# SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



## Regional Precincts and Partnership Program ("rPPP")

As reported earlier, there are two stages for this program. Stream 1 is for Grants to enable parties to pay for planning. Ranging from \$500,000 to \$5 million. Stream 2 is for Grants to assist in construction of the planned projects. Ranging from \$5 million to \$50 million. The Shire had applied under Stream 2 for funds for the swimming pool redevelopment and that was lodged in February 2024. Recent notification was received that that application was unsuccessful. Unfortunately, it means that the Shire is not able to carry out the plan for the complete redevelopment of the area. Lesser work will now be carried out.

#### **Swimming Pool Redevelopment**

The Shire had previously been notified of a successful grant not related to rPPP for this work but it fell far short of all that is required to redevelop the swimming pool precinct as planned some years ago.

Having missed out on Stream 2 as discussed above, the Shire does have sufficient funds to undertake some of the more urgent work to maintain and improve the pool. Work that will be carried out includes: new pump house and plumbing, new ramp and stair access, new children's and learner's pool, a new lining for the bowl, and some landscaping. This work is scheduled to commence in April and be concluded by the end of October 2025.

## **Bridges within the Shire**

Work is well underway on the construction of the new bridge on the York Williams Road. It is progressing with the installation of the two abutment footings. There was an issue with foundation material at abutment two on the south side but this has now been resolved. Widening of the road to line up with the new bridge has also begun.

The Bremner Road bridge is another story. The bureaucratic delays are becoming a nightmare for the Shire with delay upon delay. An initial meeting with Main Roads was held on-site on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2023. Work that was supposed to commence on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2025 is still awaiting the appointment of the observers to monitor the work. The contractors have already lodged a financial claim for their costs in this delay.

#### **Electric Vehicle Dual Fast Charging Station**

With the construction of the Cornerstone Building, provision was allowed for the installation of a charging station for electric vehicles. It is pleasing to report that the station is now installed and should be operational by early March.

#### In Brief

- > The steel mesh grill under the water in the Vincent Street fountain has rusted out and has now been replaced.
- Westdale Road/York-Williams Road intersection has had Hotmix laid while the north leg on the York Williams Road has been extended all to allow for the heavy vehicles carting through to the Great Southern Highway.
- Proposed Retirement Village 18 (Lot 4) Hunt Road. The Initial Public Notification (Planning Advertising) concluded on the 6<sup>th</sup> December 2024 a number of submissions were received, including some objections. A formal planning application is yet to be considered by Council.
- Nurses' Old Quarters. Laura Gray (Heritage Consultant) was formally appointed to do a Heritage Assessment as per the provisions of the *Government Heritage Disposal Process*. A site visit is scheduled for 20 February 2025
- ➤ Shire Depot CCTV Install. The installation by Redfish of CCTV at the Shire Depot is scheduled for 24 26 February 2025.

#### Main Roads Roadworks

#### York Williams Road - Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025. Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley. The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

#### Great Southern Highway - Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing - Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

#### Great Southern Highway – Shoulder Sealing – York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.



As we have so few volunteers to attend such events, they need time to organize their time too.

Each month I say how great the small group of Volunteers are be it Crew or Committee, but this month, we as a group think we should praise our wonderful, caring Hospital Staff. They are a bonza group of nurses, always greet us with a smile and often some cheek which makes patients smile as well and puts all at ease. 



Osteoporosis is a common condition affecting the bones of both men and women. The test takes up to 2 minutes and you remain fully clothed during the scan. As you get older your risk of osteoporosis increases; act now to improve your bone health.

# What is Osteoporosis?

- Broken bones due to osteoporosis are also known as fragility fractures. For people with osteoporosis, even a minor trip or fall can cause fracture
- Any bone can be affected, but the most common sites are the spine, wrist and hip
- It is often call a "silent disease" because there are usually no symptom's until a fracture occurs.

# 100 Years of Beverley C.W.A

In October 1925, a group of women got together and formed the local branch of the Country Women's Association. Mrs Fisher was elected as our first branch President. Their first objective was to acquire their very own Rest Room.

Mrs Fisher remained the branch president until 1928, when she was elected the second State President.

Mrs Mary Adamson then became our second branch president. She also went on to become the first president of the newly created Western Division.

During Mrs Fisher's State Presidency, the first edition of the C.W.A magazine, The Country Women of Western Australia was published by Mr Holman of Beverley. In 1936, the branch finally opened their very own rest room, where it stands now.

# Beverley Agricultural Museum News

# Our Stuart Tank --- Part two.

Tom Moore's unit was powered by a Rotory Engine developed for aircraft so running on aviation fuel, according to the 'interweb' some Tanks were also powered by conventional Petrol engines, and later a Diesel engine unit was supplied mostly for the Russian war effort —they were not very popular due to a short supply of Diesel.

As you can see from the photo Tom, made a frame to attach two ploughs and drills, during the first seeding the clutch had to be replaced and the additional weight caused gearbox issues. R Moore's in Perth were approached to supply new gears but they had disposed of their samples so Tom dismantled the gearbox and sent his gears away to be copied, with a cost of 80 pounds for the new set.



The Stuart Tank handled well on the sand plain s and was used for land clearing. Towards the gravel ridge there were some isolated Wandoo and Salmon Gum trees, on one occasion Tom was pushing over a Salmond Gum and up came the roots and hoisted the Tank into the air leaving it teetering free of the ground and balancing on the roots of the tree, Tom recalled that each movement he made caused the Tank to move, such was the pivotal point, his neighbours came to help and the excess branches and roots were cut off allowing the Tank to be pulled off using two Tractors.

As you can imagine with so much weight the Stuart Tank was very thirsty, so as soon as conventional Tractors were available the Tank was seldom used. Donated to the Beverley Agricultural Macinery Museum in May 1979 together with a new set of Tracks.

Many thanks to Graham Moore for suppling the true story of 'The Tank'.

The Museum is currently closed for cleaning and renovations.

# Big changes to the aged care sector

From 1 July 2025, Support At Home will replace the existing Home Care Packages Program and Short-Term Restorative Care (STRC) Programme. The aim of this reform is to help older people live independently at home for longer. Around 1.4 million people in Australia will benefit from the new Support at Home program by 2035.

#### It will provide:

- more tailored support for older people, with 8 ongoing levels of funding of around \$78,000 per year
- · support for home modifications
- · fast access to assistive technology, including a new equipment loan scheme.

#### If you:

- receive a Home Care Package
- · are on the National Priority System, or
- approved for a package on 30 June 2025

you will receive a Support at Home budget that aligns to your current package level (or approved level when available). Home care recipients will also keep any Home Care Package unspent funds under the new Support at Home program.

Transitional arrangements in relation to participant contributions will apply for home care recipients, older people who were on the National Priority System and those who had been approved for a package at 12 September 2024. A no worse off principle will apply, with contributions set to ensure these people do not pay higher contributions than they pay in the Home Care Packages Program.

Support at Home will have 8 classifications for ongoing services, replacing the 4 Home Care Package levels. Each classification will have a budget for participants to access services. A new participant's classification and budget will be determined at assessment based on their needs. Existing Home Care Package clients and those waiting on the National Prioritisation System will not be reassessed into one of the new classifications when the new program starts.

# How will this affect me?

I'm on a Home Care Package, what does this mean for me?

No worse off principle for existing Home Care participants.

#### Packages

All individuals who have a Home Care Package on 30 June 2025 will maintain the same level of funding and retain any unspent funds under Support at Home. Individuals on the National Priority System or who have been approved for a package as of 30 June 2025 will receive a Support at Home budget equivalent to their approved package level when one becomes available. If these participants have another assessment, and are entitled to a higher level of funding, they will move to the new Support at Home classification when one becomes available.

#### Contributions

A no worse off principle will apply to the contributions arrangements for people who, on 12 September 2024, were either receiving a package, on the National Priority System, or assessed as eligible for a package. These participants will be no worse off because of the reforms: they make the same contributions, or lower, than they would have had under Home Care arrangements. When these participants move to residential care, they will stay on the existing contribution arrangements unless they opt to move to the new program. Changes to accommodation payments in residential care would still apply to these participants, since accommodation payments are an agreement negotiated between the resident and their provider.

If I'm receiving CHSP services (previously known as HACC), will I be affected?

If you receive services through Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP) there will be no immediate impact. CHSP won't transition to Support at Home until after 1 July 2027. \*Latest update from https://www.myagedcare.gov.au

In mediaeval times on Mothering Sunday church goers would visit their "mother" church in Lent - the main church or Cathedral of the area. As such it became an occasion for family reunions and honouring mothers. A special cake called a simnel cake is baked in celebration. A "bring and share" meal will be follow.

### February 2025 Artist-in-Residence

Maureen (Mo) Faas was Artist in Residence from the second half of January to mid-February and loved her stay at the station albeit fairly quiet due to the usual fewer visitors during January and February.

community. She focuses on making small and playful pieces that don't rely on architectural framing to invoke the childlike wonder of sunlight through coloured glass. She invites the community to drop in on her studio work any time during her residency, and particularly at her Open Studio on Sunday 16 March. Gallery open hours, 11.00 - 3.00pm, where anyone can learn how to cut and solder glass, and see and buy any of her work, should they wish to.



Rachel Kooi Lang Beh, aka Rachel Waller, joins us at the Station from March 19 - April 14. Born in Penang, Malaysia, Rachel is an award-winning textile artist turned painter. Since picking up the paint brush in 2020, she has never looked back. Drawing

inspiration from her surrounds, and also diving deep

into her senses, lived experiences of a cross-cultural background, Rachel is most at home when painting intuitively, much like she used to as a textile artist.



Jo Rhodes will also be residing at the Station with Rachel. Coming from a family line of milliners and tailors, Jo is a talented maker using locally sourced Alpaca fleeces from locations in the South West of WA. Jo hand processes

the fleeces to spin into yarns which are used for knitting, crochet and weaving into bespoke knits and accessories. The hand processed fleeces are also used in the making of Jo's signature, sought after range of hand felted hats.

During the residency there will be spinning, weaving and tapestry weaving demonstrations using a variety of fibres and materials. Jo will also have her rigid heddle loom warped up for people to "have a go", and some little card looms for visitors to do a tiny woven tapestry that they can take home.

WORKSHOP: Rachel and Jo have not finalized details for a workshop at this stage but will happily organise something along the way.

### BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents Bill Whitney 1944 – 2024

William Harold Whitney was born at home in Farnborough, Kent, England on 23 November 1944. He was the eldest child born to Harold, a London bus driver, and Phoebe, a government civil servant. Four years later his brother, Robert, was born.

Bill and his family emigrated to Western Australia in 1956. They lived at Armadale first before buying a home in Gosnells. Bill went to Armadale primary and high schools before leaving to take up an apprenticeship as a carpenter with the railways. He was soon fed up with repairing chairs

and fly-screen doors and left to work with a contractor building pig bins around the wheatbelt. Being a good worker, he was asked, and accepted, work on the bins themselves. About 1963 he was in

charge of the wheatbin at Moorine Rock.

It was from here that he enlisted in the regular army and signed on for six years. He was assigned to three different regiments in that time: 4RAR, 2RAR & 9RAR. He saw overseas service in Malaya and Borneo, and did two tours in South Vietnam.

On discharge from the military in 1969 he worked on mine sites in the Pilbara, WA, and the Gove Peninsular, Northern Territory.

In 1973 Bill married Morag at the Registry Office in St Georges Tce, Perth. After a couple of years renting in South Perth & Como, they bought a home in Kelmscott.

There was great need for bricklayers in the early 1970s so Bill gained a bricklaying certificate & worked on new houses for several years. After a while he got into Refractory Bricklaying, a precise bricklaying skill required for lining or re-lining furnaces. This took him to manufacturing centres in Whyalla, SA, Gladstone, Qld & local sites such as Worsley near Collie & the Perth Mint.

This work took a toll on his back which had been injured during his military service. The Army had recognised the injury from the beginning and after 30 years he was granted a TPI pension. This allowed him to give volunteer time to football. He became increasingly involved with the Kelmscott Football Club taking on various positions in the club, He was awarded Life Membership for his services in 1999.

In the meantime, Morag was appointed to Marvel Loch Primary School & they moved into this rural area near Southern Cross for 2½ years. This was the catalyst for a move out of the metro area. They bought a house in Beverley in 1999 and moved in in the year 2000.

About this time, as his fellow Army mates were retiring, Bill & Morag were able to travel all over Australia attending various Army Reunions from Bunbury to Townsville. He even got back to Vietnam while on a cruise in early 2019.

Bill loved Beverley. He joined in where he could and made new friends. He was a member of the RSL & always attended ANZAC Day & other remembrance services. He played social bowls & golf while he was able. Of course, he is best remembered for his love of a draught beer & his daily attendance at the pub.

Bill was a member of the Beverley Historical Society for a while and the Dead Finish Museum greatly benefitted from his handiwork with repairs, and woodwork projects. Because of his aptitude with numbers, he was the efficient Auditor of the BHS finances from 2013.

Bill became increasingly unwell with various ailments in the last few years. He died at Northam Hospital on 20th November 2024 just 3 days short of his 80th birthday. He is buried in Smith St cemetery.

The first general meeting of the Society is on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March at 1:30pm in the Dead Finish Museum. New members just turn up.


