SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Electric Vehicle Dual Fast Charging Station

With the construction of the Cornerstone Building, provision was allowed for the installation of a charging station for electric vehicles. Inaction on installing this was solely due to the cost of such a station but things have finally changed and Council has partnered with Sonic Charge who will install, maintain, and operate the Charger at no cost to the Rate payer. It will be a dual station allowing two vehicles to fast charge at any time. To the skeptics of electric vehicles who may wonder why even go to the bother of installing this facility, it was a no brainer as it risked Beverley being alone without one thus losing the visits from people with electric vehicles.

Trails Planning

The Shire was recently successful in receiving funding from the WA Bicycle Network Grants Program 2024 for the feasibility, concept, and design of the Commonage Hill Trail Project. Studies are expected to commence in July 2025.

In a separate project, the Shire of Pingelly in conjunction with the Shires of Beverley, Brookton, Cuballing, and Narrogin have developed a scope and initial concept for a transport trail from Beverley to Narrogin, officially called the Beverley to Narrogin Transport Trail. The scope of the trail has been completed including a pre-feasibility assessment, corridor identification and in principle agreement between the respective local governments. This project is also the recipient of successful funding from WA Bicycle Network Grants Program 2024 to further develop the concept plans in conjunction with the local communities and key stakeholders.

Bridge and Road works within the Shire

Everyone will now be aware that the York Williams Road south of the Waterhatch Road is closed to traffic other than local traffic. Work has finally commenced on the construction of a new two-lane bridge to replace the single lane that has been there for many years. A bridge built for horse and cart is finally being brought into the 21st century. We appreciate that over the next six-months this will prove an inconvenience to many with extra distance and travel time but it is a small price to pay for finally having something more appropriate and safer.

The Bremner Road bridge continues to lag due to Ministerial inaction as we await signoff of the Section 18 to commence the work. For the contractors this is even more frustrating as their work timetable does not permit this sort of delay.

Waterhatch Road widening is expected to commence in February, starting at Kokendin Road and heading 2kms east towards the townsite. Reseals of the widening works completed last year on the Mawson, Morbinning, and Waterhatch Roads will commence on 28th January.

In Brief

Main Roads have provided the following updates: Great Southern Highway – Beverley to Brookton; shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is currently due for completion by the end of March 2025.

Great Southern Highway – York to Beverley; shoulder sealing is due to commence at the end of January 2025 until May 2025. There will be lane closures, speed restrictions and temporary traffic lights in place, so please allow extra travel time.

Roads Roadworks

York Williams Road - Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

Great Southern Highway - Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing - Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

Great Southern Highway - Shoulder Sealing - York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.





Drums will now be accepted at the Beverley Refuse Site DrumMuster compound every **Monday** between 9.00am & 3.00pm.

Protocols **must** still be followed and all drums must be cleaned thoroughly in accordance with DrumMuster requirements.

Our collection site is accessible every Monday when the Beverley Tip is open.

Load your trailer with clean drums, head to the Beverley Tip, ask the Refuse Site Manager for the drumMuster folder (including cage key and declarations) and stack your drums in the cage, fill out the declaration and return the folder. The attendant can sign the declaration if required.

Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires


The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.

Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.

How do EScripts work?

Your doctor will send you a link by SMS or email. The link has a unique QR code, known as a digital 'token' — this token is your prescription to take to a pharmacy. Your token will get scanned by the pharmacist, so they can access your prescription and give you your medicine.



What is memory loss?

Everyone forgets things sometimes. Perhaps you can't always remember where you left your keys or think of the word you need straightaway.

Some memory loss can also happen as a part of normal aging. These small changes in memory don't interfere with your everyday life.

If you find yourself forgetting important things more often, this is memory loss. Major changes in your memory are not normal at any age.

If you are getting forgetful or confused, you might be worried it's dementia. There are also other conditions that can lead to problems with your memory.

When should I see my doctor?

You should see your doctor if your memory problems are affecting your daily life. It may be a relative or friend who notices your memory problems before you do.

It's best to get it checked as soon as you notice there's a problem. This is because many causes of memory loss can be treated.

Also, getting a diagnosis can take more than one visit to the doctor. Once you know your diagnosis you can find ways to live with it.

Beverley Agricultural Museum News

No doubt many of you will be itching to find out the answers to last months quiz so here they are----

Mid last year I received a phone call at home from a guy who said he would like to visit the Agricultural Museum, and that he was in Meckering and passing through the area, at first I was a little reluctant to obligage given I was busy at the time, but if you put your name to something, you need to follow through with your obligations. Well neither Graham or I were disapointed, (although he did seem a little upset that his fathers Stuart Tank was really hard to view being surronded closely by other items.....something I intend to rectify) and we chatted for over 2½ hours, and later he provided me with some black and white photos and the complete history.

The Stuart Tank --After the second
world war had
ended the
purchase of new
agricultural
machinery was
extremly limited
until the industry
got back on its feet
after many of the
factories were used
for the war effort.



And with the defence department now having a lot of machinery excess to demand, and with no tractors available, some farmers turned to ex-military vehicles instead.

Tom Moore had land to clear on his farm in Meenaar and so purchased a Stuart Tank from Holtfreters of Northam for 400 pounds in May 1950, the previous owner being G. McGillan of Bruce Rock. It was railed from Belka to Meenaar.

The Trurret had to be removed before it could be used due to its weight and was sold for scrap. As these Tanks usually had a three person crew, Tom set about doing a converstion to



the controls to a one man operation with him centrally postioned so he could see all around. He found that the Tank would travel well on the Sand Plains when the ground was moist but once dry it was a very different matter, this caused a problem when

needing to fight bush fires, so a Bren gun carrier (seen in background of photo) was

purchased and converted for the purpose (this is not the unit that is in the Avondale Farm picnic area) this was later sold for \$500 in the farm clearing sale.

Part two of this interesting story you will have to wait another month to read.



Our restoration and

maintenance crew are still working during the 'public closed' period and hopefully we will be able to provide a better and more informative display when we reopen again.


