Avon Park Vandalism

Sadly, we lead off 2023 with a report of significant vandalism to the toilets located at Avon Park. The internal doors were kicked off their hinges and destroyed as well as other damage to internal fittings. Damage estimated to be about \$1,000. Whether it was the same people, but three panels of the fence at the skate Park adjacent to Elders were also damaged by being kicked.

Vincent Street damage.

Damage was also caused to the garden bed on the corner of Vincent Street and Dawson Street by a road train which had no right to be in this location in the first place. Of more concern is the apparent disregard some have for the infrastructure in Vincent Street generally. Having invested some \$5 million in this project it is hoped more respect would be shown as there are many in the community who are proud of that which has been achieved.

Beverley Soaring Society

The Beverley Soaring Society hosted the State Gliding Championships in the week beginning Saturday 21st January. Twenty-eight gliders participated.

I was invited to open the new Training facilities as well as the new Workshop and Maintenance facilities that have recently been constructed. These facilities have enhanced the operations of the Society with the ability to cater for many more participants. The Workshop and Maintenance facilities have added significantly to the Society as it now means that gliders do not have to travel to South Australia for regular servicing.

From their website: *"Beverley Soaring Society leads the world in many aspects including advanced pilot training programmes, instruction into glider maintenance and we cover all aspects of glider operations.*

Beverley Soaring Society leads the world in cross country flying in which we are usually on top of the OLC flying competition for at least a month or two every year and certainly recognised as one of the leading cross country gliding club in Australia.

With these two facilities I believe it places Beverley Soaring Society as one of the foremost active and modern gliding clubs in Australia and heralds a very bright future for the club and its members."

Australia Day

Jennie Elizabeth Webb – Migrant Farm Worker

Transcript of a copy of a handwritten document provided by Doug Webb to Beverley Historical Society, Sept 2022

“My Story”

In 1912 my husband and I with a little daughter of three years, came to Australia (as assisted migrants) to work on a farm as a married couple. We were full of hopes until reaching our destination. The farm had been sadly neglected. There were no beds for us to sleep on and hardly any provisions in the place. We had to cut saplings from the bush, nail wheat bags into them, with chaff for mattresses. Those were our beds for eleven months. My husband had to walk behind the plough and harrows until his feet were raw, then I tried my hand. At first, I was scared of the horses they seemed so big and I was very short and slim. Eventually the horses became quiet and we began to settle down. For all our labour our combined wages were thirty shillings per week. We decided to try and remain until we gained more experience, leaving for a better position after eleven months.

Quite a few funny incidents came our way owing to our inexperience. Taking meals to the men at a camp about one and a half miles away I got bushed, which was not funny. I grew scared when it began to get dark. The men lit a fire to guide me to the camp. I had been following the sheep's track. Needless to say, I never made the same mistake again.

As stated previously stores were very short, including tobacco. My Hubby smoked a pipe & plug tobacco, none being available, he was most unhappy until he hit upon a plan. The mail had to be collected once a week from a box on a tree about three miles away. As there was only one pony which the Boss was using, we decided to walk and meet the mailman. Before setting off my hubby armed himself with the biggest pipe that he had. After a fairly long wait the mailman arrived. The two men chatted for a few minutes then hubby asked him could he spare a pipe of tobacco as he came away without any, at the same time producing the oversize pipe. Where upon the mailman said “Sorry old chum I don't smoke” and drove off. Seeing the look on my hubby's face I just burst out laughing and said “a six mile walk for nothing”. Oh, was he angry. To calm him down I decided when we reached camp to saddle the old draught mare and ride over to a neighbour (three miles away) to try my luck. They gladly obliged and I went on my way again, the old mare could be heard clip clopping along. When I handed hubby the tobacco, it was as if I had handed him a fortune. I have since learnt what it means to a smoker to have nothing to smoke. The old mare that I rode only had one eye and would persist in pulling the one way which made the going hard, as the track was very rough, but the effort I made was worth it to see hubby happy again.

After being at the farm several months we asked permission to go to the store (about 30 miles away) to purchase a few articles for ourselves. We were given the old mare and a tip dray for the journey so our progress was very slow. Our Boss asked us to deliver a box of empty bottles to the Monks Mission which was halfway to the store. The mission made wine to sell to farmers. We were invited in & offered a drink of wine; they assured us it was nonintoxicating, so not wishing to offend, we drank the wine. On our journey once more, we had not gone very far before we had to stop as both of us were feeling very sick, the rocking of the old dray did nothing to improve matters. Eventually we reached the store which consisted of one tiny shop selling everything from a needle to a haystack. As we were the only “pommies” around that part we were gazed upon by all and sundry, even when sitting under a tree to eat our lunch we were followed by them. The return journey seemed endless, but I can assure you the mission was given a very wide berth by us, also it was the only trip to the store during the remainder of our stay in that district.

To conclude my story, I will tell you of an incident that gave my husband a good laugh over me. Four prize rams had been put into the house paddocks for a few hours. We were given instructions to put them back in their usual paddock, but try as we would they just would not

budge. We decided to bring the dog on a lead to get them started, they were soon on their way. Left hanging on the gate post was a small coil of fencing wire, and one ram decided to jump thro it, but he only went thro one strand and kept pulling until he looked as if he would be cut in half, as the wire was in the centre of his body. Hubby grabbed the wire cutters, gave me orders to hold him firmly by the horns which I did by standing in front of him. The wire was soon cut and away went the ram in mad rush, I went into the air and rolled over several times with the force of the impact. I thought hubby would never stop laughing. He said "Gee Mum you did look funny sailing thro the air".

At the end of eleven months, we had learnt quite a bit about farming
- being 'pommies' we had to learn the hard way.

Born September 1889, died 25th July 1981 Inglewood, aged 92 years.

The Webb Family in Beverley

Following this extraordinary early 20th century introduction to rural life in Western Australia, Jennie & her husband, George with children Eva & Cyril moved to the York area where George worked for Mr Marwick at Yangedine Farm for a few years, before returning to his boot-making trade in York.

Then in the 1920s they leased the farm by the river at the end of Caudle Rd, Beverley from Harry Eyre. T. G Walker, Government Land Agent, had bought the land in 1899 & built the house that he named "Glen Avon". Walker sold to Harry Eyre in 1923.

Eventually George Webb opened a bootmaker shop in Central Buildings, Beverley. In 1929 a fire in the shop caused serious loss. With the help of insurance, he opened again in conjunction with Steve Edwards, who opened Men's Clothing on the other side of the shop.

The Webb family lived in Dawson St, then built their own place in Hunt Rd. In 1931 George invested in Chinchilla rabbits, as the pelts were much in demand by city furriers. George died in 1944 aged 58 years.

Their daughter Eva married a Mr Pritchard and resided at Chandler, WA.

Their son Cyril trained as a technician with the PMG before enlisting in WW2 in Signals, reaching the rank of sergeant. Cyril married Mavis Stokes in 1943 & after the war returned to the PMG. On a visit to Beverley to see his mother, Jennie, Cyril was offered a job as manager of the Co-op (now IGA). He stayed there for 5 years before opening his own Radio & Electrical business in Vincent St. Cyril & Mavis had a daughter Carole and twin sons, Ken & Doug. Carole was an entrant in the Miss Australia Quest of 1965 and the two boys went on to train as Telecom technicians.

Mavis & Cyril sold the business to B.S. & M.P. Ford in 1966 and moved to Woodlands.

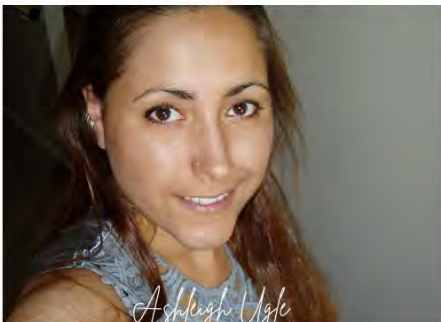

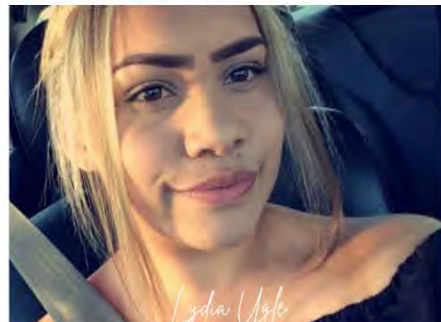

TREE & GARDEN SOCIETY

Beverley Garden & Tree Society

2022 has slipped past and we now face the hottest weather. I hope that you are managing to save your garden with plenty of mulch, water and shade. The garden club is taking a break until March when we have the next meeting on the 7th of March at Gracie Courtney's home at 10.30am.

We will meet at the Dead Finish at 10.15am for those who don't know the way. Please bring a chair and cup/mug. All welcome.

Gardening during February is an exciting time as you can start to plan your autumn and winter garden.

Vegetables to plant in February include: lettuce, broccoli, Brussels sprout, cabbage, cauliflower, peas, radish, shallot and silverbeet.

Flowers to plant in February include: begonia, cornflower, pansy, salvia, statice, stock, sweet pea, verbena and hollyhock.

February is a great time to attend to the following tasks in your garden:

- ☆ Pots can dry out quickly in summer as potting mix becomes hydrophobic. Apply wetting agent so water gets into the soil rather than running down the sides of the pot
- ☆ Freshen up indoor and undercover potted plants by wiping dusty leaves with a damp cloth or taking them outside when it is raining
- ☆ Check your veggie and herb garden daily for grubs and caterpillars and pick them off to keep them under control
- ☆ Cut back Callistemon and Hakea by a third to promote healthy, compact growth
- ☆ Prune Banksia and Grevillea lightly to shape after flowering. Remove all dead, weak or rubbing branches
- ☆ Pull off any suckering growth from below the graft on roses
- ☆ Lightly trim Bougainvillea after flowering to encourage more blooms
- ☆ Pot plants can dry out quickly in the hot wind. Moved exposed pots to more sheltered locations
- ☆ Tip prune Passionfruit regularly to promote lateral growth on which fruit will form
- ☆ If branches on variegated species revert to plain green, always cut these out or they can start to take over the plant
- ☆ Include daisies in and around your veggie garden to attract beneficial insects for pollination
- ☆ Water camellias deeply in dry times to reduce bud drop
- ☆ Prune hydrangeas back to 2 or 3 buds as blooms finish
- ☆ Prune flowering gums 20 – 30cm behind spent flowers for more flowers next year
- ☆ Cut canna lily spent flower stems to ground level

Enjoy being out in your garden during February and start thinking about which bulbs you wish to plant for your spring display this year.

On Thursday 5th January 2023, the Beverley police along with York Police, Wheatbelt detectives, Northam Police and Northam forensics executed a drug search warrant at Kokeby.

Artists-in-Residence for the month of February:



AiR from February 1 – 15 is Mutsuko Bonnardeaux

Mutsuko calls her art form *kumi-e* which merges a Japanese hand torn paper technique, *chigiri-e*, with her experiences with batik (Indonesia), silkscreen printing, stained glass, weaving and ceramics (Japan, Belgium and Australia) to create three dimensional effects in her images. In her *kumi-e*, Mutsuko excels at fusing craft with art. Concentrating on expression and feeling rather than adhering to a grammar learnt in a traditional art school, she expresses her views in an accessible language. Her *kumi-e* immediately strikes a responsive chord in viewers who value harmony. After a long experience with wildflowers and landscapes, Mutsuko embraced Perth's multicultural environment and started to produce images depicting its vibrant life, as well as abstract images. In 2015, Mutsuko spent 4 months as artist-in-residence in a small village in Auvergne, France. There, she discovered a new source of inspiration which brought forth a new style of images featuring buildings, streets and meeting places. Carried

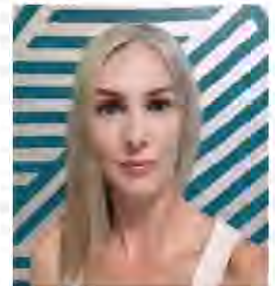
by her inspiration, she then returned to Auvergne in 2016 for 2 months to work on a picture book.

Mutsuko's artworks have been exhibited in solo and group shows in WA, SA, NT, VIC, and NSW. Her exhibitions have been exhibited abroad in Tokyo, Hamamatsu, San Francisco, Brussels, Paris, Siena (Italy) and New Zealand. She has been awarded various prizes and has been invited as an artist-in-residence by institutions in Mt. Cook (New Zealand), Uluru (NT) Adelaide, Broome, Perth and France.

In 2020 Museum of WA commissioned her to make an image of WA wild flowers which is displayed permanently at "Boola Bardic".

the 26 screens with carpet. It was a huge job and these two men cannot be thanked enough.



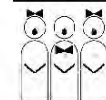

New wasp season in full swing!



European wasp shown on drinks, grapes, bacon and BBQ meats.

The annual hunt to detect and eradicate European wasps (*Vespula germanica*) from WA is underway!

Guard your BBQs, monitor your pet's food and check the insects you scoop from the pool! European wasps, we are looking for you!

The European wasp is a declared pest and must be reported. It has threatened to establish in WA since six nests were found and destroyed near Fremantle in 1977, but thanks to ongoing collaborative surveillance between the Department, community, local governments and business, WA has prevented their permanent establishment and spread.

Widely established across most of southern Australia, these highly adaptive scavengers hitchhike their way across the border and into WA each year. This season is the 45th year spent competing in a sophisticated game of 'hide and seek' against this highly adaptable and destructive pest.

Most detections are made in the Perth Metro but following regional detections in the past year DPIRD

has set up surveillance traps in Geraldton, Dumbleyung, Goomalling, Bunbury, Albany, and Eucla this year. If you live in any of these locations and would like to join the community team by adopting a surveillance trap, please search "European wasp Adopt-a-trap" online to sign up or give us a call.

Know what to look for

Unlike the widespread and similar looking black and yellow paper wasp, European wasps:

- Scavenge on human and pet food.
- Feed on fruit like grapes and stone fruit.
- Nest underground - nests can grow to the size of a basketball in a single season and have a single (golf ball sized) entrance hole.
- Have completely black antennae.
- Do NOT dangle their legs when flying.

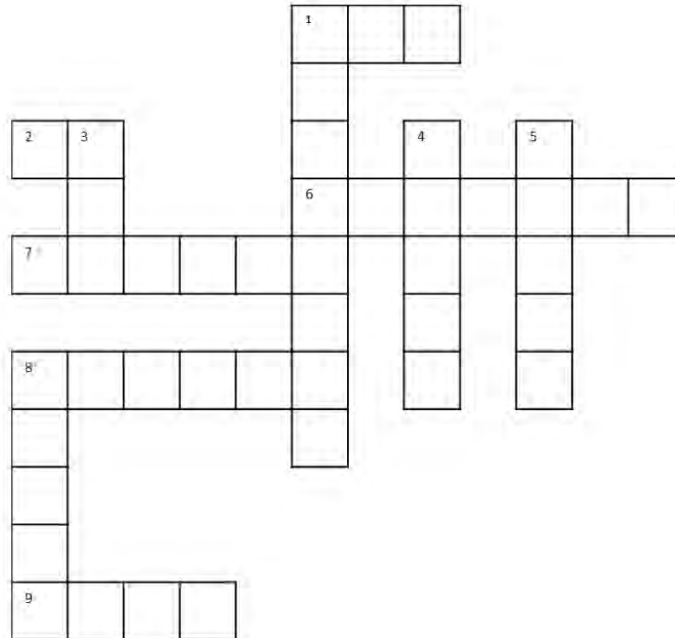

Self-Worth vs Self-Esteem

Self-worth and self-esteem are often confused as being the same, however they are very different. Self-esteem is about measuring ourselves based on external actions, while self-worth is about valuing our inherent worth as a person. In other words, self-worth is about who we are, not about what we do.



Society pushes for the need to have a high self-esteem but the problem with this is that we are always valuing ourselves against others. The competitive nature of men tells us we need to be better and above average to feel good about ourselves (keeping up appearances). When we look at this way of building our self-esteem it can be a losing battle because there will always be someone more handsome, slimmer, richer, owns bigger and better equipment and so on.

Self-esteem is transient and can change in an instant depending on what happens, for example we may be feeling good about a new piece of machinery or the quality of our stud and then someone makes a negative comment and our self-esteem falters, and we feel completely crushed. That's how fragile our self-esteem can be because it can also be fixed by a compliment that bolsters us again. Much anxiety can be created in striving for acceptance or approval and maintaining our ego or pride.

Probably the best way to understand self-worth is to ask ourselves how valuable we are, or how much do we deserve to have something we prize. It is a deep knowing that we are of value, that we are loveable and necessary to this life.

One may feel a high self-esteem because they are good at something, yet still not feel they are loveable and worthy. When we have a healthy self-worth (at the very core of ourselves) we have a deep knowing that we are fundamentally a valuable and worthwhile person regardless of:


- what others may say or do to us;
- what our successes or failures are;
- what we win or lose;
- what we have or don't have.


The concept of self-worth is about knowing that we are always going to be worth more than all of our achievements put together. It is a good thing to think and feel good about ourselves but what happens when our self-esteem is crushed, does that mean we are no longer valuable? Absolutely not, however many people do think that they are no longer valuable.

Self-worth and self-esteem are vital beliefs for empowering oneself. A valid sense of self-worth is necessary to attain love and a sound mind. A valid sense of self-worth acts as a buffer against the possibility of depression and a feeling of worthlessness that can lead to despair or possible suicidal behaviour. Situational distress can come from many areas in our lives, as issues around these life events develop, we need to value our self-worth more than ever to reduce uncertainty for ourselves.
