SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



New Civic Centre

The Old School building has now been completed internally. The three rooms consist of:

- > a Function room for any formal events such as Citizenship Ceremonies. This room will also serve as the Public Gallery for Council meetings;
- the new Council Chambers with a new Board table and improved technology to enable video meetings with multiple attendees; and,
- > a multipurpose room which contains a kitchen and will also serve as a work room for Councillors between meetings.

The front of the building which we refer to as the Town Square, has finally had new turf laid which will take time to settle. Reticulation is complete and when the last two seats are installed the area will complement Vincent street. All that remains is to develop the garden beds either side of the new turf and the bed in front of the building.

Originally this area was a part of the Vincent Street redevelopment but due to cost had to be removed from the plan. It would seem that this has proven to be positive because the original design had the area covered with concrete similar to that of the footpaths. In the new design we have grass instead which would seem to be a more sensible covering. The best part is the new design and work is only a fraction of the cost of the original.

Local Government Convention

This event was held at the Convention Centre in Perth from Tuesday 8th October until Thursday 10th. Organised and run by the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA), it is an important occasion to meet Officers of WALGA and other Councillors to discuss the many issues confronting Local Government. I attended this convention along with CEO Stephen Gollan and Councillors Dee Ridgway, Chris Lawlor, and John Maxwell.

On Friday 11th the CEO and I attended a special forum run by WALGA to highlight the specific problems faced by all the smaller Councils in the Band 4 level. Our dependence on recurring Grant funding to be able to deliver services our communities expect is not well understood by State or Federal Governments. It proved to be a useful event although getting the message to the other two levels of Government is what matters.

<u>In Brief</u>

- MC Civil Contractors recently commenced work on remediating all the storm damage to roads and culverts which occurred in March 2023. The cost of this remediation is in excess of \$5 million and was due to be completed by 30th June 2025 but with delays, an extension has been granted.
- > Bremner Road bridge. The contract for this repair has been let to Advanteering Contractors the firm that rebuilt the bridges on the York / Northam road. Given the proximity to harvest, this work will not commence until mid-January 2025.
- > Bridge 3197 York-Williams Road. Main Roads are conducting this project directly and are yet to let a contract. In any event, the work was not expected to commence before mid-January 2025.
- The Shire crew are currently working on the shoulders of the Kokeby East road in readiness for harvest.
- Currently the Shire are applying for more bridge funding.

Main Roads Roadworks

York Williams Road - Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

Great Southern Highway - Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing - Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

Great Southern Highway - Shoulder Sealing - York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.







But to every positive in life there is always a negative, and as you can see from the photo, one of the 'girls' is hungry, and with all the paddocks still under crop by the lessee, and little feed around any **bales of hay** would certainly be welcomed to keep these wonderful Farm

There are many items in the Museum collection associated to these fine steeds, this breed of horses together with bullocks and sheer hard work by humans opened up the land for today's generation to be able to eat, cereals (and other products) don't just appear on the supermarket shelf by themselves, but I am sure the reader already knows that, so bring along the younger generation to not only enjoy meeting these fine beasts, but also to learn about our Wheatbelt Farming History in the Museum.

injector was removed and sent to Perth for servicing and was lost, (well that is the story I was told), we are working on getting a replacement so all donations are gratefully received.


With many of the group having sickness and other commitments during the past month not a

'STAYING IN PLACE' IN BEVERLEY

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

Step 1 - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

Step 2 – My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 – If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

Step 4 – Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 - The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.



What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. You may be eligible for:

Personal Care – assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks

Domestic Assistance – supporting you to complete everyday household tasks

Home Maintenance – Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden ie. cleaning and gardening

Meal Assistance – Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

Transport Services – Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home

Social Support – Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies

Respite Care – Providing relief to carers

Clinical Care – Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan

If I'm worried about my ageing parent/s in Beverley, can I contact the CRC?

Absolutely, we understand that families don't always live in the same area and are unable to keep an eye on their loved ones. If you're concerned about a parent who seem to be struggling with everyday tasks, feel free to contact Sam at the CRC who can walk you through the process of requesting home support services through My Aged Care.

I can't get out and about at the moment, can you visit me at home to talk about the Staying in Place program?

We sure can. If you're unable to visit us at the CRC, we can arrange an at home visit to talk about the program, arrange assessments with My Aged Care, onboard you with InCasa if you've been allocated a HCP or help you change your service providers if you're not happy with your current provider. Call to make an appointment today.

A loved one or family member suddenly needs aged care. What can I do?

There are three options for you:

- For urgent medical care, call their doctor or emergency services on 000.
- For emergency respite care, contact Carer Gateway on 1800 422 737. For more information, you can go to the Carer Gateway website www.carergateway.gov.au.
- For ongoing care (longer than respite can provide), call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 to arrange an assessment. If you want to speak on their behalf, you will need to become their representative.

I would like an online account to access my My Aged Care account, how can I do this?

To set up an online account you need to register with My Aged Care first. To register with My Aged Care, call 1800 200 422 or apply for an assessment online. Once you're registered, you can sign in to your myGov account and link your online account to access your My Aged Care information. You only need to do this step once. If you need help setting up your MyGov account, call the CRC to **arrange an appointment** to set up your account.
