SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S NOTES



Swimming Pool Update – Whilst work on the pool has effectively been completed it awaits a delayed power upgrade and the important Department of Health sign off. Council and Staff are very mindful of how challenging this summer has become by not having access to our local pool, particularly during the school holidays. The positive is that it will be worth waiting for although the change rooms etc will look even more in desperate need of replacement by comparison! Stage 2 will rectify this issue however external funding is required to progress those “shovel ready” plans.

Christmas Decorations – Investigations are underway to determine Christmas decoration options and costings for Council consideration in the 2026/2027 budgetary process.

Storm Damage Repair Completed – Repairs around the district caused from the storm in March 2023 have now been completed at a cost of ~ \$7.7m. The works were funded by the Federal government and administered by DFES and includes a Shire's contribution of \$225,000.

Various Works Activities – Two kilometres of reconstruction work on Mawson Road, near Murray Road, was completed in January. Following Australia Day, second coat seals will be carried out on sections of Mawson Road and Waterhatch Road that were reconstructed last year.

Reconstruction and widening works have commenced on Waterhatch Road for a distance of two kilometres west of the Waterhatch Bridge. Motorists should expect delays and are asked to follow all traffic management signage.

Meanwhile, staff have been preparing a hardstand area at the airfield to enable more efficient reloading of water bombers. Additional works at the airfield include preparation of entrances and car parks ahead of the upcoming Airshow.

Visitors – The warmer months have continued to see good numbers of visitors utilising the caravan park, cabins and RV park. A facebook post from a recent visitor “... *the town centre is so nicely done up, all the old buildings restored and painted, kerbs, clean verges and footpaths through out, lots taking pride in their houses and yards, it was a pleasure to visit....*”. We do live in a great place!

Beverley Airshow – 11 April 2026, the Beverley Airshow is shaping up to be a significant event for Beverley, attracting a great deal of interest from near and far. It was included in the West Australian's recent Dream Events magazine supplement advertising events and activities around the state for the months of January – April 2026. Airshow information is available on the website beverleyairshow.com.au or follow the Beverley Airshow Facebook page for updates.

Beverley Railway Station Platform Theatre – the Beverley Station Arts have an exciting calendar of upcoming events in 2026, many of which are hosted at the fabulous Railway Station Cultural Precinct, popular among locals and our many returning visitors. Mark your calendar for one of the March performances of “Nunsense” by the Beverley Amateur Dramatics.

School Starts - with the new school year due to commence look out for students going to and returning from school and be aware of the school zone speed limits. Best wishes to new and returning students and their teachers for another productive year of education in Beverley.


Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for fighting fires, the minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.



Media Release: Commonage Hill Trail Project Reaches Key Milestone

The Shire of Beverley is pleased to announce the commencement of the Commonage Hill Trail Project, a significant step forward in enhancing recreational opportunities and active transport options in our region.

This project is proudly **jointly funded by the State Government through the Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) Grant and the Shire of Beverley**. The feasibility study is nearing completion, and the next stage will involve inviting community members and the wider public to have their say on the concept design.

Consultants Common Ground, highly regarded trail specialists in Western Australia, have been engaged to shape the vision for the Commonage Hill trail network. Their expertise ensures that the project will be both environmentally sensitive and designed to deliver an exceptional user experience.

The trail was identified in both the Beverley Trails Master Plan and broader regional planning documents and is an exciting project for the community and visitors to our region.

We are proud to partner with the Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure to develop the regional trail and encourage active recreation. Further information and community consultation opportunities will be announced soon.





Summer play

Toddlers are often natural explorers and very inquisitive. Use this to your advantage and **explore the outdoors** together to satisfy their curiosity and burn off some energy.

Did you know?

By taking time to share what you know about nature, toddlers will learn how to respect and care for their environment. Discovering small creatures together helps your toddler to be curious yet careful when interacting with animals and nature.

Add Language

The number and variety of words you use when you speak to your child directly influences the number and variety of words they can learn. While discovering and observing insects and animals, talk with your toddler about where they live, what they eat, etc. Pause and wait for your child to start a conversation by them pointing or making a comment.

Variations

Try going on a "summer safari" and see what animals and plants you find depending on where you live. This could include looking out for dolphins or finding shells at the beach, or seeing what animals come out in the warmer months such as dragonflies. Take some magnifying glasses or binoculars with you on your adventure for even more fun!

European wasp surveillance in full swing



European wasps have been observed foraging for water at a public swimming pool and scavenging on a meat and vegetable stew.

The annual hunt to detect and eradicate European wasps (*Vespula germanica*) from WA is in full swing!

The European wasp is a declared pest and must be reported. The early detection of this species is critical to preventing its permanent establishment and spread. This 2025/26 season is heating up and there are nests being located and destroyed across the Perth Metro, Albany (Mira Mar/Spencer Park), and Napier. Active monitoring continues in Bunbury and Geraldton due to prior outbreaks.

These are huge areas to monitor, so please keep your eyes peeled and report anything suspect.

What to look for

There are similar looking black and yellow wasps in WA, so look for these key characteristics:

- **Scavenging** on human food and drinks, fruit like grapes, apples and stone fruit, pet food, and roadkill/dead rats etc.
- **Nest underground** - nests are **HUGE**, grow larger than a basketball in a single season, and have a small (golf ball sized) entrance hole.
- **Completely black antenna.**
- **Legs up in flight** (rear legs don't dangle).

Common detections

There are many everyday activities that take place where people have detected and reported European wasps. These include:

- **Scooping the pool** – finding drowned wasps.
- **Cleaning fish** – seeing scavenging wasps flying around fish cleaning stations.
- **Barbecuing / picnicking / eating at outdoor café/restaurants** – seeing wasps land on food and drinks.
- **Feeding pets** – wasps often land on pet bowls or dog bones, often disrupting pets feeding.
- **Drinking from a water fountain** – seeing wasps foraging for water.


