## SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### Old School Building

Work has commenced on the Old School Building. Renovations will transform this building into a Civic Centre incorporating Council Chambers. Moving the Chambers will then free up space in the Administration Building which is very much needed.

Officially opened in 1989, the Administration Building has now reached a point where it has insufficient space to house the increased number of employees required because of greater State Government red tape. Moving the library to the Cornerstone Building in 2018 has helped and moving the Chambers will ensure the building has sufficient space for the foreseeable future.

#### Chief Executive Officer Review

The Council is required to conduct a CEO Review annually. This is being undertaken now and it is worth the community noting that Stephen Gollan has now been CEO for 12 years having been officially appointed on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2012. His current contract expires on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2026. Leading up to this, the Council of the day will be required to advertise this position to appoint the next CEO.

#### **Swimming Pool**

A grant application is currently being prepared for the complete refurbishment of the complex. This is to be lodged in February of this year.

#### **Contract Road Construction**

Earthstyle Contracting have completed the new construction works on both Waterhatch Road and Morbinning Road. Engaging Earthstyle was a decision Council made to enable the Shire's Works Crew to concentrate on gravel sheeting and maintenance where planned. The quality of work by Earthstyle and their efficiency in which this work was carried out has proved to be a positive decision.

#### Reseals

This year's reseals are scheduled to start on 26<sup>th</sup> February. There is a 3 kilometre section on Mawson Road and a 2 kilometre on Waterhatch Road to be completed.

#### Bridge 3203 Kokeby East Road

Work is currently underway on the replacement of this timber bridge to a reinforced concrete box culvert. The old bridge has been removed and the concrete slab has been poured. This will take one week to cure before the boxes can be put into place. Once the boxes have been laid then they will be covered with cement stabilised gravel. It is then anticipated that that the road will be opened for traffic around the 1st March. The headwalls will then be constructed and back filled. It is expected that this will be completed around 20th March. Local contractors are carrying out this work.

#### Bridge 3205 Bremner road

The order has been issued to Humes for the supply and delivery of the reinforced box culverts. This bridge replacement is scheduled to start Jan-Feb 2025.







#### Some Local Topical Items

Beverley Times, Saturday 1 April 1911

#### EASTER TOURNAMENT.

Arrangements in connection with the proposed tournament to be held on the Avondale links during the Easter holidays are progressing satisfactorily, and a most aucessafrlandaminachlasstering is anticipated. Between 30 and 40 visiting players are expected, and elaborate arrangements have been made for their accomodation. The catering will be carried out on the ground, and some of the players will camp on the spot, whilst motor cars will run between the links and York and Beverley for the convenience of those to whom camping out" offers no attraction. This is the first fixture of its kind ever attempted in Beverley, and the promoters are exerting themselves to the utmost to ensure its success.

#### EASTER.

Why does Easter fall on a different date each year? Although puzzling to many people, the question is easily answered.

Easter is a movable festival because it is regulated by the moon. Easter Day is always the first Sunday after what is known as the Paschal full moon, i.e., the full moon which happens upon or next after the 21st March, the beginning of the ecclesiastical year. If the full moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter day is on the Sunday after.

It must be remembered, however, that it is not the actual moon in the heavens that regulates the time of Easter, but an altogether imaginary, orb known as the calendar moon, which is usually a day or so later than the "queen of the night."

Easter Day cannot occur earlier than March 22nd or later than April 25th. Not for a hundred years has Easter Day failen on the former date. It last occurred on the latest possible date in 1886.

Financial results, which includes revenue derived from the sale of afternoon teas, were most gratifying. Club funds benefitting by an amount in the vicinity of £30. There were a number of visitors for the occasion and some of these figured prominently in the results.

The ladies championship singles was win by Miss S Hore, of Mt Lawtey, who deteated Mrs L Sims of newerley, in the final. The latter has not been a frequent visitor to the courts this season and she played really well to become a finalist.

Jack Thomas's play improved as the tournament progressed and he was in fine form to defeat Don Edwards, of Mr. Lawley, in the final of the men's championship singles. He was also successful in the men's handica, singles.

The ladies' handicap singles went to a visitor from Mr Lawley Miss Q Edwards, and the doubles event was won by a local pair in Mrs W H Brown and Miss Rata Ford.

The men's doubles was won by Messrs E T Wansbrough and Colin McLean, whilst the mixed doubles event went to J Thomas and Miss Hope.

Trophies for the tournament were provided by the Club cresident Mr. J. McDaniel, of Acondaic, who was introduced to the assemblage by the Club captain, Mr. J.C. W. Weaver, and extended a welcome to the waiters. He congretulated the accessful players. The trophies were prout ed to the successful contestants by Mrs. J.C. W. Weaver.

An interesting vicitor was a former. State champion in Mr R Phillips, who was here to particle ate in the bowling competitio is but took the opportunity of visiting the courts where his son was a contestant. He responded to an invitation to give a nortural dress to the assembled players. Mr Phillips is now living at Brookford and he intends to become a measurer of the Beverley and Club for the coming season.

#### EASTER

The name Easter, like the names of the days of week, is a survival the Teutonic the old from mythology. claim is made that it derived from "Eostre" or "Ostara". Anglo-Saxon Goddess of the Spring, to whom month answering to our April, and called "Eostur-Monath" was dedicated. It was further claimed that this month was the same as "Mensis Paschalis"

The root "pasch" from which so many other names for Easter are derived is from the Hebrew "pesach" (Passover) from the verb form "he passed over".

There is no indication of the observance of the Easter festival in the New Testament or in the writings of the Apostolic Fathers.

The sanctity of special times was an idea absent from the minds of the first Christians who continued to observe the Jewish festivals. though in a new spirit, as commemorations of events which those festivals had foreshadowed. Thus the Passover with a new conception added to it of Christ as the true Pashal Lamb and the first fruits from the dead, continued to be observed. and came the Christian Easter. as commemorating Easter the central fact of the Christian religion has always been regarded as the chief festival of the year. Sections in the Competition cover many facets of art and it is hoped that all artists in the district will avail themsel-


ves of this opportunity to exploit their creative ability and perhaps win a worthwhile prize.



For the Centenary year, the C.W.A has a new logo to help celebrate this amazing milestone. This beautiful logo is the end product of a design competition launched to C.W.A of W.A. members 4 years ago in preparation of our centenary. We are so proud of what it represents and would like to share the very meaningful symbology of the elements with you.

TREE TRUNK: represents longevity, solid roots, wisdom and a connection to the land and nature. It is a nod to the C.W.A of W.A Aim: "To improve the wellbeing of all people, especially those in country areas....." at the same time, it also represents tree-lined streetscapes in regional and metropolitan towns and cities.

**BRANCHES:** a representation of the various sizes and shapes of the different member branches that make up the Country Women's Association of Western Australia.

**HEART SHAPED LEAVES:** these are of varying size to represent the many multigenerational women that form the Association, their caring natures and spirit of togetherness and the support and connection that they offer each other.

**CWA LOGO:** placed at the base of the tree, this original logo design is part of the foundation, tradition and history of the Association.

**BLUE BORDER CIRCLE:** blue and white are the colours of the Association and the circle borrows the shape from the current logo, providing a different but familiar effect. The words signify the 100 years of service to the Western Australian Community

**AIM:** To improve the wellbeing of all people by promoting courtesy, cooperation, community effect, ethical standards and the wise use of resources.



# **Backyard Buddies**

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds and diseases

March 2024

# That's so weird!





Witches' broom on *Jacksonia* causing red deformed growths, fasciation on *Templetonia*, chimera on orange rind, and phyllody on strawberry.

Plant abnormalities have intrigued gardeners and botanists alike for many years. These abnormalities sometime result in strange growths or odd variations. Causes include environmental or genetic factors, pests, and disease. Below are some common examples, and perhaps you've noticed one or two of these before?

#### Witches' broom

Witches' broom is a symptom of stress in woody plants resulting in a deformed mass of twigs and branches, which looks broom-like in appearance. Causes include insect pests, viruses, fungi, environmental factors and genetic mutations.

#### **Fasciation**

Fasciation appears as abnormal flattened, ribbon-like, crested or elaborately contorted stems or leaves. Causes include hormonal, genetic, bacterial, fungal, viral and environmental.

#### Chimera

Chimera is the result of a genetic mutation. The overall appearance of fruit can be changed and sections of the rind or skin can appear striped and/or green. This is often reported in citrus where the rind colour is perfectly split between yellow and orange. Chimera leaf mutations

produce variegated, misshapen, or completely white leaves. These mutations may be prized and propagated to create new varieties.

#### Phyllody

Phyllody is the abnormal development of the leaf tissue caused by viral infections or environmental factors resulting in an imbalance of the plant hormones. It makes leaves grow in strange places.

#### Is control or reporting necessary?

Not much can be done to prevent these oddities. Keep plants as healthy as possible to allow them to fight off pests and diseases as best they can. These weird and sometimes wonderful malformations can be a great talking point, but if you don't want them on your plants, consider removing the affected parts. Remember to disinfect gardening equipment before and after, to avoid spreading pests and diseases.

# WARRIOR WELLBEING ARTICLE You Are What You Think!

# BY THE REGIONAL MEN'S HEALTH INITIATIVE March 2024

We have all heard the saying 'you are what you eat', implying that food fuels our body and the various types, quality, and quantity of food can impact our body, how we feel and therefore how we perform.

When we talk about our mental health and wellbeing, we refer to it as encompassing all aspects of our emotional, psychological and social wellbeing, so basically our mental health impacts how we think, act and feel.



Just like we have a level of control or choice over the types of food/fuel we put into our bodies there is also the capacity for us to influence our thoughts and behaviors which in turn impacts how we feel about ourselves and the world we live in.

As humans, we can often be very reactive and are driven by our emotions. Of course, how we react is individual and influenced by numerous factors that have conditioned us over our life journey (nature vs nurture) such as genetics, social, cultural, family influences, childhood experiences, and individual personality and behavioral types. However, as humans we also have the propensity for holding onto the negative more often than we do the positive.

In working with blokes in regional, rural and remote WA, and from my own personal life experiences, I have seen the fallout of unhelpful and negative thoughts people develop, carry and manifest during times of situational distress and poor mental health. Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT) is one effective approach for managing and treating a range of mental and emotional health issues. While this article is not a comprehensive overview of CBT, I would like to home in on one of its aims which is to identify and challenge unhelpful thoughts.

CBT is more than just being positive, as I recently observed with someone experiencing a range of debilitating physical health issues; it was this exact phrase that one day triggered a negative emotional outburst: "The next person who tells me to stay positive, I'll tell them to get stuffed!", they screamed.

Their experience was firstly needing validation as the obvious pain and distress experienced was warranted, but it was the unhelpful thinking and negative self-talk exacerbating feelings of despair, frustration and isolation that also needed to be addressed. Common lines such as: "I'll never get better", "I feel useless", "no one cares or understands how I feel" and "bad things always happen to me!" are examples of some of the documented unhelpful thinking patterns CBT aims to address, including:

- · Overgeneralization: You see a single negative as a never-ending pattern of defeat.
- · Personalization: Seeing yourself as the cause of negative events, no fault of your own.
- · All or Nothing Thinking: You only see things in black and white; if your performance falls short of perfect, you see yourself as failing.
- Disqualifying the Positive: You reject or don't see positives experiences. You insist they don't count to maintain a negative belief that is often contradicted by your experience. If some of this resonates, check out some endorsed self-help apps like Moodgym or HeadGear. Both use CBT concepts to create awareness and challenge negative thinking patterns. Always remember, before it gets too much Talk to a Mate®!! or talk it over.



This month's item is the Cletrac W20 Crawler, kindly donated to the Museum collection in

June 1978 by Frank & Noel Powell of 'Hillview Farm' Aldersyde near Brookton.

The W series units were produced from 1918 by the Cleveland Tractor Company and were an improved version of the earlier H series. The Cleveland company being formed by the White family who produced White Sewing machines. The company name of Cleveland later morphed into the name Cletrac.



The Engine will run but we

still need to investigate the correct position of the variable ignition advance lever, if positioned in the 'too far advanced' position this could cause internal damage to the engine and given not too many people know the correct position and the fact the clutch and/or steering system requires work she may well stay as a 'static exhibit', we will endeavour (although laborious for some) to establish the correct position scientifically by checking the position of the piston and the spark timing, but if anyone has knowledge of this unit or is happy to try and get her going please let us know, once the correct settings are found they will be recorded so she can join the many exhibits that are known to fill the air with 20<sup>th</sup> century exhaust fumes!

In the past many locals have expressed a passion for the Museum Collection and with a new year and the support of the Beverley Shire the Volunteers would welcome (see the Bulletin for opening times) not only visitors (how long since you were there?) but also those who would like to give their time to support this 'Tourist icon', a couple of hours maybe once a month just to sit and chat, maybe about your past relationship to the Museum collection, did your family donate something, let's hear about the story behind it? After a short break the Beverley Crews are back in training for 2024. We started the year off with a meet and greet at the Sub Centre with Committee & Crew before commencing the year's in-depth training. We all enjoyed the fresh salads and sausage sizzle, ably cooked by Ian.

Lionel has got training off to a great start outlining the training requirements for the whole year.

Our first Training night was re-connecting with the use of the wheelchair and tracks. The tracks make it so much easier for the Officer and the patient going down stairs and more comfortable ride for the patient. We have had to use them on a number of occasions but just needed to revisit with how to use them safely.

Turning on the lights at the oval and turning off the sprinklers should the helicopter need to land during the night. Easy tasks but we all needed to refresh and know how, and where all the switches are and what keys we use.

Snake bites, burns, & heart attacks are the next training agendas.

Our crews are all invested in knowing all we need to know how to treat these conditions.

Kitchen renovations should be underway in the next couple of weeks. The kitchen is being totally revamped and will be great when completed.

During the months of December & January the Crews were kept on their toes with a number of call outs at all times of the day. Some were away on holidays which reduced crew numbers but we managed to keep Beverley covered during this time. Great work and dedication by our local volunteers.

As always the Sub Centre are on the lookout for those in the Community that would like to become a Volunteer. Beverley have 8 dedicated Ambulance Officer Volunteers to meet the needs of the town. (This doesn't include the dedicated Committee members). Sometimes, thankfully not very often, we are unable to get a local crew, then one is called from another town i.e. Brookton or York. So you could appreciate why we are always looking for new, keen people to join us. If you think you could commit to becoming an Ambulance Volunteer please don't hesitate to contact our Chairperson Ian, Lionel or Jenny to get more details for volunteering.

It is unfortunate that the upgrading of the air strip lighting has been delayed and it will now be possibly mid March before the replacement commences.

When the new lighting is operational, the fixed wing aircraft will be able to land on the airstrip at night, which they have been unable to do due to insufficient lighting for some time. Fortunately though, the helicopter has been able to land on the oval when it has been needed.
