## SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### CEO Recruitment

Under changes to the Local Government Act, Councils must advertise the position of CEO once the incumbent CEO has reached the end of a ten-year contract. This is the case in Beverley where Mr. Stephen Gollan will come to the end of his current contract on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2026.

While it might seem to be early, Council is conscious that the matter be settled before the elections in October 2025 so the position can be filled seamlessly to take effect from the 26<sup>th</sup> January 2026.

As such, the position will be advertised next month and the closing date for applications will be late in May 2025. Mrs. Lydia Highfield has been engaged as the consultant to manage the process and she will initially receive all the applications which will then go to the Recruitment Panel for consideration. The advertisement appears in the May Blarney.

#### Air Show 2026

As a result of the serious accident at the Avalon Air Show, the Shire provided the Paul Bennet organisation with breathing room to regroup from that accident before making contact again. Paul Bennet's organisation is now communicating with us and focusing on 2026. A contract has now been signed with them and they will now prepare the Prospectus and Logo we are going to need to promote the Air Show to potential sponsors.

An agreement is yet to be concluded between the Shire and the Beverley Soaring Society whose members are fully supportive of the event and who will be providing much of the logistical support for the day. Without their inclusion it is doubtful the Shire would have sufficient resources to manage alone.

The Avalon accident has also caused the Shire to investigate a specialist medical company to quote on dedicated paramedics and ambulances whose focus will be specifically on pilots and aircrew.

#### In Brief

- Vincent Street crossings. Markers will soon be received that will be placed on both sides of all Wombat Crossings in Vincent Street clearly stating that Wombat Crossings do not provide pedestrians with a right of way over motor vehicles. Pedestrians, legally, must give way to motor vehicles at all times.
- WA Vintage Speedster Car Club. Some members of this club visited Beverley on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April to inspect the site of the Old Racecourse with a view to holding events there. Being impressed with the site it is now to be arranged how best to accommodate their events with the Tractor Pull and Lawn Mowing Racing events.
- West Dale Dirt Drags. The public event normally held in May each year will not occur this year. The owners of the property have decided instead to hold a members' only event.
- Caravan Industry Association Inc. The Caravan and Camping Show was held recently in Perth and was attended by Mrs. Jacinta Murray, the Shire Tourism Officer. Jacinta reported that the responses from the public were positive with many indicating an interest in either return visits or a first-time visit to Beverley. Most pleasing this year was the fact that nearly all people knew Beverley's location as opposed to previous years where the leading question was, "Where is Beverley"!
- Bridge Work. Work on both bridges is progressing well and it is anticipated that work on both will be completed on time or near to it.
- Swimming Pool. As most people will be aware, work has now commenced on the upgrades to certain of the swimming pool structures and it is anticipated that there should be no delays to enable the work to be completed in time for the next summer season.

#### York Williams Road – Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

#### Great Southern Highway – Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing – Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

#### Great Southern Highway – Shoulder Sealing – York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.



Just a little reminder should you call 000 for ambulance attendance at a home or any where, please have the correct address to give to the call taker as the calls are taken by St John Call Centre and they are unaware of the layout of our town. Correct street name and house number is a must. This enables us to reach you as quickly as possible.

Unfortunately the First Aid Course that was scheduled for April has been cancelled due to lack of participants. The next course is envisaged to be held in July 25, so if you require a current First Aid Certificate please go to the Web site and enrol as soon as possible. For courses to be held 6 participants is the minimum number for the course to go ahead.

#### Crohn's and Colitis Awareness

WARRIOR STRONG

Each May is a chance for Australians to understand a little more about what it is like to live with Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, collectively known as inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). Many people living with these illnesses stay silent about the day-to-day issues they face but during May, we can help them speak up.

What are the first hints of Crohn's?

Abdominal pain is a hallmark sign of Crohn's disease in every stage, including the very earliest. Belly pain can present as a dull aching, but typically, you'll feel cramps, often in the lower right part of your belly.

How do they test for Crohn's disease?

Capsule endoscopy. This test involves swallowing a capsule with a camera in it. The camera takes pictures of the small intestine and sends them to a recorder worn on a belt. The images are then downloaded to a computer, displayed on a monitor and checked for signs of Crohn's disease.





## **Beverley Girl Guides & Brownies**

Robert Baden-Powell, founder of the Boy Scouts movement, asked his sister, Agnes Baden-Powell, to form a separate Girl Guides organisation which was registered in Britain in 1910. The movement was quickly embraced around the world and by 1916 there was a girl guides troop operating in Beverley. The girls met on Saturday afternoons in the Methodist Hall and an early leader was Mrs B Copley of Station House, the wife of the station-master.

The enthusiasm for Guides & Brownies waxed & waned over the years. By 1928 the formation of a local company was again in progress with girls being encouraged to join Guides (10-18 years) and Brownies (9 years and under) with Mrs Sten as Captain.

By 1929 the captain was Miss Sutherland and the Lieutenant was Miss M Blechynden. The first meeting for 1930 was held in the Mechanics Institute & days later they joined the ANZAC Day March. Some of the older guides progressed to Rangers and in 1931 their Captain was Miss De Lisle, with M McKinnon as Guides Captain and Miss Snook as Brown Owl (Brownies leader). In ensuing years guides & brownies met in the Town Hall & in the CWA Rooms.

The Beverley Girl Guides and Brownies continued in good strength throughout the 1930s and into the 1940s. They attended meetings; earned merit badges for learning new skills in signalling, camping & craftwork; went to Annual Rallies in Northam, Quairading & Dangin; had a monster day out at McDonald's farm 'Dunbeath' in East Beverley and continued to form part of the ANZAC Day March Past right up to 1945.

In 1947, the Beverely Times announced "Former Girl Guides will regret to learn that the local organisation has closed down and transferred all its assets to the headquarters of the Girl Guide Association in Perth where they will be held in trust for the Beverley branch ... until such times as a trained Guider is available to start the movement here." Beverley Times, Friday 14 April 1933, page 2 Girl Guides. ANNUAL MEETING OF ASSOCIATION.

The annual meeting of the above Association was held in the Rest Room on March 25th. It was the most representative general meeting that has been held in the district for many years, Mrs, Adamson (president of the Association) presiding over an attendance of over thirty. Interesting addresses were given by the President and Commissioner (Mrs. C. F. Bailey) The officers of the different companies gave a resume of the past year's work. Resignations of Captain and Lieutenant, of the Guide Company were received with regret from Mrs. McKinnon and Miss M. Blechynden respectively, and appreciation of services rendered were recorded. Mrs Adamson was again elected as President of the Assn. Committee:— Mesdames Ferguson, Rea, Williams, Hodgson, McKinnon, Twine, Hack, Elphick, E. Edwards, Gulliver, H. Blechynden, and Miss M. McDonald. Miss Coe was elected Captain of the 2nd Beverley Company. A strong local association was formed. A vote of thanks was passed to the secretary (Mrs. Crisp) for the splendid service she has rendered the Guide movement in the past years. The Brownie Pack resumes on Saturday afternoon, April 22nd, and the Guide company will commence on Friday evening, April 28th, both at the Rectory schoolroom. Captain Coe will be pleased to welcome to the Guide company any girls between the ages of 11 and 16 years.

There was a brief revival of the association from 1951 to 1955 when leaders included Joyce Scrivener & Peggy Weaver. Meetings were held in the Exhibition Shed at the Showgrounds. There was then a lapse until 1984 when local schoolteacher, Miss Julie Smith, reinvigorated the movement with a new Brownies Pack. The meeting place was in the RSL where a specially decorated room was bestowed upon Brownies. This very active group lasted more than 10 years.
