

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S NOTES



Annual Electors Meeting – the WA Local Government Act 1995 requires local governments to hold an Annual Electors Meeting (AEM) within 56 days of Council accepting the Shire's Annual Report, the purpose of which is to receive and discuss the annual report. In general business electors can raise other matters related to the local government's functions. Thankyou to those who attended this year's meeting on 2nd December. The 2024/2025 Annual Report provides detail of the 24/25 financial year and insight to 25/26 strategic activities and is available on the Shire website or the Shire administration centre when reopened in January.

Swimming Pool – the community would now be aware the Beverley swimming pool remains closed. Stage 1 refurbishment commenced at the end of the 24/25 season and was planned for completion early in the 25/26 swimming season. Unfortunate delays meant the anticipated date for completion, and several extensions, could not be met which is very disappointing for everyone. On a more positive note, Councillors visited the site prior to the December Council Meeting and believe the community will be pleased with the Stage 1 redevelopment when the pool does reopen.

Christmas Decorations – this has been raised at the last two annual elector's meetings and Council has heard loud and clear from members of the community that Beverley lacks Christmas decorations! Initial enquiries and investigations indicate that a planned approach and some creativity would be useful so as not to burden ratepayers (it can be expensive!) nor stretch staffing resources. Collectively let's see what can be arranged!

Various Works Activities – gravel carted for shoulder widening and culvert replacement by shire staff is occurring on a section of Waterhatch Rd which contractors will widen the seal on in January. Contractors will also replace a culvert on Clulow Rd and Caroling Bally Bally Rd and widen and cement stabilise a section of Mawson Rd. Quotes are being sourced for battery replacement for the five solar streetlights installed on Railway St in 2019, which are now starting to fail. When onsite for the netball court refurbishment contractors laid hot mix around the old ticket box into the Oval. There was not quite enough, and Shire staff will complete this when the materials become available.

Theft – unfortunately the four wheels from the Shire's temporary sign trailer were stolen during the work being undertaken on Waterhatch Rd. This creates unnecessary expense and time lost that would be better directed toward more productive outcomes for the Beverley community. It seems this is not an isolated incident with others in the shire having had the same problem. Please report to the police any information so this can be stopped.

December Storm – hot and dry, lighting (a lot), extreme wind, fires, trees and branches across roads – alarming weather conditions throughout the Shire Sunday 14th December. This was one time during harvest when everyone was grateful it rained as it would have been almost impossible to stop some of the fires that started. Thankyou to those who assisted where they could. In addition, the efforts to help clear roads following the storm, including use of machinery and equipment, is gratefully appreciated.

Shire Community Grant Programme reminder – applications open 5th January 2026 and close Friday 30th January 2026 for the second round of the Shire Community Grant Programme. Contact the Shire to discuss your project before submitting.

Happy New Year! – hopefully, if not already then very soon, some leisure and relaxation time is being enjoyed by residents during January after what is generally a busy end to the previous year.

The Shire of Beverley is pleased to announce the commencement of the Commonage Hill Trail Project, a significant step forward in enhancing recreational opportunities and active transport options in our region.

This project is proudly **jointly funded by the State Government through the Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) Grant and the Shire of Beverley**. The feasibility study is nearing completion, and the next stage will involve inviting community members and the wider public to have their say on the concept design.

Consultants Common Ground, highly regarded trail specialists in Western Australia, have been engaged to shape the vision for the Commonage Hill trail network. Their expertise ensures that the project will be both environmentally sensitive and designed to deliver an exceptional user experience.

The trail was identified in both the Beverley Trails Master Plan and broader regional planning documents and is an exciting project for the community and visitors to our region.

We are proud to partner with the Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure to develop the regional trail and encourage active recreation. Further information and community consultation opportunities will be announced soon.

This Committee makes recommendations to Council regarding governance, risk management, financial oversight, internal and external audit planning and continuous improvement functions.

The Independent Presiding Member of the Committee is expected to exercise due care and diligence and maintain high standards of governance.

Skills & Experience Required

- Financial Management/reporting;
- Risk Management;
- Governance and Compliance
- Audit practices; and
- Experience in or knowledge of regional local government

Selection Criteria

- Knowledge and experience in statutory financial reporting, risk management, governance, audit and internal controls in a local government setting.
- Strong communication skills, including running a meeting.
- Have a sound understanding of Audit Committee's and Local Government.
- Be a person with no direct association with the Shire as a business entity, either as an Elected Member, or an officer; and not be an elected member with another local government.

Key Responsibilities Presiding Member

The Presiding Member is responsible for leading the Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee, ensuring meetings are conducted effectively, independently, and in accordance with legislative and governance standards.

Term & Remuneration

The appointment of an Independent Member will be made by Council for a term in line with the election cycle. The Independent Member will be remunerated in line with Band 4 Salaries and Allowances Tribunal determinations. Time, travel, and incidentals may be reimbursed as prescribed.

Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings


No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.






My Visit to the Dead Finish Museum. By Merene.


Our Visit to the Dead Finish Museum. By Phoenix







The **Confession of St Peter and Conversion of St Paul**, recall how St Peter magnificently confesses Jesus to be the Messiah/the Christ, and St Paul who as Saul the Pharisee had been a cruel persecutor of those who followed in the Way of Jesus Christ, is miraculously converted on the road to Damascus.

There will be a special **Patronal Festival Service** in honour of St Paul at 5 p.m. on Sunday, 8th February at **St Paul's Church, Edward's Crossing**. After the service members of the congregation are welcome to adjoin to a local hotel for a meal.

The **Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord** will be celebrated at Holy Trinity Church, York at 5.30 p.m. on Sunday, 4th January with a service of readings and carols; a reception follows at The Rectory.
