SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Strategic Community Plan.

Just a reminder that the process for developing the new Strategic Community Plan began on Wednesday 26th April with Council engaging Mrs. Caroline Robinson to begin the process. Community engagement will be held on the following date: *Thursday 8th June @ 6:00 pm in the meeting room at Cornerstone*, but please check with the Shire website, Facebook, and electronic notice board outside the Cornerstone.

Western Power's proposed increase in street lighting costs.

Western Power recently applied to the Economic Regulation Authority (ERA) to increase costs for street lighting by 43.85%. The annual cost for Beverley street lighting at present is approximately **\$27,000.** Such an increase would cause Beverley's annual account rise to about **\$39,000** or equivalent to a rate increase of 0.36%. Fortunately, the ERA has listened to representation on this matter and declined to approve the request from Western Power and have instead approved an increase of 7.5%. I highlight this to alert the community to the increases in costs faced as the Budget for 2023/24 is being developed.

Storm Damage to roads.

Since the storms that caused such widespread damage, an application was submitted to have the event receive an 'Emergency Declaration' to enable access to emergency funding to remediate the damage. We are still awaiting this declaration to gain access to the necessary funding.

Given the very serious nature of the damage, the Shire has decided that it's not reasonable to await the Declaration and has moved to carry out the necessary repairs. The damage was such that left unattended, there was a high risk to the travelling public. This does not mean we will forfeit the right to funding; it just means the funding will be received at a later date.

Local Government Reform - Elections.

Local Government reforms through new legislation are being introduced and particularly, the new voting process. Whereas our community has been used to 'first-past-the-post', the Minister has introduced optional preferential voting. We are unclear what this actually means other than perhaps providing political parties the opportunity to bring their influence into Local Government?

At the time of writing this Report, a webinar with the Western Australian Electoral Commission is scheduled for Thursday 25th May at which time clarification will be sought as to the manner in which the new process will work.

<u>Banner Poles.</u>

The banner poles that were in place briefly in Vincent Street, will now have a new life. They have now been received after some repairs and are currently being painted. When completed they will be located in the following sites. Beverley Station Arts, RV Park, Dead Finish Museum, and the Community Garden.

New Federal Government Funding Scheme.

The Commonwealth Government have recently announced a new funding scheme to replace the Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF), closed by them after the last election. The Scheme known as Growing Regions, enables Local Governments to apply for funding of up to 50% of the cost of the project. As a result, the Shire is looking again at how this might be applied to the Swimming Pool redevelopment. It is envisaged the project might be able to be split into two stages. Stage 1 would include an upgrade to the plant room, filtration system, main bowl access, children's pools, and concourse renewal.





Eliza Greene

Eliza Greene is a pro surfer who grew up in Australia's Southwest. The funny thing is, Eliza used to hate surfing! It wasn't until her first surfing competition as a nine-year-old, that really got her into the sport. Eliza has competed all around the world in many surfing championships. She broke the stereotypical surfing image, which is a girl with blonde hair and a thin body. Eliza hasn't won any major titles, but she is slowly working her way to the top. Eliza has talent and she works hard to preserve it.

Have you ever heard of the company GRNSTR? Well, if not, this company was created by Eliza Greene; competitive pro surfer. The idea for her company appeared strangely during the time of COVID, when Eliza was 18, and she couldn't travel to compete in surfing competitions. With all this free time, she began to design women's wetsuits, knowing that the sizes only went up to XL, while the men's varied up to 4XL. This was extremely unfair, so Eliza turned into the first person to sell women's wetsuits up to size 18. With work put in by Eliza and her sister, GRNSTR was born. The designs on the wetsuits are vibrant and recycled, produced by Eliza herself. Her business has gone from a couple of orders, to being stocked in shops Australia wide.

Eliza Greene has achieved lots in her life so far. From becoming a pro-surfer, to an entrepreneur. These things don't happen easily. She has had lots of hurdles to jump and hard work to complete. One of her quotes was, "Hard work will always beat talent." You may be good at things, but that doesn't mean you don't need to work for them. Eliza Greene is the exact definition of that.

Matthew Pavlich

During his career he suffered six concussions, 30 stitches and travelled over 850,000km. We were lucky enough to listen to him at the Halogen Leadership Conference. Matthew spoke about perseverance and told the audience, "You don't lose, you learn". I think this is a valuable life lesson because it can apply to so many aspects of life. For example, if you were doing a quiz and you got a few questions incorrect then you can learn from your mistakes and come back peyt time and bonefully get a



mistakes and come back next time and hopefully get a few more right.

In Matthew's first training session for Freo, he pushed himself so hard that he actually fainted and had to go to hospital, but he didn't lose, he learnt to know his limits and gradually improve them. Matthew also spoke about having purposes in life that aren't football. For example, while he played for the Fremantle Dockers he also went to university.

James Foley

James Foley is an Aussie author and illustrator. He grew up in this very state down by East Fremantle. Mr Foley wrote his very first book back in pre-primary, called 'A Book About Me'. The first picture featured in that book was a drawing of himself. In the drawing, Mr Foley had a brown furry body, purple eyes, a smiling mouth and only one strand of hair that was floating above his actual head! Everyone burst out laughing when he put up that very picture on the huge screen at the front of the auditorium.

Though he had a few setbacks, Mr Foley never stopped writing or drawing. He practiced quite often and the more he practiced the better he got. In Year 6, Mr Foley's teacher had entered the whole class in a book competition. The first few years he didn't win a single thing, but in Year 8, to Mr Foley's delight, he won 3rd place in that very competition. Oddly, the kids that won 1st and 2nd place were also from his class. Weird.

Years ago, Mr Foley drew the cover for an old Aussie magazine called '*The Quokka*'. He did it for quite a while but now, Mr Foley just works on his own fantastic books. He showed us the first cover he designed for '*The Quokka*' and his last. There were major differences and improvements. I guess practice does make perfect. "Persistence and encouragement gets you there." As quoted by Mr Foley. What he meant by persistence, was you should always persist and never give up. By encouragement, he meant surround yourself with encouraging people that won't put you down, make your feel doubtful, make fun of you or discourage you. Throughout his career, Mr Foley was inspired by one person... Shawn Tan. He was the one that convinced Mr Foley to continue writing and illustrating as his career. He looked up to Shawn as an idol and role model. Without Shawn in his life, Mr Foley probably wouldn't have become the author he is today.

GARDEN SOCIETY

The May meeting was cancelled as we visited a very interesting garden in vegetable garden. Some of the plants have been propagated on the property from cuttings or seeds including a hedge of Chinese gooseberries

which is frequently visited by wrens. The weather was beautiful on the day and there was no hurrying the visitors or our host. Thank you Grant and Clive for a most informative morning. We then ambled over to Linley and Mick's home for a sumptuous morning tea.

The next meeting on June the 6th will be replaced by a visit to Zanthorrea nursery and Melville rose nursery. We will be going by bus so please let Dorothy know if you would like to book a seat on 0429 989 031. We will be leaving from the Dead Finish at 9.30am.

The weather is getting colder and the days shorter but there is still plenty of gardening in June.

Vegies to plant in June include: asparagus, broad beans, cabbage, celery, artichoke, lettuce, onion, peas, spinach spring onions and strawberries.

Flowers to plant in June include: alyssum, calendula, pansy, dianthus, viola, primula, carnation, cornflower, poppy, snapdragon and stock.

June is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Ensure reticulation is turned off \mathbf{A}
- Lift and divide clumps of ground covering native violet and replant them in shady \mathbf{A} areas
- \mathbf{r} Give lillypilly and Westringia hedges a light trim to tidy for winter
- Tidy up and reshape overgrown hibiscus and crepe myrtle. Plan to give them a more \mathbf{r} serious prune in August
- Put potted cyclamen outside at night to enjoy the cool air \mathbf{r}
- \mathbf{r} Don't forget to check that your potted plants and gardens under eaves are getting enough water
- Once the leaves die down it is time to harvest onions, shallots and garlic \mathbf{r}
- Don't let beets get too big as they are sweeter when small \mathbf{r}
- Harvest spring onions and leeks as you need them as they do not store well \mathbf{r}
- Pick peas daily to encourage continuous crops. They are ready when the pods look ☆ plump
- \mathbf{r} Harvest rhubarb after the plant's first year, taking no more than half the stems. Hold stems near the base and twist
- Collect, bag and bin diseased foliage on fruit and veggies to reduce spread \mathbf{r}

On the last Sunday in April, Avondale Farm entertained a second group of Painters from Perth, organised by Marylou from the Station Arts. I opened the Museum to those who wished to view, with some painters taking photos of our collection for future projects, a few of the partners (who did not paint) were thrilled to pass away their time exploring the collection of Wheatbelt Machinery covering over 150 years of Farming prior to the mid 1970's.

Our group of volunteers and the Beverley Shire would like to thank Harvey Morrell for his kind donation of workshop manuals and illustrated 'parts cattle dogs' most of which we have items within our collection for, there were many with his father's name in scripted showing how old our 'working' items are. Some may say that this sort of information is readily available on the world wide web, but as locals know internet signal reliance is poor in our area and virtually nonexistent at Avondale Farm!

Many thanks to Danny and the Shire for fitting overflow pipes to the newly installed rainwater tanks, diverting the water away from the building, also a thank you to the National Trust for employing a plumber to fix the buildings only Water Tap, due to the age (like the rest of the building) some new pipework was necessary.

Our group met up again on Saturday May 20 when we opened our doors to the general public from 8.30am until noon, it was pleasing to see so many visitors, some locals, Perth, Parkerville and Cowaramup, our 'online' advertising efforts starting to pay off, thank you Kelly at the NT for also including us on your page.

With the return of John Hawke from his overseas trip we were back to full capacity with our number of volunteers, and with so many 'champing at the bit' I wrote a 'list' of things to do (and enjoy) for the team, everyone gets to choose what they are happy to help with and it is quite acceptable to just sit and 'chew the fat' as well, as long as you don't distract others from their efforts.

Tyres pumped, Stationary engines turned, leaves raked, and door channels cleaned, (thanks Eric & Kevin) and more on going 'improvements' to the workshop (thanks Bob) will be continued with the loan of some engineering equipment yet to be installed. Paul & John recommenced work on the International C30 Truck.

A big effort was put into starting the 'Twenty-Two' Dozer, her tin hat (covering on Exhaust pipe) was seen travelling towards the roof as she fired but that was about it, next time maybe when everyone has had their Weetbix and can swing the starting handle. There was better luck with the David Brown Garden Tractor (has a battery start) with Bob giving her a quick run around the block.

As always, we sat and had a shared 'morning cuppa' and caught up on what we had all been up to during the past month. Many thanks Kevin for the Plums you shared with the group. Knowing how A Fortunate Life was so well received, we can't wait to bring you Sydney II Lost and Found - 18 July 2023, also produced by Theatre 180.



The Parish of Beverley - Brookton

Understanding Anxiety

Anxiety is an umbrella term for feelings of fear,

nervousness, apprehensiveness or worry such as negative thoughts and seeing potential threats where they don't exist. Everybody gets anxious at times and some anxiety helps us to function well. But anxiety can become a problem when:

- It happens too often;
- It goes on for a long time;
- It stops us from doing things that we want to do.

Symptoms can be *psychological* (frequently feeling worried, tired, irritable and weepy with difficulty concentrating) and/or *physical* (including rapid breathing, rising blood pressure and pounding heart, a sense of restlessness or feeling on edge, muscle tension, sleep disturbance and nausea/sickness).



There is no single cause for anxiety but there are several factors that may contribute to its development:

- Brain Chemistry most strongly implicated here are imbalances of serotonin and dopamine that regulate thought and feeling - makes for feeling depressed and anxious;
- Heredity anxiety disorders run in families. Children are at higher risk if parents have an anxiety disorder;
- Life Experiences any distressing or traumatic experience may be grounds for developing anxiety. Exhaustion and certain medications can also be triggers for anxiety;
- Drug Use stimulant drugs like amphetamines and caffeine can trigger anxiety. Prolonged amphetamine use can cause feelings of panic and anxiety that last for years after the drug is stopped.

Some tips that may help you deal with your anxiety include:

- Self-awareness identify the symptoms early. Ask yourself what is making me feel this way? You may be able to change the anxiety-making circumstances but if not, you can deal with it better if you acknowledge it;
- Interpret it positively anxious about a situation? Instead of viewing it as threatening put a positive interpretation which will reduce the anxiety to a more manageable level;
- A little anxiety is a good thing too much is damaging but too little can mean you may not perform to your best ability. View anxiety as a resource you can manage;
- Diet the gut flora can get out of balance i.e. use more probiotics and omega-3 foods. Research has shown maintaining a balanced diet can reduce anxiety symptoms;
- Exercise boosts levels of vital brain chemicals like serotonin, dopamine and norepinephrine that may reduce stress and anxiety;
- Relaxation and meditation programs can help reduce stress, anxiety and depression. You can find many resources for these online; i.e. progressive muscle relaxation;
- Therapy there are some good programs that are offered by psychologists and counsellors that help to re-program those unhelpful and negative ways of thinking that underpins anxiety.

Situations, or life events, can come from many places including relationship issues, financial burden, physical health, trauma, or just dealing with difficult times (like seasonal conditions). As these situations develop, we need to take steps to reduce anxiety for ourselves and for those close to us. Remember... *before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate**!

Splitting the difference

Larvae in firewood

During the winter period where firewood is often collected and split, our service receives a common enquiry: *"I've chopped some wood and found these grubs! Are these borers? Is this the European house borer? Is my house at risk???*

The first question we ask to split European house borer (EHB) from many other wood borers is: *"What wood are you cutting? Is it pine?"* If the answer is no, it's not going to be EHB.

EHB larvae will only reproduce in seasoned (dry) coniferous timber and wood, including pine, fir and spruce. Of these, pine trees (*Pinus* species) and pine timbers are abundant in WA.

What if the answer was yes? - If you notice larvae or borer emergence holes in dead pine branches, logs, or untreated pine pallets or timbers, please report this. EHB has the potential to cause major structural damage to buildings constructed with untreated pine timber. Infested wood stored in or around the home is worth investigating.

Who's on the chopping block?

Most firewood burnt in WA is from native hardwood species and pictured in this article are the larvae of native longicorn beetles (*Phoracantha* species) in jarrah. These beetles attack live or recently dead/felled Eucalypt trees and do not pose a risk to the timbers in your home.

If you have been chopping firewood for years but are only starting to see these borers, it's likely the trees the firewood has come from, were stressed or recently felled. Trees stressed by drought or disease are particularly susceptible to borer attack.

Reporting

We can't all be insect identification specialists, but that doesn't matter. If something isn't familiar to you, it's best to report it rather than ignore it. When reporting, please include as much information as possible about what's occurring. Collect and hold onto any insect samples, and if taking photos, include things like a ruler or a pen so the dimensions of insects, holes or other symptoms can be gauged.

If borers are coming out of furniture, timber, or wooden products like bowls, chopping boards or ornaments – report it as soon as possible and we will provide guidance from there.



BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents

School & Hall Sites in The Dale Field Trip & Working Bee



Towards the end of April 2023, members of the Beverley Historical Society took the Community Bus out to the Dale and West Dale to inspect the various school & hall sites in the area. A plaque in the Dale Hall↑ lists the six Dale schools.

The sites all have signs and plaques naming the schools, the first teachers and some of the first families whose children attended. There were six schools and two halls. Five of the schools are in Beverley shire while Dale River South school site is in Brookton shire.

Of the two halls, only the Dale Hall remains & used for its original purpose.

One of the schools still stands and is used as a private residence, while two other school buildings have been relocated for different uses.

The furthest site away from town is on Brookton Highway just east of the Jones Rd corner. It was the first **West Dale** school and operated from 1944 to 1967.





The Jones Rd building was relocated to the new **Westdale Primary** \checkmark built near the wheat bin on Westdale Rd in 1967 and closed in 1987. These buildings are now used as private homes. One of the residents kindly permitted the members of the Society to view the inside of the old Westdale Primary School.





Dale River was the first Dale school and opened in 1905. It was sited at Hick's corner on Westdale Rd, west of Luptons Rd and closed in 1927.



The site of the school at **Hobbs Corner** \checkmark is west of Butchers Rd and is a very nicely maintained plaque that has been given a tiled surround by a local enthusiast.



The school building from this site was moved to a nearby farm and used as a residence until a new farmhouse was built. That building is still there and used for storage.



The last school site visited was at the **Dale Hall** which operated from 1906 to 1910 & again from 1914 to 1927. A celebration of 75 years of Education in the Dale in 1980 is recorded on several plaques hanging in the hall.

The other hall site we visited is in Luptons Road near the corner of Fergusons Rd.





Known as the **Tin Hall** it was built in 1928. It was not used as a state school.



At one stage it was owned by the Anglican Church and was used for church services and Sunday School. It was the venue for other community events and as a polling place. It was demolished in 1988.

Members of the Beverley Historical Society went armed with garden tools and cleaning supplies and cleaned around the sites by weeding, raking, spraying and removing plants or branches that obscured the signs. Signs were also given a wipe and the plaques polished. A couple of the plaques have deteriorated significantly and maybe new ones are required.






