SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Budget 2025/2026

The budget for the financial year 25/26 was approved by Council at its meeting on 23rd July. The many needs of the community had to be balanced against setting rates at a level that considered ratepayers ability to pay. As a result, an increase of 5% was approved.

Among the many capital projects considered were:

- The need to complete stage one of the swimming pool redevelopment;
- Plan to build more cabins near the Caravan Park;
- The plan to build four new houses at the site of the Hunt Road village;
- The need to connect the Hunt Road Village site to the deep sewer system; and,
- Resurfacing the Netball Courts.

These projects require funding that cannot all be met by rate increases alone. It is therefore proposed to take out two loans. One for \$2 million for item 3 and \$1 million for item 2. A Grant has been received of \$1.158 million for the deep sewer connection of the Hunt Road Village site.

I would like to reassure Ratepayers that the increase in borrowings was not taken lightly. Council is conscious of maintaining borrowings at levels that can be adequately and sustainably managed. Borrowing beyond Council's capacity to manage will bring the burden back to Ratepayers.

Air Show April 2026

Work on readying for this event is progressing well. The Sponsorship Prospectus has been finalised and it is hoped to have the website for the event open in the very near future. Once the website is launched it will be possible to login and purchase tickets. Initially there will be a short period where tickets can be purchased at a discount through the Early Bird scheme.

It is planned to have Paul Bennet, Kate Fraser, and Glenn Graham from the Paul Bennet Airshow team visit Beverley around the 20th August to meet our team and familiarise themselves with the airstrip layout and Beverley generally. We have learned from Paul Bennet that he has a fully restored Vampire jet that could be available for the event which would be of great interest to Beverley but unfortunately the cost is beyond our budget. There is a slim chance we might find a sponsor to fund this aircraft?

Renewable Energy Projects Community Benefit Scheme

While the phrase 'Renewable Energy' might seem like an oxymoron to many, nevertheless the Wind and Solar Farms are capturing everyone's attention with proposals to build in the Wheatbelt. There is currently a push for the proponents of these projects to engage with local communities to set up financial contributions towards benefitting communities affected by these developments. The Narrogin Council is to be credited with leading this push. It is hoped to hold these developers to account; for while they come into the district to build the infrastructure they simply build and leave. There arises the further question as to whether these developers should be held responsible for the removal of these turbines and panels at the conclusion of their life? Elections will be held on 18th October 2025 for vacancies on the Council of the Shire. This year five vacancies reduce to four as Beverley completes the transition from nine Councillors to seven. Nominations open on Thursday 28th August and close at close of business Thursday 4th September.






Unveil the Mystery at the 2025 Beverley Show!

Beverley St John Ambulance

August 2025

I apologise for the delay in distributing the July Blarney notes, but I hope to update everyone for this month.

As always, our crews are feeling the pressure. Unfortunately, we have recently lost a couple of volunteers, and our numbers are at an all-time low. I know I regularly ask, but if you have ever considered becoming a Volunteer Ambulance Officer, we need you now more than ever. Most people think we encounter many confronting situations, but in reality, that is not the case. While we occasionally encounter some challenging scenarios, the majority of our calls involve transporting patients from Beverley Hospital to either Northam or a city hospital.





Most of our volunteers work during the day, which means we often lack available personnel for calls. It is becoming increasingly difficult to find people willing to join us. As I've mentioned before, our volunteers are a wonderful group of kind and considerate individuals who freely give their time. The camaraderie within this tight-knit community is remarkable. While we take our responsibilities seriously, we also enjoy our commitment to SJA.

Our relationship with FESA and the hospital staff here in Beverley is excellent. Occasionally, when we have a nurse escort, we always make a stop for coffee and a bite to eat on our way home. Our usual favourites are Macca's, Hungry Jack's, and BB's Diner in Northam. The FESA volunteers are also a fantastic group of people, always willing to lend a hand when needed. Please consider joining our selfless group of volunteers.

Please note that if you or your family require an ambulance, Beverley may not have personnel available unless we can recruit additional individuals. In such cases, a crew from another town, like York, Brookton, or Quairading, may be called, and it could take some time for them to arrive, assuming they have available crews. I encourage you to have a chat with me or, better yet, come see us on a Tuesday training night. You'll be welcomed with open arms. We train on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM.

I often remind everyone of the great people serving our community. Recently, when our crew attended an accident, we received heartwarming feedback from the Critical Care Paramedic on the scene. The care provided by the Beverley crew, along with those from Northam and Quairading, was crucial for the patient's survival. Great work, team!

Our Office Administrator, Jennifer, is organising a First Aid Course for August. If your First Aid certificate is out of date and you need to update it, please contact our Sub Centre Office and speak with Jen about enrolling in the course.

The **Annual Review Meeting is scheduled for August 26th at 7pm**. If you are interested in our Local Sub Centre, please come along and show your support.

THE DAY LIZZIE GOT BURNT IN 1923

That time arrived at about 11pm. George was quickly out to get Lizzies engine warm, when it dawn on him that he had used her on an emergency to get a new machine part during the day.

So placing the hurricane lamp close, he, in hurry picked up a 4 gallon tin of petrol and attempting to pour it into Lizzies mouth, splashed some over the hurricane lamp.

Result, a bonza fire, Lizzie had gone west. George got busy on the fire. A youth employed on the farm happened to wake up, and rushed out to know what the light was in the sky for, at that time of night. He started to run to help and suddenly remembered that he only donned a shirt. Naturally he returned for more skin cover. By this time the fire had done its deadly work. So George then ran to telephone, but could not raise the exchange attendant, so advised the youth to catch the pony in the small paddock, which he did in quick time. Hopped on bare back, and almost as soon as started, horse and boy turned SUGAR DOODLE in a washout. After some some delay, how ever he reached the exchange. Called the attendant and gave his message.

A call immediately went over the wires to a neighbour Mr Fisher, who on hearing the first ring could not wake up quickly enough, so his wife shook him to life, he listened to the urgent message, and then jumped into the HARNESS and was soon at the scene in trouble.

George and Mary were ready waiting. A quick started was made for the local town. A part way along the road Mary called a halt. Mr Fisher just sat quiet with the engine just ticking over. But luck had changed by this time and the car moved along merrily once more arriving at the HOME OF THE GOOD SHEPARD in the wee small hours of the morning. Delivered Mary and proceeded to Dr Hodgson. He was still on deck playing cards with some friends and was at first reluctant to leave the table. However after a little persuasion, he consented to attend. A few more minutes and Dr Hodgson was in attendance. Mr Fisher in the meantime is enjoying his smoke and just as it is breaking day, George and Dr Hodgson came arm in arm down the footpath to Mr Fisher and reported a bonny son has arrived. 

Understanding Cholesterol

Cholesterol is a fatty substance found naturally in the cells and bloodstream of our body. It is mainly produced by the liver, but a small amount also comes from certain foods we eat. Cholesterol has developed a bit of a sinister reputation over the years, but the truth is that it plays an important role in our overall health and is involved in a number of vital functions including the growth and activity of cells. The body needs cholesterol, however according to a lot of medical research, an excess of it floating around our blood can have potential negative implications for our health. It is vital for us older blokes to develop an understanding of cholesterol and especially its relationship to cardiovascular disease.

Finding out the level of cholesterol in our blood is as easy as your Doctor organising a simple blood test. Among other things the blood test will identify the two types of proteins that are responsible for transporting this fatty substance in the body:

- LDL (low density lipoprotein) takes cholesterol away from the liver into the blood stream and out to the cells of our body.
- HDL (high density lipoprotein) plays the role of returning cholesterol to our liver where it is broken down.

LDL makes up the bulk of cholesterol in our body and has been labelled as bad cholesterol mainly due to its involvement in the formation of plaque in our blood vessels. It is believed that when the lining of our blood vessels gets damaged in places due to things like high blood pressure, smoking or diabetes, LDL can start to enter the walls of the blood vessels and eventually build up to restrict or even block blood flow to parts of our heart and brain causing a heart attack or stroke.

There are a lot of factors that influence the levels of cholesterol in a person's blood such as our genes, age and ethnicity which we don't have a great deal of control over, and our diet and lifestyle which we do have control over. This is especially important to consider if we are already at risk of developing heart and circulatory disease due to factors such as smoking, being overweight and having high blood pressure.

Your GP may discuss medication as an option to address high cholesterol levels but will most definitely suggest exercise and changes to your diet and lifestyle. Exercise is a no brainer when it comes to keeping your pump and pipes healthy and reducing your risk for all sorts of health issues. Dietary wise, it will involve being mindful of foods that contain high cholesterol such as meat, milk, cheese, eggs and butter.

There is a lot of evidence to limit our intake of saturated and trans fats which are found in foods such as fatty meat, dairy products and most take away food. Both these fats can raise the levels of LDL and trans fats are even thought to lower the levels of HDL. We still need to eat fat as part of a balanced diet, but this should generally be unsaturated fat found in foods such as fish, avocado and olive oil.



Matriarchs of the Wheatbelt: Get In-spidered and help celebrate 50 years of world class research.

A world-renowned ecological project that has been quietly underway for fifty years in Western Australia's Wheatbelt North Bungulla Reserve surveying a local colony of trapdoor spiders, will this year celebrate fifty years of continuous research. One of the few ongoing studies of its kind in the world

The anniversary celebration planned for September 5-7 in Tammin, will pay homage to the late Professor Barbara York Main OAM and her renowned study of trapdoor spiders throughout her academically recognised career, after growing up as a farmer's daughter in Tammin in the 1930's.

Professor Main recalled that during her childhood on the farm she observed that kangaroos and eagles were big enough to look after themselves, she was far more concerned and intrigued about the smaller insects around her, particularly the round, flat, litter doors of the trapdoor spiders.

Only the second woman to obtain a PhD from UWA in 1958 and the first in zoology, her wheatbelt trapdoor story began in 1974 with her commitment to protect and observe their bush colony for her lifetime, while becoming a globally renowned arachnologist, ecologist, and author.

Affectionately referred to as 'the Spider Lady' by those who had the privilege to know and work with her, Professor Main's dry wit and steely determination has left a legacy worthy of celebration. Posthumously inducted into the WA Women's Hall of Fame this year, nominated by WA's former Chief Scientist the renowned Emeritus Professor Lyn Beazley and Dr Leanda Mason - who is a Vice Chancellor Research Fellow at Edith Cowan University - both formidable scientists themselves - are collaborating to highlight and continue the next 50 years of environmental stewardship and cultural collaboration in Tammin.

With the support of the Shire of Tammin, a commemoration festival weekend of camping, walks, citizen science, local ecological tours, special guest speakers, theatre, poetry, exclusive documentary screenings, workshops and interactive family community activities are being planned, worthy of the work and contribution of a remarkable Wheatbelt matriarch.

When Marg and I pulled into Beverley for the artist-inresidence gig, I was hoping for the best, anticipating the worst, and prepared to accept whatever came along. Turns out, It was miles better than we expected. Honestly, it felt like we'd landed in some quaint little English town, only with more utes, gophers and a nightly freight train the length of the Nullarbor. Around midnight, the old Railway Station would start to shake, rattle and roll like an FJ Holden on a corrugated road, with bells, whistles, and a horn loud enough to wake the roos down in The Dale.

To me, that was pure magic. It got into my blood. But the AIR wasn't really about my photography. It was about the people of Beverley and our daily interaction. I couldn't help but channel the sentiment of Banjo Patterson's 'Clancy of the Overflow'. It's about time. That elusive commodity. Time being the coin of life. Spend it wisely. Beverley locals don't just have time to say g'day, they mean it.

I shot around 60 portraits, and everyone came willingly with a story, a laugh, and often a cuppa. People opened up in ways I wasn't expecting—stories about life, love, loss, and the power of a good scone. When I asked locals why they lived in Beverley, the answer was usually the same: the people, the community, the town... the vibe. Straight out of *The Castle*, that line, but spot on.
