

you're not experienced in its collection or destruction.

Report swarms of bees found near marine ports, airports or domestic freight terminals to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development. These will be screened for biosecurity concerns such as new (exotic) bee species, pests, and diseases.

If a bee swarm settles at your property and doesn't move on, you can arrange to have it removed by either contacting a swarm collector or licenced pest controller. The Western Australian Apiarists' Society (WAAS) lists swarm collectors on their website (waas.org.au/swarms), whilst other contacts can be advertised online, in community directories or newspapers, noticeboards or advertised on social media community groups.


Bee swarms located on public or private lands, or establishing in above or below-ground infrastructure (e.g. Telstra pits), should be reported directly to the respective land or infrastructure manager.


