SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Beverley 2035

With the assistance of Mark Casserley, the Shire held three meetings in the week commencing 12 August to inform the community, or as many as who could attend, about this project titled Beverley 2035.

Some attendees were concerned that the community was not consulted before the project began. That is true but there were reasons for this. When the Commonwealth Government announced the Regional Precincts and Partnership Program ("rPPP") under which this project is being run, time was of the essence and there was simply no time as a significant amount of preparation work was required just to write the application.

The prime aim for the Shire is to be successful in gaining some significant funding under Stage 1 to engage consultants for planning purposes so that the Shire is 'shovel ready' when an appropriate grant becomes available. If the Shire is successful, then the community will become involved through a Steering Committee to guide the projects.

Beverley Station Arts

Circuit West recently held their Annual Awards presentation evening for performing arts. There are three categories and the Beverley Station Arts Committee received the Pinnacle Award for Presenter of the Year. Congratulations to this volunteer group who provide a vital service to the community.

Beverley Agricultural Society

Congratulations also to the Agricultural Society for their endeavours in conducting the annual show on Saturday 17 August. Although the day threatened rain, an excellent crowd attended and a great time was had by all. The fireworks were a significant highlight yet again. So, to all the volunteers, thank you for your efforts without which Beverley would not be the same!

Town Square and Civic Centre

The internal work on the Civic Centre has now largely been completed. Work on the Town Square in front of the building has been commenced. All new concrete paths are in place. Three deciduous trees have been planted and seating will be established around these trees. Reticulation will be installed and the new turf will be laid after the end of September in order to avoid potential frost.

What is particularly pleasing about this project is that the Shire has been able to upgrade a Heritage listed building and put it to a practical use. It also means the current Administration Building will now have more space open up within.

Storm Damage

Finally, we are closer to actually having work done to rectify significant storm damage that occurred around the Shire in March 2023. A Pre-start meeting has been held with the contractors, MC Civil Contractors who expect to start on Monday 26 September.

In Brief

- It is anticipated that spraying around the town and Shire will be completed by the end of the month. 600 kilometres of road verges will be completed by the contractor which is a significant undertaking. Spraying both sides of roads means 1,200 kilometres of travel; and,
- Maintenance grading is continuing in the east of the Shire.

New film that became a community effort 'Just a Farmer' shines an authentic light on Australia's farming community. An uplifting and beautiful story of Alison, the wife of a farmer who suicided; a woman left to cope with the grief, the questions and the anger, as well as the farm, the kids and an alcoholic father-in-law.

Leila McDougall may be Australia's most unlikely filmmaker, The young farmer from Victoria has overcome dyslexia, beaten cancer, won Mrs Australia and Farmer Wants a Wife, and started a charity event to get farmers talking about mental health. Determined to draw attention to issues her community faces, Leila bluffed her way into acting school as the first step in making her own feature film about life on the land. Mrs McDougall's journey to 'Just a Farmer' was aired on ABC's *Australian Story* the end of April this year.

Suicide rates among farmers are alarming, with a farmer dying every ten days, despite feeding millions globally. BSA is screening this movie during Mental Health Week to coincide with the **Beyond Blue** event **Big Blue Table** with the aim of 'cooking up a conversation for mental health'. By being a host, we hope to raise funds for the beyond Blue Support Service. Donations welcome. ☺

‘STAYING IN PLACE’ IN BEVERLEY

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

Step 1 - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

Step 2 - My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 - If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

Step 4 - Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 - The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.



What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. *You may be eligible for:*

Personal Care - assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks

Domestic Assistance - supporting you to complete everyday household tasks

Home Maintenance - Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden ie. cleaning and gardening

Meal Assistance - Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

Transport Services - Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home

Social Support - Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies

Respite Care - Providing relief to carers

Clinical Care - Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan

If I'm worried about my ageing parent/s in Beverley, can I contact the CRC?

Absolutely, we understand that families don't always live in the same area and are unable to keep an eye on their loved ones. If you're concerned about a parent who seem to be struggling with everyday tasks, feel free to contact Sam at the CRC who can walk you through the process of requesting home support services through My Aged Care.

I can't get out and about at the moment, can you visit me at home to talk about the Staying in Place program?

We sure can. If you're unable to visit us at the CRC, we can arrange an at home visit to talk about the program, arrange assessments with My Aged Care, onboard you with InCasa if you've been allocated a HCP or help you change your service providers if you're not happy with your current provider. Call to make an appointment today.

A loved one or family member suddenly needs aged care. What can I do?

There are three options for you:

- For urgent medical care, call their doctor or emergency services on 000.
- For emergency respite care, contact Carer Gateway on 1800 422 737. For more information, you can go to the Carer Gateway website www.carergateway.gov.au.
- For ongoing care (longer than respite can provide), call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 to arrange an assessment. If you want to speak on their behalf, you will need to become their representative.

I would like an online account to access my My Aged Care account, how can I do this?

To set up an online account you need to register with My Aged Care first. To register with My Aged Care, call 1800 200 422 or apply for an assessment online. Once you're registered, you can sign in to your myGov account and link your online account to access your My Aged Care information. You only need to do this step once. If you need help setting up your MyGov account, call the CRC to **arrange an appointment** to set up your account.

Prince Charles at Avondale in 1979

Avondale opened with style



The opening of the Avondale Research Station by Prince Charles saw a particularly well attended occasion with the Agriculture Department putting up an outstanding display to interest both the public and Prince Charles.

Prince Charles was received by Minister of Agriculture Mr Dick Old and Shire President Mr Gordon Kilpatrick and Mrs Kilpatrick.

After being welcomed by Mr Old, Prince Charles complimented the Agriculture Department and the district for their efforts and foresight in developing the historical aspect of Avondale.

His jokes on life not being too bad in the old days and querying how the 1864 stripper in the museum had

been so well preserved went over particularly well.

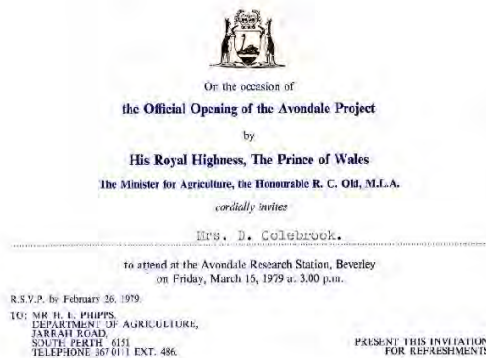
Prince Charles plants a tree

Invitation only meant a 'cuppa'



Some Beverley residents expressed dismay at the allocations of official invitations to the opening of Avondale Research Station.

Many old-time identity families were not official invited at all causing some dissatisfaction with the organisation of the event.

The Assistant Shire Clerk, Mr Ian Nicholson, said that the Department of Agriculture had only allocated a certain number of invitations to the Shire and these only covered Councillors, ex-Councillors and benefactors.

"It only entitled you to a free cup of tea anyway," he said. "No other preferential treatment was given to the holders of official invitations."

Organisers slighted Beverley

The visit was a great success at Avondale but not without its minor drawbacks.

It was a pity the Prince had not been driven through Beverley.

The people unable to attend Avondale would have had a chance to see him and at the same time would have recognised the town's immaculate turn out.

Beverley bedecked with bunting, virtually glistened as proof that it is by far the best looked after town in WA.

Organisers slighted the Beverley Shire Council disgracefully by asking them and their wives to be official guests as an apparent afterthought.

A host of members of parliament, their wives and families received so obvious preferential treatment that it was a disgrace.

Visiting Your GP – Tips for the Average Bloke

We often talk to blokes about the importance of visiting their GP for a routine service visit or *check-up* regardless of whether they feel unwell or not. These visits help you to stay health aware and if you do have specific risk factors, such as a family history of a certain disease, then regular check-ups may help your doctor pick up early warning signs. For example, high blood pressure may be an early warning sign of cardiovascular disease. For a lot of blokes this visit can be a bit daunting and at times a confusing process.



First and fore-most there are a lot of benefits in having a regular GP and practice that you visit. It gives you the opportunity to build a relationship over time, to the point where you are more comfortable talking openly about things. Your GP gets to know you and will have a better understanding of your health needs and concerns. Your medical history also stays under the one roof making it easier to keep things up to date.

With the average GP consultation time being around 10 to 15 minutes it's important that you have a clear idea of what you want to talk about (write a checklist starting with the most concerning issue). Usually for two or more health issues you will need to book a longer consultation time. Be prepared.

For a general health check, your doctor will want to talk to you about a range of stuff including your medical history, your family's history, your lifestyle, diet, weight and how much you exercise. Be honest about your health and your concerns and most of all, don't worry too much about being embarrassed. Doctors are usually very difficult people to shock and more than likely have seen or heard it all before.

We all need to take responsibility for our own health and wellbeing. A lot of guys have no idea of what their blood pressure is normally or what it means for that matter. You need to get to know your normal parameters and other things like cholesterol and PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) blood tests so you can engage in conversation with your GP about them. It often helps to keep your own record of results and a list of any medications you may be on and what they are for.

As we get older, we inevitably encounter the increased risk of developing health concerns such as prostate issues (over 40 years). Most GPs are pretty good at prompting us when needed but we still need to be an active participant. Don't feel intimidated, you have the right to request certain tests and question things the doctor suggests. After all, this is about you and your GP working together.

We recommend that under the age of 50 you should have a routine service visit at least every two years and for those over 50 at least once a year.

When visiting your GP, be prepared (take your own checklist) and be involved, it's your health, you are the expert on you.

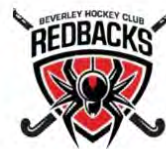

Backyard Buddies

A picture's worth a thousand mouldy samples



Photos demonstrating a range of features in focus, thumb for scale, close-up of flowers as well as most of the plant. The only thing missing is a picture in situ - it's important to see how and where the plant is growing. This is an aquatic plant but you wouldn't guess it!

Weird plant, who do you call? DPIRD!

Imagine if we could turn back the clock and stop some of WA's worst weeds from becoming established, saving millions in eradication costs and lost agricultural revenue, not to mention the financial and mental burden of management for landholders.

Well, biosecurity is everybody's concern and here at DPIRD we rely on eagle-eyed members of the public to raise the alarm when they see something out of place. Whether that's a weedy looking, unfamiliar plant growing in your paddock, a patch of plants you've never seen before rapidly overtaking a roadside, or just something suspicious being traded online.

How to take quality pictures

You've found something of concern but what then? A few well taken photos offer advantages; they can be easily submitted from anywhere, allow for a rapid assessment and often negate the need to submit a sample. When photographing, remember the three F's, **Features**, **Framing**, **Focus**.

Features – try to capture as many as you can, **fruit** and **flowers** are especially helpful, but so are the leaves, their arrangement, whether they

are hairy or smooth, differences between the top and bottom surface, any thorns or spines, aim to include as much detail as possible.

Framing – try to also capture the whole plant, it's great to have close ups of leaves etc but what are they from? Is it a tree, is it shrub, is it a vine? Stand back, snap a pic and show us.

Focus – the most important F of them all, there's no point diligently documenting these features if they aren't in focus!

These photography tips will hopefully prevent wasted efforts in submitting inadequate or mouldy samples, which will be unusable for identification.

If a sample is needed, we will advise on how to collect the most useful material (whole plants, flowers, fruit, seeds etc) and how to package and post it to maintain its freshness for our diagnosticians.

How to submit your photos

You can contact our Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) or report to the MyPestGuide team. Remember to include your contact details, the location of the plant(s) and your concerns when you are reporting. Our teams will review and provide identification and advice.
