SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



SWIMMING POOL REDEVELOPMENT

It is unfortunate that I must alert the community that there are now some significant delays that have arisen affecting this redevelopment. Up until recently we were confident that the project would be completed in time for the new season. This has now changed.

The revised opening is now January 2026. The factors which have contributed to the delay include additional excavation and fill work, delay in concrete pouring due to wet weather and delays in the supply of the pool liner/drainage system and water features. We have stressed the imperative to get the project completed as soon as possible and the contractor will add additional labour on to the project to try and gain some time.

Air Show April 2026

Paul Bennet, Kate Fraser, and Glenn Graham from the Paul Bennet Airshow team visited Beverley on Wednesday 20th August for a meeting with the members of the Shire Committee, the Soaring Society, the Gun Club, and the local Police. Meeting at the airstrip, a full day was spent investigating every aspect of the proposed Show and the layout of the airstrip ensuring that all services that are required for the day, and the accommodation of a large crowd could be managed and coordinated.

Beverley Agricultural Show 2025

Congratulations to President Lorretta Adams, Secretary Bruce Hunt, all members of the Committee, and all the volunteers who assisted in turning on one of the best Shows ever. The layout seemed to work well with the whole area used to benefit exhibitors and patrons: not so much crowding in a restricted area. This meant the crowd did not seem to be too big but observing the parking on Forest Street and surrounds indicated otherwise.

This a wonderful event for not just the Beverley Community but bringing in so many interested people from far and wide. The work and effort required of such a small group is a credit to them and future Shows will continue to depend on more volunteers willing to come forward and participate. Having reached 148 let's hope there is a continuing participation by willing bodies to ensure Beverley is able to conduct this event for years to come.

Local Government Elections 2025

Elections will be held on 18th October 2025 for vacancies on the Council of the Shire. This year five vacancies reduce to four as Beverley completes the transition from nine Councillors to seven. Nominations open on Thursday 28th August and close at close of business (4pm) Thursday 4th September.

In Brief.

- ➤ Infrastructure Development Fund Hunt Road Village. The project received the go-ahead from DPLH and the final Financial Assistance Agreement was executed by the Shire on 16 July 2025. The project is now live, with Geotech Consultant Structure appointed to commence with Geotechnical investigation scheduled to be done on 1 September 2025
- **Beverley River Care Group.** Are pleased to announce the launch of the new Reference Library on the Beverley River Care Group website. Brings together nearly 70 documents from a variety of sources, both historical and current. The documents represent just a fraction of the investment of knowledge, effort, and care dedicated to our river and region over many decades.
- ➤ Verge Spraying. Rural roads have almost been completed, about 600km both sides have been sprayed. Most town streets have also been completed including Shire controlled blocks and reserves.
- > Grading Maintenance. Grading is currently progressing in the west of the Shire.
- Dumped Tyres. 28 light vehicle tyres have been dumped in the Poison Hill Reserve, corner Morbinning Road and Aiken Road. This kind of stupid behaviour brings added costs to the Shire in having to clean up the mess.







Celebrating Beverley CWA

100 years of Support, Friendship and Community Service by the Beverley branch of the CWA





In 1925 the Beverley Branch of the CWA formed after a meeting in the Mechanic's Institute with Beryl Fisher (left) as first President.

The establishment of a Rest Room became the main objective of most branches, not only for a meeting room but to give much needed facilities to farming families.

For most country folk, the trip by horse and cart or open truck into the nearest town was a major event. This often

meant setting off early in the morning because what is now a trifling distance, in those days, took hours. Before the day was half over many a mother sighed for a place where she could feed a baby or sit in sheltered comfort while waiting for her husband.

A temporary Rest Room (small but very central) opened in March 1927; and a new Rest Room in the Fire Station opened in December.

Purpose-built Rest Rooms opened on the corner of Vincent and Dawson Streets in 1936 at a cost of £500.



Over the years the Beverley CWA has organised many successful community and cultural events. Very popular were Debutante Balls in the Town Hall where debutantes and their partners were often presented to the current Governor of Western Australia. Grand Floral and Industrial Exhibitions were mounted in the same venue with awards for flowers and floral arts as well as domestic arts and crafts. Lady Mitchell, wife of the Governor, opened the 1939 Exhibition.

The CWA catered for women of all ages and in 1940 a CWA Younger Set was established with Mrs R Tebutt as the President.

The famous stone seat in front of the Shire building was a CWA gift to the people of Beverley in 1974. The seat features in many a reunion photograph.

Claire's Journey Supporting Beverley's Older Community

At Beverley Community Resource Centre, our commitment to supporting every member of our community drives everything we do. Claire, one of our dedicated Care Coordinators and enrolled nurse who divides her time between Beverley and Perth, embodies this commitment through her vital role in the Staying in Place program. This initiative is close to our hearts, aiming to help older residents remain comfortable in their own homes for as long as possible, surrounded by the people and places they love.

Claire's perspective offers a clinical insight into the challenges and triumphs of delivering care in a rural community. Having worked extensively in regional aged care as well as in metropolitan hospitals, she was astounded by the limited health and community services available here in Beverley—especially considering our relative closeness to Perth. Essential services such as podiatry, physiotherapy, and age-specific supports are often scarce or unavailable except through hospital admissions. This scarcity leaves our older residents without crucial resources in their day-to-day lives.

For Claire, the true significance of the Staying in Place program lies in filling these gaps with compassionate, local support. By matching older clients with support workers from within the community—people they often know the program brings more than just practical help. It offers trusted relationships, regular social connection, and a caring face that visits weekly. This human connection is what sets the program apart and makes a lasting difference.

"I know everybody in the community knows Samantha, our original Care Coordinator, and now people are starting to know me. It's wonderful to see that our older residents feel truly listened to and valued-not just another stranger on a phone call," Claire shares. The program delivers the basic services every person deserves, while also fostering a sense of belonging and respect.

Most importantly, Staying in Place helps keep our older community members out of hospitals or aged care facilities, where family and friends might find it difficult to visit. Being cared for at home by local carers is powerful—it strengthens intergenerational bonds and community ties. Claire finds great joy in this work, valuing the chance to hear each client's unique life story, to bring a smile, and to offer moments of comfort and companionship.

Yet Claire also reminds us of the risks of isolation: "Sometimes I worry that our older community are the forgotten ones. As people age and mobility or transport limits their social circles, it's so important we show up for them." Each visit is more than a service call-it's a moment to affirm that our elders are seen, heard, and cherished within Beverley.

The most significant change, seen through Claire's eyes, is not only in the services delivered but in the human value restored—the joy of connection, the dignity of being cared for locally, and the reassurance that comes from knowing you matter to your community. This is the heart of Beverley CRC's work and a shining example of what can happen when we come together to support one another.

At Beverley CRC, we don't just serve a community—we are part of it, committed to strengthening every individual's place within it. Together, we create meaningful change, one relationship at a time.

HOW TO PREPARE ROSES FOR SHOWING

If you have roses in your garden but have never entered them into the Rose Show because you are unsure of what is expected or how to go about it, below is a list of some hints/tips on preparing roses for exhibition.

When picking the roses it is best done in the early morning, as this is when the plant will be holding the most water.

Select blooms that are nearly fully open, the optimal word here is nearly. If the blooms have not opened at all, then you risk them staying that way. If you pick them when they are fully open they are going to deteriorate rapidly and possibly wont last for the 2 days of the show.

Use a sharp cutting tool, secateurs are the best option. Cut the stem on a 45 degree angle without crushing the stems. Once cut put them straight into a tall container of lukewarm water. Don't overcrowd the container to allow air for air circulation, and remove any foliage that is going to be below water level.


Store the roses in a cool dark place overnight. If you are storing them for a longer period then they can be put into a fridge. This ensures that the flower does not open any further and they can be stored refrigerated for a few days. However..... don't put them in with any fruit/vegetables and the temperature of the fridge should be between 1 - 5 degrees Celsius.

You can add apple cider vinegar and sugar to the water in equal quantities at a rate of 1 tablespoon of each per 2-3 litres of water.

Check daily and change water if needed.

All single roses entered into the show are to be displayed in glass bottles that are supplied on the day. These bottles come in 2 sizes, they are old cool drink bottles. So when cutting your roses from the bush try to maximise the length of the stem. This allows the rose to sit up out of the bottle for the best display.

Any arrangements or vases of roses that you wish to enter will have to be in your own containers. There are no vases or bowls supplied for these entries.



What do the judges look for?

Judges examine the rose for its typical shape, looking for a symmetrical and balanced bloom.

The petals should unfurl in a spiral from a central point.

The colour should be rich, vibrant, and consistent throughout the bloom, with no fading or discolouration.

The size of the bloom should meet the standard for its variety, with larger blooms often favoured where size is a key factor.

The rose should be fresh and free from blemishes, diseases, or wilting.
