SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



CEO Recruitment 2026

As a result of legislative changes brought in by the then Minister for Local Government, John Carey, any Local Government whose CEO has reached the end of a continuous 10-year term of employment under a contract or contracts, must advertise the position to ultimately engage a new CEO.

The CEO whose term of employment has reached the ten-year termination is eligible to reapply for the position if he or she so wishes.

This is yet another cost imposition on Local Government which places further strain on already strained budgets. Not to mention the upheaval of having to go through the process.

This process must be conducted confidentially through a Recruitment Panel which Council is required to establish. The Panel must consist of some Councillors, if not all, a qualified Consultant, and a person from outside Council who is designated as an Independent Representative.

Accordingly, Council has now established such a Panel which consists of:

- ☆ All members of Council:
- ☆ Mrs. Lydia Highfield as the qualified consultant; and,
- ☆ Mr. Lew Shaw as the Independent Representative.

Mr. Simon Marshall, the Deputy CEO, and Mrs. Ali Lewis, the Executive Assistant will work with the Panel to provide administrative support.

The first formal meeting of the Panel will be held on Wednesday 25th September.

16 Days in WA - Stop Violence Against Women

The Shire will be participating in the Department of Communities 16 Days in WA – Stop Violence Against Women awareness campaign by lighting Moort Wabiny Park in the colour orange. The campaign aims to increase awareness, share knowledge and innovations, encourage advocacy efforts and drive action across Western Australia to end gender-based violence including family, domestic, and sexual violence. It runs from 25th November, International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, to 10th December, International Human Rights Day. For 2024, the campaign theme is Stopping Family and Domestic Violence: Play your part. The campaign has drawn inspiration from the international 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-based Violence. Like the global campaign, the colour orange is used to represent a brighter future: one free from violence against women.


Now, that's the serious business out of the way, on to the fun!

It has been a busy month for the Beverley Men's Shed members, starting with our monthly raffle drawn on Saturday September 7, firstly a big thank you to the guys who joined Merv & Carol at the Lions Kiosk selling the tickets, and not forgetting our wonderful community who often will spend their time chatting before putting their hand deep into their pockets. The Royal Flying Doctor Service and the Men's Shed express their gratitude to the community both being equal benificiaries for your kind efforts.

And the winners are--- First prize of a \$100.00 meat voucher went to Michelle, Second prize was a meat voucher valued at \$50.00 was won by Ava, third prize of a \$25.00 meat voucher went to Paul, many thanks to T Bone & Sons for their assistance with the meat prizes, 'always buy local', and yes it was fitting that a much well loved local, Anne (who still had a big smile on her face when her win was mentioned the Tuesday after the draw) won the mystery prize---- always a mystery until opened!



The annual Veterans motor cycle reenactment of the early 1900's race from Beverley was



held again this year starting from the Men's Shed, with the riders leaving on Sunday September 8 between 9 and 10 am, the first 'race' being held in 1904, back then, the riders would take the train to the 'end of the line' in Beverley for the start point. Today it is more of an endurance for both man and machine, taking their time with extended breaks and finishing in Mundaring (via York & Toodyay) where at least four of the group were seen impressing the locals with their classic machines.

Such names as AJS, BMW, BSA, Norton & Velocette (all bikes must be pre 1931 to take part) were among the group with the oldest bike to participate being a 1903



Minerva Romania owned by Dennis, and the oldest motor bike registered in Western



Australia, and one of only 3 'known' examples in the world, the other two are in Victoria and a Museum in the USA. It is started via 'bycycle pedals' and has no brakes being preserved in its manufactured

condition. These guys are certainly dedicated with Bowe riding his BMW from Donnybrook to take part. And I hear you say 'what does this have to do with the Men's Shed?', at least one of our group is a member of the club and we extend the use of our fully resourced catering kitchen to the guys for their breakfast.

One of the 'perks' of being a Men's Shed member is not only the full use of the facilities including a vast range of tools and equipment, but also the support and knowledge of the group if required.

With spring upon us at last, yet another Motor Cycle group required some of our members assistance with marshalling, this time it was an event held over three days at the Northam Moto X.

The Railway Cottages

The railway came to Beverley in 1886. The town was for several years the terminus of the Government Railway. Passengers who wished to travel between Beverley & Albany on the Great Southern Line had to change trains and stay overnight in Beverley. The town was thus a hub for all types of rail workers – drivers, coalmen, fettlers, signalmen, etc. Rail workers appointed to Beverley on a permanent basis could be allocated one of the Railway Cottages.



The Railway Cottages were located next to the rail line adjacent to the old grain bin & opposite the loading platform (still there). The old Catholic Church in Queen Street was just up the hill.



The cottages were two semi-detached homes designed to house railway workers and their families. They were designed by George Temple Poole, the State Architect from 1885 to 1897. The buildings are typical of his style with high steep-pitched roofs and decorative touches such as brick-framed windows and the symmetrical pattern on the gables. The building as a whole formed a U shape with each cottage having a basic L shape. Each cottage was a reverse plan of the other. There was a corner verandah on the outside of each cottage and a small back verandah. A central chimney was shared in adjoining front rooms, while each had a separate kitchen chimney.

The cottages were demolished in December 1981. This rear view, after the roof has been removed, shows the three chimneys.
