

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



BEVERLEY 2035

In August 2023, the Commonwealth Government announced the launch of a new Grant Programme for potential infrastructure development. In this programme, Local Governments are eligible to apply for funding.

The Grant Programme known as Regional Precincts and Partnerships Program or rPPP, has 2 parts to it.

The first stage is funding of up to \$5 million per successful application for the purpose of planning. This is important for the second stage which has up to \$50 million per successful application for the implementation of these plans.

This provides an opportunity to plan for many developments that will benefit Beverley over a longer timeframe. These developments are envisaged to be planned over several years and so the Council has developed a concept plan called "Beverley 2035".

For Beverley, the ability to access funding for planning is crucial to ensure projects identified are "shovel ready" for the occasion of suitable Grant funding being made available. Engaging consultants for previous projects has proved costly and has limited the Shire's ability to develop the plans it has identified to date.

One of these projects, the swimming pool redevelopment is a "shovel ready" project and an application for funding under Stage 2 of rPPP has been submitted.

This concept plan is in its early stages and is being formulated to identify projects that will benefit Beverley. The projects currently envisaged are but a beginning to a long-term view of a future Beverley.

Under this plan, the Council has identified the following as projects that would bring benefits to the Community:

- 1. Refurbish the Beverly Aquatic Centre (a Stream 2 application has been submitted);
- 2. Industrial land servicing and release for development;
- 3. Residential land servicing and release for development;
- 4. Intergenerational Centre aged care to child care;
- 5. Essential worker accommodation;
- 6. Relocation of the Shire depot;
- 7. Caravan park expansion;
- 8. Avon River Park development and Trails plan implementation;
- 9. Creative spaces Cultural Centre; and
- 10. Recreation precinct development Indoor Sports Centre and Function Centre.

To progress the applications for the Stage 1, the Shire has engaged Mr. Mark Casserly as a consultant to prepare the necessary application.

It must be stressed that while this is only a concept plan at this time, nevertheless the general vision for future planning will be based on these matters and others as they might arise in the future.

MAKE A 'TASKS LIST'

Break large tasks into smaller, more manageable tasks which can be prioritised in order of importance.



FOCUS ON WHAT YOU CAN CONTROL

Direct your time, energy, and resources towards things you have direct influence over, rather than things outside of your control (weather/climate, government regulations, commodity markets.



BRING OTHERS TO THE TABLE

Another set of ears and a logical brain can help with processing and retaining information



KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN

Schedule regular farm business meetings and don't avoid making decisions.



KEEP IN REGULAR CONTACT WITH INDUSTRY PEERS, GROWER GROUPS AND CONSULTANTS

They are sources of trusted and valuable information and can also be a good social connection.



PREPARE AND PLAN FOR THE UNEXPECTED

Contingency planning can avoid further stress.



BE AWARE OF THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH BEHAVIOURS OR COPING STRATEGIES THAT ARE UNSAFE AND PUT YOURSELF AND OTHERS AT RISK

Unsafe alcohol consumption, misuse of prescription medication and use of illicit drugs.



TAKE TIME TO PAUSE, BREATHE AND REFLECT

A simple moment of reflection helps us connect our minds with our feelings. It enables us to connect what's happening around us with what's going on in our heads and hearts. Taking the time to ask the right questions of ourselves, and time to get a thoughtful answer, gives us perspective, direction and clarity. By taking time to pause and slow down our breathing (deep circular breaths), we slow down a racing heart, reducing the symptoms of stress headaches and muscle tension.

High Blood Pressure - A Silent Killer

Sadly, lots of blokes don't have their blood pressure (BP) checked because we don't visit our GP for check-ups and/or the GP has not done a blood pressure test. In fact, a lot of blokes don't know what the blood pressure readings mean and have never had it explained to them.

High BP is one of the 3 main risk factors for heart attack and the main risk factor for stroke. Having a consistently high BP isn't a good thing and may become more common as we age. High BP isn't inevitable, nor unmanageable if we have it, but controlling high BP is critical in protecting our long-term health and wellbeing.

Our bodies contain about 5 litres of blood which the heart pumps continuously around an intricate network of blood vessels. This process delivers vital nutrients and fresh oxygen to our body's tissues and organs whilst creating a certain amount of pressure inside our arteries (blood vessels that take blood away from the heart and out to the body).

Our blood pressure depends primarily on two things:

- The amount of blood pumped by the heart
- How easily the blood can flow through the arteries.

Blood pressure readings are given in millimetres of mercury (mmHg) and consist of 2 numbers:

- The top number measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart pumps systolic (sys-tol-ik) pressure;
- The bottom number measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart relaxes - diastolic (di-as-tol-ik) pressure.

What is normal blood pressure? According to the Australian Health Foundation there is no normal or ideal blood pressure reading. The following figures should only be used as a guide.

Normal	Less (may 120/80)
High/Normal	Between 120/80 and 140/90
High	Equal to or more than 140/90
Very High	Equal to or more than 180/100

The cause of high BP quite often is a mystery. It can be linked to genetics (family history is important), poor diet, being overweight and/or lack of exercise. The effects of some medicines being used to treat varying health conditions can also be a factor along with underlying health disorders that we may have.


The harm of high BP over time is simple. It can overload both the heart and blood vessels which in turn make us more susceptible to heart attack and stroke.

There are many things that we can do to keep our blood pressure healthy. To help manage high BP many people need medicine but by making the following healthy lifestyle changes blood pressure can be lowered:

- Be a non-smoker
- Lose excess weight
- Eat less fat and salt
- Exercise regularly
- Keep alcohol intake down

It is possible to have high BP for years without knowing it, which is why it's called a silent killer and is most often discovered during routine physical examinations. Remember, be proactive and make an appointment for a service visit with your GP and always have BP on your checklist for your GP to check.

CELEBRATING <u>80 YEARS</u> OF PROVIDING FINANCE FOR AMENITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE HEALTH SERVICES IN BEVERLEY

LOCATIONS OF THE BEVERLEY OPPORTUNITY SHOP

1961 - The Shop opened in the side room of **Freemasons Hotel** in eastern end of **Vincent Street-** Mr Hayes was the Publican. And it remained there, courtesy of all those subsequent publicans for 45 years. The Auxiliary paid no rent or power bills for those years.

- **Opening hours** 2-3pm on Saturdays. Later, once a month, the Shop also opened on Fridays and Saturdays to coincide with Child Endowment Payment dates. Eventually, Saturday trading ceased.
- **Meetings** were also held in the Hotel in an upstairs lounge.
- The Methodist Church [now Real Life Church] on Hunt Road has also been spoken of as the original location, but records have not been able to verify this.

2006 – Opportunity Shop re-located to **The Old School Building** in the town centre. A room was provided by the Shire of Beverley.

2010 – The location was needed for other uses and the Shire Council agreed to the Auxiliary using the building across the road- **The Child Health Centre**.

2015 – The Child Health Centre was marked for demolition to make way for the new CRC Cornerstone buildin....so once again we were homeless! After negotiations with the Shire, we moved into the old **Roads Board/Shire building adjacent to the Town Hall**, where the Op Shop remains today in 2024. Donations were made, including one of a significant amount by an anonymous donor, towards the cost of the new expense of rent to be paid.

During most of these many decades, "Avon Trading" was used as the depot for goods donated to the Opportunity Shop. The Auxiliary has been enormously grateful to the various owners of Avon Trading and Thrifty Link Hardware.

SOME MORE TID-BITS ABOUT THE AUXILIARY COMMITTEE IN DAYS GONE BY AND THEIR ACTIVITIES:

- Members washed the ward curtains, sewed curtains for the wards, were rostered to visit patients, changed the water in the vases and provided fresh flowers, Mrs Fleay and Mrs Cullen made waterproof leggings for the nurses and committee cleaned the hospital stove!!!!
- 1956, suggested a public appeal for bath heaters for Nurses' Quarters.
- the Auxiliary paid volunteers to drive families of patients to Perth, members drove senior citizens to lunch at The Lodge, to and from Northam and patients to Perth on Roster on a roster system.
- 1957- Some dissention with Hospital Board and Medical Dept; they thought the Auxiliary should spend their money as they dictated. Not so!
- 1958 The Auxiliary decided against the Constitution drawn up by the Hospital Board and decided to register The Beverley Hospital Auxiliary as an autonomous Charitable Organisation [which it still is today in 2024], to work for hospital patients and staff and the health system in Beverley.
- In 1967, the Auxiliary suggested to the Hospital Board that the hospital diet to patients should be revised. Were they successful?
- Auxiliary members took home mending [sheets, pyjamas for patients, pillow slips, baby clothes etc].
 On slack days, nurses helped with mending.

As you can see, the firm foundations for the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary were laid so successfully many years ago by a great number of valued and dedicated volunteers.

In 2024, the Auxiliary committee structure, our mode of operating and our enthusiasm to support the health system within our community has varied little over 80 years.

We salute those founding members!

Beverley Agricultural Museum News

The heating at the Ag Museum is totally environmentally friendly, certainly no fossil fuel involved, in fact it is non-existent! So, it was not surprising that with the cooler damp weather that not so many visitors came to see our vast collection of Wheatbelt Farming Machinery located at Avondale Farm just 5.5kms outside of town on Westdale Road, but those that did when we were open on Saturday May 25 certainly enjoyed their visit with several of the volunteers taking time out from their efforts to show them around.

Paul & Kevin spent much of their time trying to 'pinch' parts from the Field Marshall Tractor located in the picnic area, alas this did prove frugal as the items required were either inaccessible or worn to a similar degree, many thanks must go to Kevin for reconstructing the clutch cable and welding the clutch pads before taking the time to have them professionally relined by a firm in Perth, he also managed to clean and unseized the wick used to heat the cylinder air when starting, an excellent and positive step forward.

Eric & Gerry persisted with their efforts to restore the brakes to the FX Holden Ute, fitting the Master Cylinder that John A had overhauled, Bill brought back the Water Pump for the C 30 International Truck having made a new impeller for it, and John H took time to ensure the leaf traps from the valley gutters were cleaned out given the rains we were soon to have.

At our first meeting in June, we found the damp floor challenging, (yes, the rains did come) even after John H's efforts to ensure those leaf traps were clear, alas old sheds have their issues and our group is used to challenges.

With the annual Beverley Show date coming up fast Paul & Bob spent extra time working on the Bedford Truck (one of our means of conveying items to the show), she has a



miss fire when she gets warm, so it was back to basics with a compression test being done, well she is old so it was no surprise that the readings looked like a mountain pictorial (up and down) with mainly low peaks, and given its age and costs involved we are just grateful she still runs. From the Bedford (and its unreliable state) Bob & Paul looked at the Fargo Truck, discovering that the Brake reservoir was empty, once filled the fluid was seen to leak out of the Master Cylinder, upon removal the seals were deemed to be 'stuffed' and new ones required. Many thanks to Frank for searching the inter web for parts, hopefully we will be able to match up the rubbers in Perth.

Gerry continued his diligent work removing the Holden front Brake drums and hubs only to reveal more brake fluid leaks, with more headaches for our purchasing officer John H!

Ralph & Kevin continued working on the Field Marshall installing the new Pads and Clutch cable.




convenient) to open up he made the effort to meet up expecting a 'tourist', so it

All personal information recorded in MyMedicare, including your chosen healthcare providers, will be kept secure and your privacy will be maintained.

Benefits of registering for MyMedicare

Many general practices across Australia have registered in MyMedicare to support them in offering tailored care and services to fit the needs of their regular patients.

By registering in MyMedicare, you may benefit from:

- · A formalised relationship with your general practice or GP, which has shown to improve health outcomes.
- Longer Medicare Benefit Scheme (MBS) funded telehealth consultations with your GP.
- Incentive for longer telehealth consultations for children under 16 and Commonwealth Card Concession card holders, from 1 November 2023.
- · More regular visits from your GP and better care planning for people living in a residential aged care home, from August 2024.
- Connections to more appropriate care in general practice for people who visit hospital frequently, from mid-2024.

Governor's Visits to Beverley

(from the Beverley Times)

Saturday 5 September 1908, page 6

The Governor on Tour. VISIT TO BEVERLEY.

His Excellency the **Governor**, **accompanied by Lady Bedford**, Miss Bedford and Captain Gilliatt, A.D.C., paid a visit to Beverley on Tuesday, arriving from Perth by the evening train. They were met at the station by representatives of the Municipal Council and Roads Board, and an address of welcome was read by the Town Clerk, to which Sir Frederick Bedford responded in a few brief remarks. The vice-regal party were subsequently escorted to the



Mechanics' Institute, where they were met by the W.M. of the local branch of the Masonic Lodge (Bro. Λ. W. Fergus) and became the guests of the Lodge at the hall and supper, remaining until shortly after midnight. The following day a visit was paid to the local State school. The children were assembled in the playground and were drawn up in order under the Union Jack tinder the charge of the head teacher (Mr. T. G. Slater) and his assistants. Upon the arrival of the vice-regal party the children sang the National Anthem, and Mr. W. Smith J.P. (Chairman of the local School Board) received and introduced his Excellency. After an inspection of the school the children were granted a holiday in honour of the occasion. A short drive into the country was the next move on the programme, the properties of Mr. W. J. Butcher and Messrs. Fisher and Tanner being visited. At St Aubyns the party were the guests of Mr. and Mrs. H. M Fisher, and light refreshments were served. On returning to Beverley an excellent luncheon was provided at the Freemasons' Hotel. Cr. W. V. Chipper, J.P. presiding in the absence of the Mayor (Mr. E. G. Barrett Lennard) through illness. Mr. H. Smith, M.L.A., also sent an apology for his unavoidable absence. The usual loyal toast and that of His Excellency the Governor were honoured Sir Frederick Bedford acknowledging the latter m a few complimentary remarks concerning what he had seen of the district. A public reception was held in the Mechanics' Institute in the afternoon, at which there was a representative gathering. The arrangements were in the capable hands of Mrs. W. J. Cooper and refreshments were served by a committee of ladies. Vocal items were contributed by several of those present, and the viceregal party were subsequently seen off at the station on their way to York. • '

His Excellency the **Governor and the Hon. Lady Newdegate** are announced to pass through Beverley this evening on their way to Albany, where they go into residence for the summer.

His Excellency the **Governor**, **Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney**, paid his first visit to Beverley yesterday to perform the ceremony of officially opening the Beverley Show. He was met on arrival of the train at the station by the Chairman and members of the Board and other prominent citizens.

It was a happy inspiration of the Committee to invite His Excellence the Governor (Sir William Campion) to officially open the Show.

VISIT OF THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR R.S.L: LUNCHEON AND ROAD BOARD WELCOME

His Excellency the Lieut. **Governor Sir James Mitchell**, **accompanied by Lady Mitchell**, arrived in Beverley at midday on Wednesday last in order to attend the Jubilee Ball held in the Town Hall that night. The visitors were

met at the station by the chairman of the Road Board (M.'. F. Mc-Donald), the president of the Beverley branch of the R.S.L. (Mr. G. L. Weaver) and Mrs. Weaver. At 1 pm a luncheon was tendered the visitors at the Freemasons Hotel by the Executive of the R.S.L. Also present were representatives of the C. W.A. in Mrs. Adamson and Miss



M. McDonald, Mr, and Mrs. J. I. Mann and representatives of the RS.L. Women's Executive. Lady Mitchell was later the guest of the C.W.A. at afternoon tea in the Rest Room. After the luncheon a visit was made to both local schools, and the children were granted a half holiday in honour of the occasion. The Road Board extended a welcome to Sir James at the Board office at 3 p.m. Mr. F. McDonald, Board chairman, presided, and after the loyal toast had been honoured welcomed the Lieut. Governor on behalf of residents, about 30 of whom were present. His remarks were supported by Messrs. G. L. Weaver and J. I. Mann (member for the district). Sir James' health was honoured, and after he had responded proceedings

terminated. Sir James and Lady Mitchell returned to the city yesterday morning.

Friday 5 June 1953, page 1 The Governor's Visit

His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant - General **Sir Charles Gairdner**, **K. C. M.G., C.B., C.B.E. and Lady Gairdner** will pay their first visit to Beverley next week to attend and officiate at local Coronation fixtures. The Vice-Regal visitors will arrive in their special rail coach and their first engagement will be at the race fixture on Wednesday afternoon when they will be the guests of the Club president, Mr. Tom Barrett Lennard and committee. The Governor will present the trophy after the cup race. They will arrive at the Town Hall at 9 p.m. for the presentation of debutantes. On Thursday morning the



local C.W.A. will entertain Lady Gairdner at morning tea and Sir Charles will visit the schools in the company of the member for the district. Mr. J. I. Mann. M.L.A. and chairman of the Road Board, Mr. L. W. Doncon. Later the visitors will be the guests of the Road Board at dinner at the Hotel Beverley. This will conclude the official fixtures. Sir Charles Gairdner and Lady Gairdner made another visit to Beverley Friday 16 May 1958 for the RSL ball. This time they came by car but stayed the night in the special rail carriage that arrived separately.

Thursday 3 April 1969, page 6 Club Entertains Governor's Team



Last Sunday the **Governor Sir Douglas Kendrew** and his tennis team, was entertained by the Beverley Club. The day was very much enjoyed by all who attended, these including Mr and Mrs W. E. Heal (Shire president), and Mr. & Mrs. J. Woods and Mr W. R. Gillespie (life members). Of those taking part in the match it was pleasing to see Mr. C. McLean and Mr. G. Kilpatrick. (the Club's two most recent life members) playing. On the tennis court His Excellency and team members proved very able opponents and won very comfortably. At the completion of an excellent buffet lunch the Beverley Club's president, Mr Frank McDonald,

welcomed His Excellency and all the visitors. Sir Douglas responded — his speech including high praise of the ladies who provided lunch.

Beverley Shire Council and the Beverley Agricultural Society at luncheon on that day, His Excellency has agreed to present the Show trophies during the afternoon, and he and Lady Kyle will be guests at an evening Civic Reception to be hosted by the Beverley Shire Council.

This month we welcome Andy Dolphin till the 23rd followed by John Toohey till the 12th August.





So many highlights as you would have noted in the Monthly Station News, including the Gallery Extension which is well underway...stay tuned for details of a Grand Opening.

We are also in the very early stage of a major funding application project in conjunction the Shire of Beverley to undertake some capital works for some upgrades to the Platform Theatre that we hope will help us deliver even better events.

Supporting BSA Inc is also of course supporting the Beverley Amateur Dramatics (BAD), Beverley Station Arts Singers (BeSASSy) as well as Plein Air Beverley WA. Member numbers are often useful in Grant applications and being able to show a good solid number of members is looked on favourably.

Recently we were unsuccessful in our funding application with Regional Arts WA to support us in having a part-time employee and that was a real blow. However, we have picked ourselves up and are hopeful with a new application for funding via DLGSC and look forward to hearing the outcome in September /October.



Splitting the difference

Larvae in firewood

During the winter period where firewood is often collected and split, our service receives a common enquiry: "I've chopped some wood and found these grubs! Are these borers? Is this the European house borer? Is my house at risk??? The first question we ask to split European house borer (EHB) from many other wood borers is: "What wood are you cutting? Is it pine?". If the answer is no, it's not going to be EHB.

EHB larvae will only reproduce in seasoned (dry) coniferous timber and wood, including pine, fir and spruce. Of these, pine trees (Pinus species) and pine timbers are abundant in WA. What if the answer was yes? - If you notice larvae or borer emergence holes in dead pine branches, logs, or untreated pine pallets or timbers, please report this. EHB has the potential to cause major structural damage to buildings constructed with untreated pine timber. Infested wood stored in or around the home is worth investigating.

Who's on the chopping block?

Most firewood burnt in WA is from native hardwood species and pictured in this article are the larvae of native longicorn beetles (*Phoracantha* species) in jarrah. These beetles attack live or recently dead/felled Eucalypt trees

and do not pose a risk to the timbers in your home.

If you have been chopping firewood for years but are only starting to see these borers, it's likely the trees the firewood has come from, were stressed or recently felled. Trees stressed by drought or disease are particularly susceptible to borer attack.

Reporting

We can't all be insect identification specialists, but that doesn't matter. If something isn't familiar to you, it's best to report it rather than ignore it. When reporting, please include as much information as possible about what's occurring. Collect and hold onto any insect samples, and if taking photos, include things like a ruler or a pen so the dimensions of insects, holes or other symptoms can be gauged.

If borers are coming out of furniture, timber, or wooden products like bowls, chopping boards or ornaments – report it as soon as possible and we will provide guidance from there.


