



SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Beverley Shire Council Elections 2025

Congratulations to Councillors elected at the recent Beverley Local Government Elections and thankyou to all eight candidates for your participation in the electoral process. The successful candidates filling the four vacancies are returning Councillors Sue Martin, John Maxwell, and Alan Sattler and new Councillor Andrew Shaw.

Currently voting in Local Government elections is voluntary which I believe most of us would prefer to remain the case. Interestingly Beverley had 49.8% of those eligible casting their vote which is a much better participation rate among electors than many metropolitan Councils.

Changes to the Local Government Act in recent years now requires preferential voting in Local Government elections. This complex process has necessitated the Shire to engage the WA Electoral Commission to run our elections, hence a move to postal voting. Whilst this has seen an increased participation rate among eligible electors, it also has come at a notably increased cost to the Shire than the previous "first past the post" method of voting.

Thankyou to outgoing Councillors David White and Don Davis for the extensive contributions made during their respective terms as Shire Councillors, both also having served as Shire President. David was elected to Council in 2011 and served as Shire President for four years 2021-2025. Don was elected in 2013 and served as Shire President for two years 2019-2021.

The 48th AGM of the Beverley Historical Society was held on Monday 13th October at the Society's headquarters, the Dead Finish Museum, with an attendance of 14 members, 2 guests and 4 apologies.

The Treasurer, Leonie Taylor, presented her audited report on the year's financial activities which showed a slight increase in the bank balance for the 2024-2025 Financial Year.

The President, Glenys Petchell, then presented her report on the year's activities:

Since our last AGM we have had the Beverley District High School Year 2s visit twice.

October last year we had 16 students and this year in September we had 20 students (largest group for a long time). We always enjoy having them visit and teach them about the "Olden Days" A Big thank you must go to our community volunteers Lee, Elaine, Ethel and Debbie who came and helped us.

Not including yesterday our visitors to the Museum for the year were 261 - 202 on Sundays and 59 during the week. Well down on last year.

During the year we have had busy bees sorting the clothes into their eras, photographing them, listing descriptions of each item. These mornings have been a lot of fun.

Next year there is the Beverley Air Show, and the Historical Society will have a display there, so we are trying to collect as much info as possible.

My special thanks to our Vice President Joy Smith who is a backup contact person & helps in research, to our Secretary Morag Whitney I don't have enough words for all she does; to our Treasurer Leonie Taylor she keeps our finances in order plus many hours updating our filing system; to Adam Freeman for his Mr Fix It jobs he does for us; and to our auditor Ashlee Carter.

To the Beverley Tree and Garden Club for maintaining the garden; we get lots of lovely comments on how nice it looks.

To all the members of the Historical Society - without all your help to man the museum on Sundays, attend busy bees & contribute to the many requests - we wouldn't have a museum for everyone to admire.

Sadly, on the 20th November last year Bill Whitney passed away, loved husband of Morag, also long time Auditor for the Society. He was also a very handyman with wood and made the shelves in Beverley room, ramp at front door, a gadget for getting the curtains down and the list goes on. He was the behind-the-scenes supporter who never wanted any accolades and always jokingly called us "The Hysterical Society"

Next year we have a couple of outings planned and hopefully we can continue with our sorting the many treasures we have, entering more photos and rearranging the Archives room.



Take the opportunity to join in gentle activity aimed at general fitness and falls prevention.



- Be actively involved in your own health care- Taking part in decisions that are made about your treatment is the single most important way to help prevent things from going wrong and to get the best possible care for your needs.
- Speak up of you have any questions or concerns - Choose a health care professional with whom you feel comfortable talking about your health and treatment. Remember that you have a right to ask questions and to expect answers that you can understand. Your healthcare professional wants to answer your questions but can only answer them if you ask. A family member, carer or interpreter can be there with you, if this helps. You can also ask for another professional opinion.
 - Learn more about your condition or treatments - Collect as much reliable information as you can regarding your condition, tests and treatments.
- Keep a list of all the medicines you are taking- You can use the list to let your doctor and pharmacist know about everything you are taking and Information about drug allergies you may have.
- Make sure you understand the medicines you are taking-

Read the label; including the warnings make sure it is what your doctor ordered for you.

- Get the results of any test or procedure- The Doctor will let you know when he expects your results from tests to be back, don't assume, " no news is good news" call your doctor to find out your results and ask what they mean for your care.
 - Talk to your doctor or other health care professional about your options if you need to go into hospital.
- Make sure you understand what will happen if you need surgery or a Procedure
 - Make sure you, your doctor and your surgeon all agree on exactly what will be done.
- Before you leave hospital, ask your doctor or other health care professionals to explain the treatment plan you will use at home.

Beverley River Care Group

We're very grateful for the continued support from the local community and reflected by the Shire approving the Beverley River Care Group in this round of Community Grants. The grant is much appreciated. We'll be investing in tree guards and ways to make our activities more visible.

We value the efforts of those who cared for the river before us and continue learning about how it once was and what's changed since settlement. Our website is becoming a growing library of practical recommendations from the past 70 years, many of which are still relevant but yet to be acted on.

Gathering new data is just as important. We had a great turnout for our first river health check, where we used simple video tools to record and count the fish and other small aquatic life. Some of these species feed on mosquito larvae, and we look forward to working with the Shire to help protect them as part of reducing mozzie numbers. Research also shows that many mozzies breed in backyard ponds and pot plants, so we can all help by keeping water containers clean and emptied. We'll keep monitoring the river around town each season to track changes, and check other pools when we have the resources. You can find the videos via our website: www.beverleyrivercare.org.au

If you enjoy spotting wildlife, iNaturalist is a great way to record and share sightings of local fish, tortoises, birds, flowers and other critters. Visit www.inaturalist.ala.org.au and search for our project named 'Waterways and Bushland of Beverley, Western Australia', or use the QR code.

Looking ahead, we're exploring the idea of floating gardens made from local aquatic plants. These can shade the water, create habitat, and absorb excess nutrients that contribute to summer smells and mozzie problems. Let us know if you have experience with these.



Sharing the Road with Oversize Vehicles

The distance the pilot and escort vehicles travel ahead of the oversize vehicle and the gap between them will vary depending on the speed of oncoming traffic, speed of the oversize vehicle, the road geometry and the availability of pull-over areas for the oncoming traffic. The pilot and escort vehicles should be a sufficient distance ahead to enable all types of vehicles to pull off the road before the oversize vehicle










Over Size Over Mass (OSOM) Load Under Traffic Escort







Heavy Vehicle Pilots (Pilots) are used to provide advanced warning to other road users that an oversize vehicle is approaching and facilitate the safe movement of the oversize vehicles by directing traffic in their vicinity.

Directions given by the Pilots are lawful directions and must be obeyed

Pilot Vehicles are easily recognised by a large yellow reflective sign with the words "Oversize Load Ahead" and amber flashing warning lights mounted on the roof.

Pilot Vehicles escorting loads in excess of 4.5 metres in width will also display white flashing lights on the front of the vehicle.

The number of Pilots accompanying an oversize vehicle will vary depending on the complexity of the load and their positioning will vary depending on where they are needed to safely manage traffic.



Traffic Escort Vehicles have red and blue flashing lights on the roof and have "Traffic Escort" displayed on both sides of the vehicle. Most Traffic Escort Vehicles now have a blue and white sign with the words "Oversize Escort".

Oversize vehicles often travel in convoys, meaning there will be two or more oversize vehicles travelling together, as shown in the above example.

The number of oversize vehicles allowed to travel in a convoy depends on the road terrain. Typically, only two oversize vehicles can travel in convoy, however three oversize vehicles often travel in convoy on Great Northern Hwy north of Wubin, and four oversize vehicles often travel in convoy on Great Northern Hwy north of Newman.

Sharing the Roads with Oversize Vehicles

Slow down as soon as you see a Pilot Vehicle or Traffic Escort Vehicle and be prepared to pull off the road and stop if necessary.

Many oversize vehicles take up more than half the road width, or they may need to travel towards the centre of the road to avoid power lines, trees or other roadside items.

Under the Road Traffic Code 2000, you must follow the directions given by a Pilot and a Traffic Escort Warden when facilitating the movement of an oversize vehicle. So, always follow directions given by Heavy Vehicle Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens, as the directions are being given for your safety.


Take care to ensure you only pull back onto the road or move through an intersection when you are sure all vehicles in the oversize vehicle convoy have passed.

Do not risk overtaking an oversize vehicle. Be patient and wait for the oversize vehicle to move aside and the Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens to clear traffic.

If the rear pilot waves you past or calls you over the UHF radio to advise that it's safe to overtake, proceed with extreme caution. As the driver, you are still responsible for ensuring it is safe to cross the centreline and overtake.







- Slow down seeing a Heavy Vehicle Pilot or Traffic Escort Warden vehicle is a warning that there's something big up ahead.
- Move left oversize loads and large agricultural vehicles can take up more than half the road or may need to travel in the middle of the road to avoid power lines or other roadside items
- Prepare to stop and follow directions Heavy Vehicle Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens are there to provide directions on how to safely navigate the oversize load.
