SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Shire Budget 2024/2025

At the time of writing, the full Council have not yet considered the final budget for the financial year 2024/2025. A committee meeting held on Thursday 18 August vetted the detail and has made certain recommendations to the full Council.

The discount of 10% on the early payment of rates has been retained but I would ask that ratepayers read their rate notice carefully to note the cutoff date for this discount to be claimed. The date is the date and no discount will be allowed for rates paid after this date. No exceptions.

We do tire of complaining of increasing costs in managing a budget but some of these costs are concerning. In general, the cost pressures for this year's budget have been significant.

Increased costs to:

- > materials for road and bridge construction;
- > a 30% increase in audit costs;
- > an increase for wages and salaries;
- > an increase in insurance premiums of 15%; and,
- > a <u>decrease</u> in funding of 5% from DFES for the engagement of the CESM Officer.

Vincent Street Trees

A representative from Ellenby Tree Farm commenced formative pruning of the Vincent Street trees and provided training to the Shire gardeners. Two dead Jacarandas have been replaced, and 3 Manchurian Pear trees have been planted in the Town Square. The trees in front of the Town Hall have also been pruned.

It is anticipated that such formative pruning is not required for at least 3 years.

Town Square and Civic Centre

The work to renovate the Old School Building into new Council Chambers and Civic Centre has now largely been completed. The remaining task to develop and landscape the area in front of the building, the Town Square, has commenced.

It is hoped to have the building and area ready for use by the end of August.

In Brief

- Spraying is well underway around the town footpaths, Shire land, and drains. The main airstrip has been sprayed, while the cross strip is yet to be completed. Rural roads are scheduled to commence on 12 August;
- Maintenance grading is continuing in the east of the Shire, including shoulder grading on the Kokeby East Road, Bremner Road, and Morbinning Road;
- In preparation for the extensive work to repair all the storm damage caused in March 2023, gravel is currently being pushed up in readiness for this work. It is anticipated that this work will commence shortly;
- Claims for emergency repairs to two bridges totalling \$24,550 have been submitted to Main Roads. The two bridges in question are the one in Vincent Street and one on Kokendin Road;
- In conjunction with the Beverley Soaring Society, the Shire continues to develop a plan to conduct an Air Show in March 2026; and,
- We have received no indication on the state of our application under Stage 2 of the Regional Precincts and Partnership Program for funds to carry out all the work on the swimming pool.

COUNTRY MEMBERSHIP

It's that time of year when country membership renewals will be being sent out. As the renewals now come from the Belmont Office in Perth, we suggest that you check your details carefully. Making sure all your family under the age of 18 are on your renewal. Unfortunately, once your children turn 18, they can no longer be on your family membership and will need to become a single member.

Membership fees are **Single \$64 & Family \$107.** If your children/child reside in Perth they cannot have a country membership and will need to have other health cover, should they ever require an Ambulance.

IF YOU OR YOUR FAMILY HAVE AN EMERGENCY, WOULD YOU LIKE AN AMBULANCE AND CREW TO BE AVAILABLE?

The Beverley Sub Centre has 8 active ambulance volunteers who make themselves available for the transfers of patients out of Beverley Hospital to Northam or a Metro hospital, as well as pick up folk from their homes, and attend motor vehicle accidents. On an average week the crews can do as many as 6-8 call outs. Remembering that 6 of our volunteer officers work be it full time or part time. Our volunteers give what time they can, no one is locked in to set times.

Volunteering can be very rewarding not only for yourself but also the community. The Beverley crews, attend stand by events such as football, pony club, motor X, tractor pull and the Beverley Agricultural Show. They make themselves available for up to 6 hours to be at an event just in case someone is injured. A crew is a two man or three-man crew to help anyone.

The majority of the calls we receive are transfers, rarely getting trauma or life-threatening emergencies, but we do occasionally, and all volunteers are highly trained to deal with these circumstances. We have a Community Paramedic that attends training and help us all to learn and be proficient in new skills and update old ones. Support from regional office and local crews should it ever be needed. The training department of St John set a programme each year, that we follow that covers a large range of skills that we learn.

The crews train twice a month on a Tuesday nights from 7pm to 9pm, from February to November. Van checks are conducted every two weeks, so that everyone is conversant with the layout of the ambulances and to replace any stock should it be needed. If being an ambulance officer isn't for you there is always a committee position available to run the Sub Centre.

It is imperative that you have a good sense of humour for coping with call outs and can enjoy the company of like-minded people. The group we currently have are a magic group who work together for the benefit of the Beverley community. Actually, a sense of humour is a must along with a current Driver's Licence. Uniforms are supplied. Willingness to learn and work with a happy group of self-minded people. Should you be keen to see if you would like to be a volunteer come along to a training night.

All we ask is that you help out the community by giving some of your time and attend training at least once a month, preferably twice.

WHAT IS BEVERLEY 2035

Beverley 2035 is a long-term vision for the Shire of Beverley to deliver economic benefit to Beverley over a long time frame. It is anticipated that the Beverley 2035 Concept Plan will provide direction for planning, funding and development over the next 10 years.

Council has identified the following long-term projects that form the Beverley 2035 vision, which are expected to benefit the community:

- 1. Refurbish the Beverley Aquatic Centre;
- 2. Industrial land servicing and release for development;
- 3. Residential land servicing and release for development;
- 4. Intergenerational Centre child care to aged care;
- 5. Essential worker accommodation;
- 6. Relocation of the Shire depot;
- 7. Caravan park expansion;
- 8. Avon River Park development and Trails plan implementation;
- 9. Creative spaces Cultural Centre; and

10. Recreation precinct development – Indoor Sports Centre and Function Centre.

* Please note that roads, bridges, waste and general Council functions remain a yearly top priority and are considered separate to the above planning.

Council has identified a \$5M funding stream called Regional Precincts and Partnerships Program that will allow us to develop the Beverley 2035 plan. It is essential that we determine our Community is in support of Councils strategic vision and understands the projects and the process. The funding program applications are due to be submitted in September.

Council invites the entire Community to attend one of our workshops facilitated by Mark Casserly to discuss the Beverley 2035 plan further including details of each of the identified long-term projects.



John Toohey arrived at the Station on July 27. John Toohey is an award-winning writer who has published many books and articles on history and photography. Having

gained an Honours degree in History at UWA, he lived in several countries, picking up an M.A in Art History along the way.

As an historian, photographer, documentary maker, and journalist he has previously been shortlisted for the prestigious Vogel Prize.

Whilst at the Station John is working on various projects and he has on exhibition photos of a muster at Kellerberrin – well worth seeing!

He works with analogue photography and will be conducting the following workshops:-

Composition in Landscape Photography

A workshop for analogue and digital photographers on composition, working from the basic rules of the golden mean to circumventing those rules to make your work more interesting. This workshop involves walking around Beverley in search of subjects.

Working with Film

A workshop for people who may have old cameras at home, have discovered or rediscovered film photography, from 35mm SLRs to medium format folding cameras, learn the tricks of the trade, from composing to making the correct exposure for the image you want.

Creating Stories with the Camera

A story has a beginning, a middle and an end, though not necessarily in that order. Learn how a few still images can be used to tell a story.

Firstly, our new **State President** is local woman, **Felicity Edwards**. Congratulations to Felicity on becoming our next State President. We look forward to working with you.







Midwinter Night at the Museum

AS the bitter chill of winter settled over our little town, the Beverley Historical Society prepared to unveil its treasures under the cover of a mid-winter night. The street, glowed with a golden wheatbelt sunset and twilight set-in.... Slowly, the first visitors arrived at the old hotel entrance, where warmly lit lanterns beckoned with a promise of historical wonders within.



It was the Friday, the 21st of June and tonight marked the mid-winter solstice. Tonight, our little Community *Dead Finish Museum* was open....after dark.


Inside, the air was crisp yet inviting, filled with the faint scent of leather, books, history and the hushed whispers of excited little and big people. The old hotel was alive with movement and voices and the artifacts seemed to hold secrets meant only for those willing to venture into the heart of the past.



The exhibits, bathed in a soft, ambient glow of torches and electric candles, revealed tales of bygone eras: from our ancient Balladong Peoples to local heroes of farming, art and culture. Each display told a story, inviting guests to pause and ponder the profound echoes of history that resonated through the halls.

Outside, the glorious Milky Way glowed in the night sky with the occasional shooting star for luck, which played its part in the spectacle, casting a veil of stars over the museum's courtyard and the nighttime

shadows luminated by torchlight, the gardens (*Thanks to the Beverley Garden Club*) and outside displays.



Attendees wandered from room to room, their breath visible in the cold air, as they admired the craftsmanship of ages past, and the artistry preserved in each artifact. Conversations sparked between strangers, bound by a shared fascination with the past and the timeless allure of discovery while the resident, zombie caretaker (*actually James Rodoreda*!) stalked about keeping a haunted eye on visitors.

Meanwhile, outside, the magnificent gardens, normally the haunt of ghosts & owls were alive with activity, talking and children laughing. The local 'wolfhound' (*Rosie Rodereda*) escorted children as they ventured into the darkness with a curious mix of awe & laughter.

As midnight approached, the visitors shared tales of the building's own history, weaving together anecdotes of its founders and the community that had nurtured it through generations. The night seemed to whisper secrets, each corner holding a promise of revelation for those who sought it.



As the clock struck twelve....*well, nine thirty actually*... signalling the end of this enchanting mid-winter night's journey, guests departed with hearts warmed by the magic of history, community and the enduring spirit of the season.

Such an event not only celebrates the museum's collections but also creates a memorable experience that bridges the gap between past and present, inviting the community to connect with its heritage in a unique and atmospheric way.

It was a great night for all, and the start of a winters tradition for years to come.

European wasps feed on grapes and other fruit, human and pet food, insects and dead animals like rats, kangaroos and bandicoots.

The European wasp 2023-24 season has drawn to a close with 94 nests found and destroyed in WA. Perth, Bunbury, Albany and Napier were all areas of invasion.

Every year fertilised queens of the European wasp (*Vespula germanica*) hitchhike into WA on vehicles, or in freight and cargo from interstate. They hibernate during winter and get to work on their nest in spring. These nests are predominantly hidden underground and within a few months, wasp numbers will reach the thousands. Locating these nests is like locating a needle in a haystack, except the haystack is 3/4 of WA, and the needle is a nest of angry wasps.

After 46 years of preventing the permanent establishment of this invasive species, the surveillance program has developed efficient early warning trapping systems and nest location techniques. This program targets the highest risk locations in WA, but it cannot cover everywhere. The success of the programs to date is due to continued public awareness and reporting. This is integral in regional and less populated areas, where there are fewer eyes to look out for the suspect signs of European wasps.

The nests located in Albany and Napier (about 20km north of Albany) this season, were due to

public reports of suspect wasps. The department worked quickly to confirm the species, then installed trapping grids to determine the extent of the wasp presence. Nests were located and destroyed, but further surveillance will be needed next season to check if there are more to find.

European wasps were also detected in the Perth Hills and in Bunbury this season. In prior seasons they have invaded Geraldton, Kalbarri, Kalgoorlie, Hyden, Australind, Busselton, Donnybrook and Albany.

What to look for

European wasps have these distinctive behaviours:

- **Scavenging** on human and pet food, dog bones and roadkill (carrion).
- Feeding on and damaging fruit like grapes, apples, pears and stone fruit.
- Nest underground nests are HUGE and grow to the size of a basketball in a single season.
 Underground nests and have a small (golf ball sized) entrance hole.



Put Yourself Over the Pits – What is the Fast Track Pit Stop?

A lot of blokes would appreciate the hard work and effort that goes into maintaining something we love, whether it's a new car, a valued piece of machinery, or our weekend toys (boat, motorbike, 4x4). If we don't service and look after our machines regularly it will eventually affect their performance and easy-fix problems may be compounded, costing us time and money.

So why is this any different to our wellbeing and health? To put it simply, if we neglect our wellbeing and health (whether it be physical, mental or social/spiritual) it will eventually catch up with us and could cost us more than just time and money. Do we think about the way this flows on to affect other facets of our lives, whether it be our relationships (family, work or business), loss of function or participation in the things we enjoy?

It is important to recognise that the ageing process throws up all sorts of changes and complications. Sometimes illness and diseases can't be avoided, however, something as simple as a 'routine service visit' or discussion with our GP or treating health professional may assist in the early detection and prevention of certain health and wellbeing issues.

At RMHI we have a simple but effective program that aims to empower men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health. The Fast Track Pit Stop® is related to the servicing of a vehicle and is a non-clinical, non-invasive way of helping us men become more aware and take charge of our own health and wellbeing. It involves a 3-Point Health Awareness Check:

- Waist Measurement/Chassis: A waistline of more than 102cm (men) and 88cm (women) gives us an increased risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes, some cancers, stroke, heart disease and high blood pressure. Long term storage of internal fat surrounding the heart, liver, pancreas and kidneys is just one indicator;
- 2. *Blood Pressure/Oil Pressure:* According to the Heart Foundation, high blood pressure is one of the main risk factors for heart disease, stroke and blood vessel disease.

So, it's important to firstly know our blood pressure, but also take steps to manage it if it's getting high;

3. Coping Skills/Shockies: We are all affected by life's ups and downs; participants are given 10 questions to help identify stress levels. Encouraging communication and help seeking is part of the problem-solving process.



We think it's about being there, allowing blokes to have a conversation, and listening. Life is hectic, people are busy, but it's about taking a minute to sit down, have a break and think about OUR health and wellbeing.

RMHI delivers the Fast Track Pit Stop® program across rural and regional WA and can be set up on the back of the ute, under a marquee or in a hall. Field days, agricultural shows and a whole range of community events and festivals provide our organisation with the opportunity to go where the blokes are, so look out for our red utes and come and have a chat. It's time to start thinking about our service schedule habits!


