## SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### **New Civic Centre - Town Square**

It is pleasing to see the front of the new Civic Centre, referred to as the Town Square, has now been completed. Seating, lighting, reticulation, and a new lawn are now installed. This project was initially part of the Vincent Street redevelopment and involved laying concrete over the area with various seating and lighting.

This had to be abandoned as the cost of approximately \$250,000 took the cost of the Street redevelopment beyond the budget. As it has transpired, this has proven to be a positive decision on a number of levels. The lawn is a far more appropriate surface for a Beverley summer and the cost of the whole project is much less than half the original plan.

Remaining work to complete this whole project includes planting in the garden beds around the Wishing well, the front of the building, and the garden bed adjacent to the Post Office. The formation and sealing of the entire area behind the building and the Shire offices will provide additional parking for staff and the public.

#### Retirement Village.

An Application for Planning Approval has been received from a private developer to develop and construct a 50-unit Retirement Village at 18 Hunt Road (Lot 4). This development is located at the southern end of Queen and Dawson Street, near the Light Industrial area. As required by the Planning & Development Regulations, formal advertising of the proposal commenced on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2024 and will end on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2024.

This development should not be confused with the Shire owned Hunt Road village.

From a Council perspective, this application fits perfectly with the concept of Beverley 2035 and will be a positive addition to the facilities available in Beverley. Notwithstanding, there is yet to be formal consideration by Council before any approval is granted. Discussion on this needs to be far reaching and detailed.

#### **Proposed Air Show**

The <u>proposed</u> Air Show planned for March 2026 is progressing. The logistics of such a large event are being identified slowly. Discussions with Paul Bennet Airshows to run the event and provide the aircraft and displays for the day, are ongoing. It is also hoped to have other aircraft to overfly the event during the day, as well as a static display on the cross strip with aircraft from the RFDS, the Police and other parties.

#### In Brief

Bremner Road bridge. The contract for this repair has been let to Advanteering Contractors. It was planned to commence this work in January 2025 but Main Roads have advised that further consultation on cultural matters is required, possibly delaying the start by one month.

The road within the Airport precinct will be completely sealed by the time this Blarney is published. Sealing will be from Bremner Road/Lukin Street intersection right up to the filling station for the firefighting aircraft. This work will provide a welcome addition for the Air Show.

Finally, as this is the last Blarney for 2024 and we reflect on the year past I would like to thank the Councillors and all staff for their efforts this year and to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

#### Main Roads Roadworks

#### York Williams Road - Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

#### Great Southern Highway - Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing - Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

#### Great Southern Highway - Shoulder Sealing - York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.

Construction is likely to now start in February 2025 although approval timeframes are not definite. We apologise for the further delay and any inconvenience this may cause.

#### Red Plate, One Mate

From **1 December 2024**, all red P-plate drivers in WA, both current and future, can drive with one passenger only. This new law will make it safer for young drivers by limiting distractions from multiple passengers in the first six months of having a provisional licence, which is the riskiest period of their driving careers.

Red P-platers driving with more than one passenger will incur a \$200 fine and two demerit points. This penalty is the same as the midnight to 5am curfew for red P-plate drivers.

### Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires


The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.

# Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

#### **Drinking water**

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.





#### **November Artist-in-Residence**

Fenella Dexheimer and husband Fritz enjoyed their stay immensely at the Station and found their trips to Yenyenning Lake was the perfect inspiration for Fenella to paint in her preferred medium of pastels.



Fenella opened the gallery most days during the month and was surprised that the beginning of the week tended to be the busier time for visitors. She relished the opportunities to chat about her art; and sold some too!

#### **December Artists-in-Residence**

**Paul Innes** will be at the Station from **December 3 – 15**. Paul is a contemporary artist from Mullaloo who



makes abstract paintings about nature. He interprets and explores the environment with his art. In his words, "In my artwork, sensory elements of the natural environment are done through composition, colour, tone, mediums, texture, mark-making

and paint.

I'm inspired to discover my own visual language, this process I engage in is a journey of discovery where I travel across the canvas surface to produce paintings that speak a visual truth and expose fissures of discovered life.

Mixing colours, glazing, marking the canvas with varying lines that interact with passages of thick, warm paint are reason enough to pull on my paint-covered apron every morning. I reach for a brush like a

hiker/rambler choosing a favoured walking stick before heading out the door on a journey filled with the unknown and untold opportunity. Each Painting is part of a bigger story still being written and inexorably moving from one chapter to another like a page-turning edge-of-your-seat dime-book thriller. Always moving forward - delighting in the results and challenges along the way."

Laura Heffernan will be Artist in Residence from December 16 – 31. Laura is a multidisciplinary artist and theatre designer based in Perth. She studied at the School of Contemporary Arts ECU and WAAPA where she graduated with a BA in Design for Performance in 2009. Since then, Laura has gone on to design and design assist for companies such as WA's Black Swan State Theatre Company, The Last Great Hunt, PICA, Deckchair and WAYTCO.

She has created site specific artworks for business and events around Perth such as the City of Perth, the Perth Fashion Festival, Beaufort Street Festival, Pigeonhole and The Art Gallery of WA and has just completed a residency at Cool Change Contemporary. Working across installation, painting, drawing, sculpture and production design, Laura's practice is confessional and subjective, often investigating themes of romantic limerence and internal dialogue.

During her residency at the Station Laura will continue to develop her arts practice by reflecting on our human need for connection and how this sits alongside our knowledge of death. Working with paint and mirror-like craft materials, she will explore this theme through a process of intuitive mark making and various handicraft techniques.

#### Year 2s from BDHS Experience the 'Olden Days'

Fifteen students from Year Two at Beverley District High School made the trek on foot from the school in John St up the hill and down to Morrison St to arrive at the Dead Finish Museum on Tuesday morning 28 October 2024. They were greeted by a group of volunteers made up of members of the Beverley Historical Society and some of their friends.

By way of introduction, the students heard a little bit about the Dead Finish building and about washing in the olden days before electric washing machines when clothes & household items were boiled in a large copper. The students were then divided into four groups and made their way to 4 olden days activities set up at the Museum.

On the verandah the children soaped & scrubbed the clothes on a wash board, rinsed & 'blued' then pegged them on the line with dolly pegs. Inside the first room, silver cutlery & tableware were cleaned and polished with attention to detail. In the big meeting room a variety of clothes, hats, beads & belts from times past were donned and the resulting effect admired in the mirror. Then in the Beverley Room the pupils sat at the old wooden desks to try writing with nib pens dipped in ink. They had to be very well behaved as the teacher had a cane & a leather strap from the days when corporal punishment was law.

Following these experiences the groups were shown around the Museum & the garden before sitting down to some refreshment. Cordial, fairy bread & ANZAC biscuits were eagerly consumed. The students were given two gifts: a small bag of jelly lollies and a 'piece of history' in the form of an Australian Penny from before decimal currency.

The children were well-behaved and greatly enjoyed this look back into times past. Thank you to Mrs Gollen and her assistant, Chris for bringing the students. President Glenys was unable to be present on the day but helped beforehand & afterwards. At the Museum thanks to BHS members Erica, Delys, Maree, Vivienne, Robyn and Morag with special thanks to community members Raewyn, Lee, Elaine, another Robyn and Ingrid. BHS members, Sheila & Ted prepared the pennies, as they have done for many years.

#### **'STAYING IN PLACE' IN BEVERLEY**

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

**Step 1** - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

**Step 2** – My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 – If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

**Step 4** – Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 – The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.



#### What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. You may be eligible for:

Personal Care – assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks

**Domestic Assistance** – supporting you to complete everyday household tasks

**Home Maintenance** – Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden ie. cleaning and gardening

Meal Assistance – Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

**Transport Services** – Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home

Social Support – Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies

**Respite Care** – Providing relief to carers

**Clinical Care** – Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan

#### If I'm worried about my ageing parent/s in Beverley, can I contact the CRC?

Absolutely, we understand that families don't always live in the same area and are unable to keep an eye on their loved ones. If you're concerned about a parent who seem to be struggling with everyday tasks, feel free to contact Sam at the CRC who can walk you through the process of requesting home support services through My Aged Care.

## I can't get out and about at the moment, can you visit me at home to talk about the Staying in Place program?

We sure can. If you're unable to visit us at the CRC, we can arrange an at home visit to talk about the program, arrange assessments with My Aged Care, onboard you with InCasa if you've been allocated a HCP or help you change your service providers if you're not happy with your current provider. Call to make an appointment today.

#### A loved one or family member suddenly needs aged care. What can I do?

There are three options for you:

- For urgent medical care, call their doctor or emergency services on 000.
- For emergency respite care, contact Carer Gateway on 1800 422 737. For more information, you can go to the Carer Gateway website www.carergateway.gov.au.
- For ongoing care (longer than respite can provide), call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 to arrange an assessment. If you want to speak on their behalf, you will need to become their representative.

#### I would like an online account to access my My Aged Care account, how can I do this?

To set up an online account you need to register with My Aged Care first. To register with My Aged Care, call 1800 200 422 or apply for an assessment online. Once you're registered, you can sign in to your myGov account and link your online account to access your My Aged Care information. You only need to do this step once. If you need help setting up your MyGov account, call the CRC to **arrange an appointment** to set up your account.
