Community Grants

Throughout 2022, I was privileged to attend functions at Beverley Offroad Motorsports Association (BORMSA) and Beverley Lawn Tennis Club, both of whom opened upgraded facilities and were successful recipients in the Shire Grants programme.

I would caution though, that the economic outlook for 2023 and some years beyond may require conservative planning in order not to overstretch our resources.

Annual Electors' Meeting

This meeting was held in the Cornerstone meeting room on Wednesday 7th December. I would like to thank all those who made the effort to attend. Twenty-five residents were present and there were many questions covering a range of issues. Of significance, I believe it is worth noting that after eleven years of construction of new infrastructure in the community at an approximate cost of \$16 million, the Shire is in a stronger financial position than it was at the commencement of the period.

Christmas Lights competition.

The competition for the best Christmas Lights was held again this year but notice for this might have been too short for many. The few who did enter had gone to a lot of trouble and thank you for your efforts. The winners this year were: East side – Rachel Lucas; West side – Carol Allen; and Best new entrant – Travis Boyle.

Elections 2023

Elections are due this year for positions on Council. Under the Local Government Reform process, the four positions that become vacant will reduce to three as the Shire ultimately move from nine Councillors currently to seven.

ANNUAL ELECTORS' MEETING - 7 DECEMBER 2022

Presidents Report

Good morning Ladies and Gentlemen and welcome to the Electors' meeting for 2022. I would firstly like to draw your attention to the fact that this meeting is being held at the time we would all expect it to be held. You will recall that the Electors' meetings for 2020 and 2021 were held in June 2021 and April 2022 respectively.

This occurred as a result of Local Governments being brought under the jurisdiction of the Office of Auditor General. This move caused serious delays in having our audit finalised thus the delaying these meetings. For the Financial Year ended 30 June 2022, the audit was concluded and the Annual Report signed off at the Council meeting in October this year. This is the timetable Council set for this process previously and it is hoped that it will continue.

Stephen Gollan has now been in the role of Chief Executive Officer since January 2012 and so I believe it is useful to reflect on some of the achievements over that time and consider what might lie before us. The future may not be as rosy as some pundits predict.

As I outlined in my report for the December Blarney, the Shire has completed some remarkable achievements over the past eleven years which have delivered benefits to the community.

1	The first of these would be the additions and renovations to the sporting complex at the oval including the construction of new netball courts (to which the Netball Club contributed significant funds). The playground also extended beyond its initial establishment.		
2	The construction of two Independent Living Units in Dawson Street.		
3	The construction of the Cornerstone Building which houses the Community Resource Centre, Visitor Centre, Library, Day Care Centre, and four leased offices.		
4	The installation of solar panels on both the Shire offices and the Cornerstone building.		
5.	The construction of the Moort Wabiny Park which incorporates numerous activities for our youth. I would also acknowledge that the impetus for this project was driven largely by people within the community.		
6	Reroofing the Town Hall and Lesser Hall and the replacement of the flooring in both halls.		
7	The complete renewal of the kitchen in the Lesser Hall.		
8	Installation of new entrance doors in each hall as well as the replacement of the Stage curtain in the Town Hall.		
9	The re-roofing of the Old School building.		
10	The re-roofing of the old Courthouse building and the establishment of a gymnasium within.		
11	Lighting for the airstrip to enable the Flying Doctor to evacuate injured and seriously ill patients 24 hours a day. Initiative for this was led by John Lane to whom we offer our thanks.		
12	The construction of six cottages near the caravan park comprising three two bedroom and three one-bedroom units. These have proven to be a greater success than was expected and the feedback from guests has been very positive.		
13	Water Harvesting Project led by the Community which has reduced reliance on scheme water and consequently saved the Shire money.		
14	Other projects include: footpath renewal and extension programme, solar panels on the Ram Shed for the Pool, and resealing the runway at the airstrip.		
15	The redevelopment of Vincent Street with the additions of Al-Fresco areas, more disabled parking, Wombat Crossings to assist pedestrians to safely cross the street from footpath to footpath, and garden beds and trees. Some of the most significant aspects of the development are below ground. Namely; the power and the renewal of the storm water drainage system which should help to alleviate any flooding of the street resulting from severe thunderstorms in the future. I would also like to highlight one aspect of which we should all be aware and that is the Wombat Crossings are not crosswalks, and pedestrians must give way to traffic at all times.		
In al	I, these projects, undertaken by the Shire over the past 11 years have cost a total of about \$16		

million. Funding has come from State and Federal Grants as well as Lotterywest and the RAC. Shire contributions have come from general revenue, Reserves and Loans.

I would also like to acknowledge the patience and resilience of the community throughout the Vincent Street redevelopment. It is a credit to the common sense and understanding of this community that having negotiated an open and live construction site with its innumerable hazards for a period of eleven months without any serious mishaps is a credit.

It would be remiss not to also acknowledge the workers with MG Group whose understanding and patience through this period assisted everyone. Of course, it goes without saying that this team was so ably led by Anthony Santella who came to know nearly everyone in Beverley.

GHD were the firm of architects and engineers who designed the project and oversaw the work. They were led by lan Pexton and our thanks go to him for his involvement and advice.

At all times the project was overseen by a Shire Project team which included the CEO Stephen Gollan, the Deputy CEO Simon Marshall, the Executive Officer Ali Lewis, the Manager of Planning and Development Services Stefan de Beer, and Project Officer Ashleigh Fleay. Of these it was Stefan who probably lost the most sleep as he worked daily with the project. Thanks to him for his considerable work.

Why did it take so long? A project that was planned to be completed by Easter this year hit hurdles from day one. The road was the biggest. Despite considerable drilling and testing of the road in situ, not all issues were revealed. What was anticipated to be straightforward levelling and bitumising, turned out be a complete rebuilding of the entire street. This added significantly to the time and was not helped by members of the team contracting Covid which meant all members of the team returning to Perth for the 14 days isolation period. Innumerable other issues arose both large and small which added to the delay.

We reached the Practical Completion date on 10th October. At this date, all parties signed off to the fact that all that was required to be done under the contract had been done and any issues resolved.

From this date, the Shire has a twelve-month period which is referred to as the Defects Liability Period. It means that the Shire has a period of twelve months to identify any defects that may reveal themselves for which the contractors are required to make good.

It also means that the Shire is not able to make any changes in the street during this period without the express acknowledgement of the contractor. To do so would potentially risk the Shire's ability to claim on defects that might be identified.

Western Australian Heritage Awards

As part of the Vincent Street redevelopment, investigation went into establishing an Heritage Trail along Vincent Street to highlight the various heritage buildings. This project was nominated for the Western Australian Heritage Awards for 2022. There are seven categories in these awards and the Beverley nomination came under the 'Heritage Tourism Project' category.

To become a finalist in these awards is an achievement in itself as there are quite a number of nominations from which the finalists are selected. We were pleased to learn that we were one of the three finalists in our category.

On Friday 25th November I attended the presentation of awards with Stefan de Beer, Manager of Planning and Development Services, and Ashleigh Fleay, Project Officer, at the WA Museum. We were delighted when the Beverley project was announced the winner.

It was a privilege to be able to accept this award on behalf of the Shire and community, and heartening to have positive feedback from the judges who considered this project of an outstanding quality.

I would like to acknowledge the work of Stefan, Ashleigh, and Jacinta Murray the Tourism Officer in this project. And thank you to the Beverley Historical Society who were able to provide information for the project.

Future Projects

There are now other projects contemplated by the Shire for which some planning has been done.

The first of these is the swimming pool complex. New pumphouse, filtration system, wet deck and disabled access are just some of the changes planned. A new wet area for the children with shallow pools as well as overhead water features. New change rooms with hot showers and a new kiosk are just some more of the features.

The current bowl is over 60 years old and while it has undergone inspection and resealing recently it is certain that it will not last for another 60 years.

So, with that in mind, a plan has been developed to carry the envisaged changes and costed in 2019 at \$6 million. In anticipation of applying for a grant under the Commonwealth Building Better Regions Fund scheme, the cost of the project was again assessed in 2021 and came in at \$11.6 million. It is hard to

imagine that it has not increased further since then. More importantly, the Building Better Regions Fund scheme has now been abolished by the Commonwealth Government.

A concept plan has been developed and put to the community for the beautification in the Avon River Park and potential work on the Pool adjacent to the Park. A fully costed plan is yet to be developed for this project but is dependent upon grant funding from whatever source that can be identified.

The Museum at Avondale is currently being reviewed by the Shire as to the possibility of moving the collection closer to the town. Located where it is means it does not get the visitor numbers it deserves. Whether the whole collection could be moved is dependent upon finding a location of considerable size. Alternatively, moving parts of the collection to a smaller location is under consideration but this has its own problems. I would like to acknowledge and thank the few volunteers who diligently attend to the maintenance of the collection and assist with opening up for visitors.

The Shire is currently negotiating with the Health Department for the transfer of the old Nurses' Quarters and the land upon which they are located. Plans for this building have yet to be developed but a condition of the transfer is that the plans must be to do with health.

Another potential project is housing for accommodation for nurses and associated health professionals. Health Department personnel recently met with the Shire to discuss the plan for the Shire to build accommodation units whether houses or units which would then be leased to the Department for a reasonable period of time. Such a project would provide a cost benefit to the Shire and community.

The old school building adjacent to the Shire offices has been under consideration for redevelopment for some time. It is planned to convert it to a formal Civic Centre in which the Council Chambers will be relocated. Plans for this are currently being finalised and again the execution will depend upon grant funding.

A project that does require attention are the bridges within Shire boundaries. Considerable funding is required for these bridges and the Shire is largely dependent upon Main Roads.

Local Government Reform

The current Minister for Local Government, the Honourable John Carey, wasted no time when he was appointed to his Ministerial role in commencing a review of Local Government. Consultation was widespread and the Shire of Beverley provided submissions.

Reforms have been announced and are being implemented over a period of time. Among the main ones affecting Beverley are the reduction in the number of Councillors, wards, optional preferential voting, and the recording of meetings.

In terms of the number of Councillors, the Shire is required to reduce the number from the present nine to seven. Options were given to achieve this and the Council has presently decided to do so over two election cycles. In 2023 there will be four positions reduced to three. This will give eight Councillors until 2025 when five positions will reduce to four.

Importantly, community members have the opportunity to comment via a submission paper available from the Shire office. This paper has been available for some time and if you wish to make a submission, it must be completed by 4:00pm today.

Strategic Community Plan.

This plan is required to undergo a complete revision next year and while the Council and Management will be developing the Plan it will only be completed after considerable community consultation. Other plans will then fall out from this one but I would urge all interested members of the community to participate in the consultation when the time comes. Without this input, Council can only guess what the community might be thinking.

Outlook.

While it's not possible to fully anticipate what might be coming in the future, I suspect 2023 may be a year of some difficulty. Economically, there are many views across the spectrum, not just for Australia but for the World. My conservative nature inclines me to a cautionary position. As the Shire has now achieved so much with development, it is probably a time to view any expenditure with considerable care.

Conclusion.

In conclusion, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Councillors who have put in a significant effort this year and given me great support. Thanks also to all the staff at the Shire for their efforts this year and to Stephen Gollan who provides exemplary leadership and who is always willing to meet with community members who may have concerns. Finally, to the community for your support during the Vincent Street Project which we know was very trying for everyone. Your patience and endurance is a credit to all.

Recipes to Try



Homemade Ice-Cream Sandwich

Ingredients

- 1 x 395g Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 600ml Thickened Cream
- 2 x 200g Packets Malt O Milk biscuits
- 2 x 50g Violet Crumble Chocolate Bars

Method

- Pour condensed milk and whipping cream into a bowl and whip until thickened.
 This can take up to 20 minutes.
- 2. Lightly hit the Violet Crumble in the packet until crushed.
- 3. Open packets and pour Violet Crumble into the whipped mixture and stir in until just combined.
- 4. Line a dish with Malt Biscuits in one even layer. Pour mixture over the top and even out. Add another layer of Malt Biscuits to the top and freeze.
- 5. Once frozen, cut into biscuit-sized portions and serve.

Notes

- 1. Feel free to change up the chocolate option - good substitutes include: Malteasers, Crunchies, Areo Mint,
- 2. Feel free to change up the biscuit tops & bottoms as well.

Roast Pumpkin Salad with Feta, Pine Nuts & Baby Spinach Salad

Ingredients

For the salad

- 600 g pumpkin skin removed and cut into slices or chunks
- · 2 tbs olive oil
- · salt and pepper to season
- 75 g pine nuts
- 150 g baby spinach leaves
- 80 g feta crumbled into small chunks

For the dressing

- 1 tbs honey
- 2 tbs balsamic vinegar
- · 2 tbs olive oil
- salt and pepper to season

Method

- Preheat oven to 200 degrees celsius (fanforced).
- 2. Chop the pumpkin into small slices or chunks and remove the skin.
- 3. Drizzle a flat baking tray with the olive oil, add the pumpkin pieces and season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Cook for 20-25 minutes or until the pumpkin is tender (but not too soft). Set aside.
- 5. Place the pine nuts into a small frying pan over low/medium heat. Cook, while stirring regularly, until lightly golden (keep a close eye on them as they can easily burn). Set aside.
- 6. Layer the baby spinach, pumpkin, pine nuts and feta cheese in a serving bowl or dish.
- 7. To make the dressing, place the honey, balsamic vinegar, olive oil, salt and pepper into a small bowl and whisk with the fork until combined.
- 8. Pour the dressing over the salad, toss to combine and serve immediately.



Be skin aware this summer

Cancer Council WA is encouraging adults in the Wheatbelt region to familiarise themselves with the common symptoms of skin cancer, with the majority (55-70%) of melanomas detected by themselves or their partners.

It is important to know your skin and what is normal for you, particularly if you are over 40 years of age. Skin cancers (including melanoma) accounts for the largest number of cancers diagnosed in Australia each year. Our latest data reveals that in 2019, 1587 people in WA were diagnosed with melanoma and sadly 145 people died from it. In the Wheatbelt region in 2019, 58 people were diagnosed with melanoma and 5 died from it.

We know people living in regional Australia have lower rates of five-year survival, compared with people living in cities, so we urge anyone in the Wheatbelt experiencing a skin cancer symptom to visit their doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker.

Common symptoms of skin cancer include:

- A new spot or mole on your skin
- A spot that is different from other spots on your skin
- Any crusty or non-healing sores
- Any spots, freckles or any moles changing in size (width), thickness (height), colour, or shape over a period of weeks to months.

It doesn't mean you've got skin cancer – often it turns out to be something less serious. But it is important to get checked. Getting our symptoms checked out and treated early means we can get back to the people we love and the things we love doing.

Beverley Ag Museum

Our membership is made up of like-minded people who volunteer their time at the Beverley Agricultural Museum located at Avondale Farm in Waterhatch Road, not only do we 'open up' the vast collection of mainly Wheatbelt Farming machinery to the public, --- with examples covering over 150 years --- we also restore and run many of the still operating items. The collection and our efforts are supported financially by the Beverley Shire Council allowing us to share an important part of our farming history with the general public for free. Please come along in the New Year and enjoy these new facilities. See you at the Club.







BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents "Olden Days" by Y2 BDHS Dead Finish Museum - Year Two Stories, 2022

The annual "hands on" experiences from times past are told in the Beverley school students' own words (no editing):



Alec: We were doing the washing first. We had to scrub the cloth. Then we squeezed the cloth, that was called a bell. The next thing was to put in in the blue and bell it. Then we put it in the water then bell it again! Finally we hanged it up. [Editor's note: bell = wring]. Second we were polishing the silver. First we got a toothbrush. Next we used a special material. Finally, we polished some plates or spoons with the toothbrush. Third we dressed up in olden day clothes. Forth we went to the olden day school. They had to use a nib pen to write with. Fifth we went around the building. We went to the fence and the printing press. Last of all we had morning tea and got a surprise and don't forget ANZAC biscuits!

Aton: We went to we polished the plates then I dressed up in some olden day clothes. We went to the old school room. I used the nib pen. We had a tour around the building. Finally, we had morning tea, we had ANZACS biscuits. We also got a penny and lollies.

Aurora: Fist I was washing clothes and hanging them up. I was on my 3rd round of washing of clothes. I was having fun. Then I was polishing spoons, forks, teapots and some knives. I was having so much fun today. After that I dressed up as a princess and a queen. I was so happy about today. Fourth we write with a nib pen on a lined piece of paper. We had to copy from the board. Next we had a walk around the building. I was in the fourth row of the line. It was really good fun. Finally, it was morning tea. We had a drink and an ANZAC biscuit we also got a penny and after we all went to the toilet.

Ava: The Dead Finish Museum is a bit cool but it is cold. Sometimes it is hot. I tried on the clothes. Then I went to the old school room and wrote with a nib pen. Next I walked around the building on a tour. I saw an old fence and a printing press. I did some washing as used old pegs. I saw the old teachers room. It was very small. Finally, we ate special food. There were cookies fairy bread and drinks. We all got a coin.

Charlotte: First we did the washing and peg it on the line so it can dry. Then we went to the next room and polished silver. We also went outside to the shed. We dressed up in olden day clothes. Then we went to the old school. We wrote with a nib pen and ink. After that we had some food. We loved it.



Cooper: First I went to the washing and we put the clothes in the water and put soap on the clothes. Then we put them in the blue water and dried the clothes. Then we polished the silver and that as hard work. After that we dressed up in olden day clothes and there were some funny clothes.

Darcy: First we learned how to do the washing. We rubbed the soap into the clothing. Then we put it in the normal water to rinse the blue water then we wrung it and hung it on the line. We polish the silver, so the metal is clean. We dressed up in olden day's clothes. The clothes that we wore were very different then there were tassel skirts and fancy dresses. We went into the old school room and wrote with a nib pen. We wrote about the Dead Finish Museum we use an ink well to write. On our tour around the building. We saw a sun dial told the time. We saw a pen for animals. We had ANZAC biscuits and fairy bread. We also got a special penny mine was the oldest.

Felicity: When we did washing we got a bar of soap and scrub it. Then put it in blue water ad squeeze it and put it on the line. Polishing the silver: You had to get a toothbrush or a cloth and scrub it with silvo until it was nice and clean. Dress up in Olden Days Clothes: We had some fun with clothes. There were some funny styles. There were dresses and men's clothes but mixed together. Olden Day School: It was hard in the olden days at school if you got whipped with a cane. I learnt if there was a naughty boy, they would dip the girls' long hair in the ink. Tour Around the Building: We got to have a tour around the outside of the building.

Max: First we were washing the clothes. Next we polished the silver. Then we had a tour around the building. I saw a nut, a nut tree and a wooden fence made from branches. Finally we had morning tea. We had cordial, fairy bread and ANZAC biscuits. We also got a penny and a bag of lollies. My favourite part was when I got an ANZAC biscuit.

Nadine: First we washed clothes and hung the clothes on the line. After that we went to polish the silver made the stuff shine. We had a lot of fun. When we finished the silver, we went to dress up in olden day clothes. I had a wig on and a dress but the boys and a tie and a jumper jackets. Then we went we to the old school. There was a nib pen. We saw a whip, it was called a cane, and a strap in the class. We went around the building. We saw an old fence and a printing press. Finally, we had morning tea. We had ANZAC biscuits and we had fairy bread At the end we had cordial, and got some lollies and a penny.



Peg: We did washing and we used some soap. We had to peg the washing up on the line. At night men would make the pegs by hand. We had to polish the silver so it would be clean, but the polish was very smelly. We still had to do it any way. Also we got to dress up and it was really fun. I put on gloves, I put a tutu on, a men's coat and a wig. We went to a school room from

the olden days. We had to write. I nearly got a whack from the cane. Next we went around the building. We saw an old printing press. Then we saw an olden day wood fence. Finally, we had morning tea we had ANZAC biscuits and some fairy bread. It was fun.



Steele: First I went to the dressing up. I dressed in olden day clothes. The I went to the olden day school and wrote with an ink pen. Next I went to the dining table and the went to the kitchen. Then I went to the washing and I did the polish the silver. Then I got a tour around the building. We went to the baby room The I went to the shadow clock, the olden day wooden fence and the printing press. Then we went to the pub part and I looked in the underground room and saw a dummy. Finally, I got a surprise, some cordial and finally I got an ANZAC biscuit, an old coin and some lollies.

Tate: The washing was quite hard because you had to wash it yourself! You still had to hang it out on your own. I accidently dropped the clothes I was washing. Polishing the silver was so fun, still it was really, really hard to do. I actually want to do it again. This was the fun point of the excursion the dressing up! Peg, Felicity and Steele looked really crazy. I also looked quite crazy! The schoolwork was double hard to do. It was hard to do because we weren't using led pencil's we used nib pens. There was a cane and a strap. We finally had a tour. There was a printing press, the pub and the old teacher's room. After the tour we had a snack, everyone had a drink (except me and Alex) and ANZAC biscuits. Plus, an excursion isn't fun without a present. We got a penny and lollies.

Thank you to volunteers from the Beverley Historical Society and to four special community volunteers who assisted with the preparation, the activity stations, the tour, the refreshments and the clearing up afterwards.


