SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Vandalism and Neighbour Watch

Given the recent rise in 'misbehaviour' around the town, some members of the community have enquired about the possibility of starting a formal Neighbour Watch in Beverley.

At the time of writing this report, the Council has not had time to consider this matter but it will be discussed at the meeting on Wednesday 22nd May.

Nurses' Quarters

As we have previously advised, the Shire is progressing the application to receive a Management Order over this building and land. It is a crucial part of the development of the Beverley 2035 concept. Unfortunately, the application has been held up in the Department for some time. Recent correspondence from the Department of Planning, Lands, and Heritage has raised the possibility of heritage listing for this building, which will delay our application even further.

Swimming Pool

An aquatic safety assessment was conducted at the Beverley Swimming Pool on 5th February 2024 by Royal Life Saving Western Australia. While this detailed report raises some serious concerns around safety, it fails to acknowledge that standards today are vastly different from those existing when the pool was first constructed. In fact, some of the detail can only be described as overstating the obvious.

The Shire has been aware of the need to attend to the needs of an old facility which is why a detailed plan was developed some years ago and why the Shire is seeking funding to address the redevelopment of the whole centre. One approval for a Grant has been received and the Shire awaits another decision for funding under the Regional Precincts and Partnerships Project (rPPP).

In Brief:

- Investigations have begun on the requirements to organise and conduct an Air Show in Beverley in March 2026. A proposal has been received from Paul Bennet Airshows;
- The Shire Planner has submitted a Crown Land Enquiry to the Department of Planning, Lands, and Heritage regarding the tenure of the Avon River Park for the purposes of allowing private boating/kayak rental:
- Tree Lopping The rural lopping has been completed for this year. The areas were along Piccadilly,
 Northbourne, Kennedy, Wyalgima, Simms, Potts, Mills, Glencoe, Kokendin, and Dobaderry Roads;
- Footpath programme the final expenditure for this programme this financial year will be the construction of a new footpath on the east side of Short Street;
- Vincent Street bridge Main Roads bridge division have identified nine piles that require attention
 under this bridge. Two will require propping and the remaining seven will require steel banding. Failure
 to rectify these matters would have meant the lowering of the weight limit on this bridge. Given that this
 bridge received significant reconstruction to the surface about five years ago, it is hard to comprehend
 how these faults were not noticed then:

Over her 19 years as a committee member, she consistently demonstrated her commitment through regular attendance and valuable contributions. Marylyn's dedication was further evident as she accepted a second three-year term as Secretary in 1998.

An avid first aid trainer, Marylyn passionately mentored new volunteers, leaving an indelible mark on the next generation of responders. Despite juggling the responsibilities of single parenthood, she remained steadfastly available for transfers 24/7, embodying unwavering commitment to the service. Marylyn's tireless efforts extended to local events, fundraising endeavours, and the meticulous care of our building, earning her a reputation as a staunch defender of our mission within the community.

Her impact went beyond her immediate responsibilities. Marylyn was instrumental in implementing significant improvements, including the establishment of a new mobile phone service and roster system. Additionally, her pioneering efforts in mentoring new volunteers during ambulance operations set a new standard for our organisation.

Marylyn's legacy will endure through the lives she touched and the countless contributions she made to the Beverley Sub Centre and the broader community. She will be dearly missed but forever remembered for her selflessness, dedication, and unwavering spirit.



Hello beautiful Beverley Community.

As you all know we have started our own Neighbourhood Watch both Local & Rural. On Wednesday the 22/05/2024 I went before our beautiful Shire asking them to back me with their support. The turn out of support by residents & business owners in this new venture of ours was truly amazing. The vote from the shire council was a unanimous YES!!! Our aim is to create a community that is safe for each & everyone of us. We need to look out for our neighbours, our friends, our families & our visitors. We have such a beautiful, friendly & caring community. We all have the right to feel safe in every part of our town including schools, parks, businesses & surrounding rural areas. Our farmers also have the right to feel safe on their own farms. Unfortunately we are not immune to criminal behaviour. We have thefts, break ins, damage to our public spaces & local businesses. If you are unaware we now have a new Police Sargent. So on behalf of our beautiful Beverley Community I would like to say welcome to Sargent Shane Peets. I've had the pleasure of meeting him & he has assured me that he looks forward to not only helping our community but also being part of our community. He has asked for our assistance in reporting any & all illegal behaviour. Unfortunately with limited services in the Wheatbelt our police station isn't manned 24/7. But that doesn't mean they can't help us day or night. In an emergency you need to dial Triple 0!! If you wish to report a crime thats not an emergency please call 131 444. You need to leave all your contact details when reporting a crime. Give as much information about your incident as possible. And be sure to ask that you want the Sargent to call you back as soon as possible in regards to your report. You will also be given a job number when calling 131 444 so be sure to keep that information it will help the police & yourself in keeping track of your report. There is also an App you can download on your phone to help report criminal activity. It called "Eyes on the Street" you can report via the App just be aware its not manned 24/7 so it can take up to 48 hrs before you hear back from the Police. There is also another App worth having on your phone & that's the "First Responder" App. This is for accidents requiring emergency help. Using this App gives first responders your exact GPS location as well as helpful information that can help you in assisting in an emergency. Now we all have a part to play when it comes to the safety of the residents & community in Beverley. We all need to take notice of any unusual activities. Don't be afraid to report it. You can remain anonymous if you so wish. Please do not put yourself in harms way. Your safety is your number 1 priority. Do not engage with anyone who is committing a criminal offence. If safe to do so record all relevant information & then report by calling police. We do have a new Facebook page called Beverley Community Local & Rural Information Alert. You can join by answering a few questions & agreeing to the page rules. You can then post information about your concerns with illegal activity. You can report illegal activity. If you are worried about reporting information you can contact admin on our page & will we pass your information on to the police or anonymously if you so wish. In the coming weeks I will be creating a committee for our Neighbourhood Watch so we can better assist you all with more resources. Please be patient with us as we are all learning as we go. We are lucky to have so many residents happy to volunteer their time & lend their knowledge to help us get our new Neighbourhood Watch Local & Rural up & running to benefit us all. INCASA COUNTRY 'STAYING IN PLACE' IS NOW ROLLING OUT IN BEVERLEY

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

Step 1 - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

Step 2 – My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 – If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

Step 4 – Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 – The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.

What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. *You may be eligible for:*

Personal Care – assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks

Domestic Assistance – supporting you to complete everyday household tasks

Home Maintenance – Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden

Meal Assistance - Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

Transport Services - Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home

Social Support - Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies

Respite Care - Providing relief to carers

Clinical Care – Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan

HERE'S SOME MORE FREQUENLTY ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING HCP'S

What's the difference between CHSP (HACC) and a Home Care Package (HCP)?

A key difference is: when you describe your level of need, it can determine which initiative you are eligible for: CHSP is intended for seniors requiring 1 or 2 basic services, either in the short-term or on an ongoing basis. HCP are for people who need more services. There are 4 tiers of HCP to meet varying levels of need: basic, low, intermediate or high.

What are the average waiting times to receive an assessment?

Once your ACAT assessment request has been lodged through My Aged Care, the waiting time is between 6-8 weeks. You can call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 or if preferred, the CRC can do this on your behalf.

What is the average waiting time to receive my package once I've had my ACAT assessment?

If you're approved for a Home Care Package, you're placed in the Government's national queue until your package is allocated to you. Wait times vary depending on what level of package you're approved for. For people with a *medium* priority, the expected wait time for an approved Home Care Package (starting from the date on the letter of approval) is:

· Level 1: Less than 1 month

Level 2: 3-6 months

Level 3: 12-15 months

Level 4: 6-9 months

Once I've been allocated a Home Care Package, when can I expect home support services to start?

Great news, once you've received your approval and referral code from My Aged Care, the CRC can get you signed up that day. After lodging your details to InCasa Country, we can have support workers within a week or two depending on your needs and availability.

Visiting WA Government House & Gardens With Beverley Garden & Tree Society

Last month the Beverley Garden & Tree Society with the Beverley Historical Society organised a tour of WA Government House and Gardens for members & friends of both societies.



This Government House ♠, described as Fonthill Gothic style, was completed in 1863. It replaced a smaller house that was located closer to the gate lodge ♣. Near this Government House vehicle entrance, there is a statue dedicated to Balbuk Yooreel, considered the most important Whadjuk woman of the 19th century.



The grand Entrance Hall of the House encompasses a stained-glass window that features Queen Victoria with symbols of Great Britain. The double staircase is made of jarrah & wrought iron ♥ with tiny shields representing monarchs from William 1 to Queen Victoria decorating the cornice.





The yellow Drawing Room Ψ is most often used to welcome dignitaries & guests to Government House.





The painting by WA artist Owen Garde ↑ in the ballroom anteroom shows one of the first meetings of the WA Legislative Council. The portrait features WA's first Governor, Sir James Stirling, and the four men he appointed to help him administer the Swan River Colony. The painting shows, from left to right, Peter Broun, William Mackie, Captain Frederick Irwin, John Septimus Roe, James Stirling (standing) and Mark Currie, Clerk of the Council. Peter Broun, John Septimus Roe and Mark Currie were among early landowners in the Beverley district.

At our shared morning tea, discussion was had concerning the upcoming Beverley Agricultural Show in August



Benefits of registering for MyMedicare

Many general practices across Australia have registered in MyMedicare to support them in offering tailored care and services to fit the needs of their regular patients.

By registering in MyMedicare, you may benefit from:

- · A formalised relationship with your general practice or GP, which has shown to improve health outcomes.
- · Longer Medicare Benefit Scheme (MBS) funded telehealth consultations with your GP.
- Incentive for longer telehealth consultations for children under 16 and Commonwealth Card Concession card holders, from 1 November 2023.
- · More regular visits from your GP and better care planning for people living in a residential aged care home, from August 2024
- · Connections to more appropriate care in general practice for people who visit hospital frequently, from mid-2024.







OFFICIAL BEVERLEY MEDICAL PRACTICE THANK YOU

Massive thanks to all the hard-working wonderful staff at Beverley Medical Practice for saving my life.

My journey started during the summer of 2022/23. I couldn't understand why my energy levels both mentally and physically were so low. Running the pool is demanding but for my age I'd like to consider myself fit and healthy. Never smoked or taken illicit drugs and a social drinker. I kept making excuses not to visit the doctors like the old "I'll get over it", or I'm just tired after a fourteen-and-a-half-year

relationship break up etc.

By the end of the 2023 season my 14-year-old daughter Keira gave me 2 ultimatums, I either book myself into see a doctor or she will call an ambulance. Keira has a bit of her mother in her, so I decided not to argue and booked myself a visit to Dr. Sola Oyetunji. Immediately it was obvious I wasn't too well; I was diagnosed with pneumonia in both lungs and taken to Northam hospital for an overnight stay. The promptness and professionalism displayed by all staff at the Beverley Medical Centre was second to none, they literally saved my life.

To quote Dr. Sola: Brad, it was a simple chest infection and you ignored it, a dose of antibiotics and you would've been on your way. You are not 30 anymore, if you feel sick you need to see a see a doctor especially when you're in your 50's. Because I tried to tough it out, I've spent the past 12 months struggling to physically operate at my optimum. The pneumonia eventually attacked my heart causing

me to recently endure the pain of open heart surgery receiving 2 brand new valves.

A message to all men in their 50's or older..... When in doubt check it out !!! I can tell you right now nobody is going to pin a bravery award on your chest for ignoring medical issues, you need to seek medical advice even for the most basic of illnesses. I learnt that lesson the hard way so please, don't

be

like me and get yourselves sorted.

Again, thank you to Doctor Sola Oyetunji for pulling strings to get one of (if not the best) heart and lung surgeon in the country. An operation that didn't need to happen if I'd just listened to my body and got it sorted straight away. Thank you to all my friends, family and people I barely know for their messages, prayers and thoughts. And finally, I can't thank Sheila and Ted Sheehan enough for their love and support and for looking after Keira during these difficult times.

I cannot wait to commence the 2024 summer, this will be my 15th season as Beverley's Pool Manager. Hopefully with some much-needed State Government funding our pool can receive some life saving treatment too






